7 K's (Ryan Gosling) Costume with Coat Matched to Arrival at Sapper's Farm Scene

K's (Ryan Gosling) complete costume with signature coat matched to the arrival at Sapper's Farm scenes, amongst others, from BLADE RUNNER 2049. K, a replicant, is the film's protagonist and title character and a "blade runner" who worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. K wore his costume with its signature dark green, shearling-lined coat throughout the film.

The coat included with this costume screen matches to the one seen when K arrived at Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) farm in the film's opening scenes. The coat was worn with the collar-up and matches based on marks and folds in the collar as well as specific stitching lines on the shoulders. Stills shot during the filming of this scene were also used for one of the film's one-sheet posters, depicting K in the fog with his spinner behind him, meaning this specific coat also features on that poster. This same specific coat matches to scenes on K's building rooftop with Joi (Ana de Armas), and was worn by a stunt performer in the Morton farmhouse fight. The jacket is also noteworthy in that the right sleeve is not cut as most seen later in the film are following the arm-stab in the Sapper fight sequence.

The costume's components are: • One shearling collared, black leather insulated coat marked "K" and "Ryan Gosling"; • One unlabeled charcoal sweater with decorative repair stitching; • One long-sleeve undershirt marked "K" at the interior bottom; • One pair of khaki color pants marked "K8"; • One pair of brown leather gloves (Size 8.5) with a knitted yarn liner and decorative repair stitching; • One pair of unmarked black leather and rubber boots.

All components are in production-weathered condition. Fabric tape has been applied to the coat's collar, sometime after the filming of the collar-up scenes, to hold it open a specific way (most of the film's coats had their collars taped or stitched down in this manner.) This indicates it was used or intended for use with the collar opened in addition to the collar-up shots it matches to. The tape is visible when the collar is displayed up but could likely be removed and the adhesive cleaned off.

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8K's (Ryan Gosling) Detective Badge

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) LAPD police badge from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. K carried a wallet that housed his LAPD ID card and detective badge (the complete wallet prop is a separate Lot in the auction.)

This lot includes one metal police badge labeled "Detective" and "LAPD" along with the city's seal and the identification "K d6-3.7."

According to production wrap documents, only one detective badge prop was created for the film.

The badge exhibits some wear to the dark shading throughout and minor pitting, but remains overall in good condition.





Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) Screen-Matched Jumpsuit with Boots

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) screen-matched jumpsuit with boots from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Replicants were bioengineered humanoid servants that answered to the directions and orders of their human masters in taking on unsavory or dangerous tasks so humans didn't have to. Morton wore his fabric jumpsuit and lace-up boots in the early opening scenes of the film and during his confrontation with K (Ryan Gosling).

The jumpsuit included in this costume screen matches to the one seen when Sapper works on his farm at the start of the film and when he engages in a fight with Officer K in his apartment due to its distinctive discoloration spots above left breast and at the right thigh.

The costume's components are: • Dark brown fabric jumpsuit marked "Sapper Hero 1/3"; • Light gray, short-sleeve T-shirt marked "2/3 Hero"; • One pair of gray socks; • One pair of black leather lace-up ankle boots marked "#13" and "13"; • Three production tags.

The jumpsuit exhibits a small tear at the right thigh and worn and frayed fabric throughout, and the boots exhibit scuffing and surface wear, but the lot remains overall in good condition.

Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) Glasses

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) glasses from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K (Ryan Gosling) worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Morton put his glasses on when K visited his apartment to retire him in the early scenes of the film.

The lot consists of one pair of gold-color metal glasses and a black glasses case with a snap hinge closure that reads "HERO." The case was used by production to store the glasses.

The glasses exhibit some bending of the temples and the case exhibits minor surface nicks, but the lot remains overall in good condition.

Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) Screen-Matched Distressed Satchel

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) screen-matched distressed satchel from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Replicants were bioengineered humanoid servants that answered to the directions and orders of their human masters in taking on unsavory or dangerous tasks so humans didn't have to. Morton used his satchel to store personal items and tools, and it screen-matches to scenes at the start of the film, including the scene where Morton put his glasses away and took out a knife. Specifically, matching characteristics are present on the wear around the rivets, wear at the zipper pull, and the distressing points at the nylon straps and outer edges of the satchel.

This distressed gray canvas, nylon, and metal satchel features a woven canvas strap, a hanging loop, and leather and metal patches featuring English and foreign language describing its contents.

The satchel exhibits intentional distressing, but remains overall in fair condition.

Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) Metal Knife

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) metal knife from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K (Ryan Gosling) worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Morton stabbed Officer K in the arm with the knife when K attempted to retire him.

This lot includes one metal knife that features a blade embedded into a futuristic metal handle with geometric carved out shapes throughout. The knife was custom designed and made for the film.

The lot exhibits nicks and scratches but remains overall in very good condition.

Blade(s) dulled after production in order to be sold as a collectible.



K's (Ryan Gosling) Screen-Matched Light-up Retractable Eye Scanner

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) LAPD light-up retractable eye scanner from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. K used his scanner to identify the replicant Sapper Morton (Dave Bautista), and this lot screen matches to shots where the VFX tracking markers on the light up screen were visible in the film (tracking markers were installed in case the screen needed to be replaced by VFX in the final film; but it was not replaced).

This lot includes one light-up eye scanner with a spring-loaded pop-open mechanism. The scanner's upper component opens when a button is depressed, and another button activates a flashing light-up

According to production wrap documents, this is one of three functional electronic eye scanner props created for the film.

The scanner exhibits a slight sticking of the button that opens the scanner, but the lot remains overall in good condition.

K's (Ryan Gosling) Screen-Matched LAPD Notepad with Transparencies and Pen

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) LAPD notepad, transparencies, and pen from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. The frame screen-matches to the scene in the Spinner after the opening scene at Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) farmhouse. The transparency sheet does not match the one seen in the final film but is handwritten, most likely by actor Gosling during alternate

The LAPD notepad consists of a black mixed materials rectangular frame with a picture window that shows an inserted black-andwhite replicant intake form; a black metal and plastic pen; and an intake form transparency featuring green markings.

According to production wrap documents, only one LAPD notepad, one pen, and multiple transparencies were created for the film.

The notepad exhibits nicking and light scratches while the seethrough bag exhibits creasing and the white logo and writing on the black pen casing is fading in places, but the lot remains overall in good condition.

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Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) Bloodied Eyeball in Evidence Bag

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) bloodied eyeball in an evidence bag from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K (Ryan Gosling) worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Officer K extracted Morton's eyeball during a fight to the death when Morton resisted K's efforts to retire him and the eyeball was then seen in an evidence bag in K's spinner.

This lot features one bloodied eyeball inside an LAPD transparent plastic evidence bag. According to production wrap documents, only one bloodied eyeball prop was created for the film.

The eyeball exhibits congealed stage blood and the evidence bag exhibits creasing, but the lot remains overall in good condition.

Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) VFX Knife

Replicant and combat medic Sapper Morton's (Dave Bautista) VFX knife from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K (Ryan Gosling) worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Morton used a knife to fight off Officer K, and stabbed him in the arm when K arrived at Morton's farm to retire him.

This lot includes one knife cast in dense urethane that features a detailed handle with geometric carved out shapes throughout. A small piece of reddish cloth tape has been applied to the space where the blade should be to allow for VFX tracking and allows CG artists to animate the blade. The subject is mock-stabbed with a bladeless version for safety then the blade is added in digitally. The knife was custom designed and made for the film.

The lot exhibits a missing blade, nicks, and scratches, but remains overall in good condition.

21 Screen-Matched Post-Traumatic Baseline Test Recording Device

A screen-matched post-traumatic baseline test recording device from BLADE RUNNER 2049. The test was administered to Nexus-9 replicant blade runners to test emotional deviance after potentially traumatic events. K (Ryan Gosling) was subjected to the test twice: once after he fought and killed Sapper Morton (Dave Bautista) and again after his mission to find and kill Rick Deckard (Harrison Ford). He was required to recite a very specific speech, leading to memorable scenes within the film. The piece screen matches through the intentional wear and markings around the edge of the device.

The test device sits on a wood backboard and features several lenses and a long scanner that can slide horizontally. There are wires protruding from its back. The device was custom designed and built specifically for the film and was intended to resemble a camera

According to production wrap documents, only one baseline test recording device prop was created for the film.

It exhibits some wear, most notably a chip on a corner of the background and some additional minor markings, but remains overall in good condition.

This lot is currently located in Propstore's London facility and will ship directly to the Buyer from the London facility. Buyer will be responsible for all shipping and import charges from the UK. Please inquire for additional information.

24K's (Ryan Gosling) Screen-Matched

Blaster Shoulder Holster

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) LAPD blaster shoulder holster from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Police officials employed sturdy blaster holsters to store blasters when they were not in use. This lot screen-matches the scene where K was looking at the denabase machine via a unique pair of off-white dots on the strap fabric, unique stitching on the upper shoulder's stitch seam, and wear at the center of the button.

This lot includes one black, mixed material blaster shoulder holster with suspender clips and a production tag labeled "Hero Holster." The holster was tagged by production as "hero holster"; it is missing the lock-in spring strap and has been modified with gaffer's tape to hold a prop blaster on set. It remains in overall good condition.

23 K's (Ryan Gosling) Charcoal Sweater

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) charcoal sweater from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Officer K worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) as a "blade runner," an officer who decommissioned rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retired them. K wore his charcoal color sweater in the opening scenes during his fight with Sapper Morton (Dave Bautista) through the time that he returned to his apartment after the fight.

Included is one charcoal color knit sweater. It exhibits a production-added rip on the right arm and a mended tear on the lower left torso but remains overall in good condition.

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25 K's (Ryan Gosling) Micro Medical Kit

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) micro medical kit from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Officer K worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) as a "blade runner," an officer who decommissioned rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retired them. K kept a medical kit in case of emergencies at home and in the field. The kit was visible after the opening fight scene where Sapper Morton (Dave Bautista) stabbed K in the arm; K returned to his apartment and found the kit in the bathroom where he used a first-aid ampoule's contents to fix his wound. The kit was seen at the bottom of the shot.

This lot includes one white metal medical kit and four sets of five single-use first aid applications in plastic ampoules. The cover features black text in English that reads "Micro Med Individual Medical Kit" and "Wallace Corporation" as well as numerical information in English and other foreign languages. The lid features an internal rubber seal and the container is fitted with foil padding to protect the single-use applications.

According to production wrap documents, only one micro medical kit prop of this style was created for the film.

The container exhibits scuff marks to the lid edges where the clamps close up and over, but the lot remains overall in very good condition.

Ceiling-mounted SFX Joi (Ana de Armas) Projection Unit from K's (Ryan Gosling) Apartment

A ceiling-mounted special effects Joi (Ana de Armas) projection unit from K's (Ryan Gosling) apartment from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Joi was an artificial intelligence (AI) hologram that people-including Officer K-could purchase as a live-in romantic partner. The mechanical projection unit projected Joi's image throughout K's apartment but only within its physical walls. K later obtained an emanator which allowed Joi to exist outside the confines of the apartment projection unit.

This lot includes one ceiling mounted device with a rotating mechanical projection arm from Officer K's apartment. His Al hologram partner, Joi, appeared to be a solid figure, but was actually light projected from the unit; a non-solid figure that people could pass through without resistance. This complex piece was custom-built by the special effects department and features a steel beam base with plastic and resin cosmetic covering plates. Inside, it houses various motors, servos, and drive belts to enable the arm to move as seen in the film. Various cabling remains present, but no control device or power sources are included, so the electronics remain untested.

The projector head of the unit visible in the final film was modified through VFX; it was modified to look like a square plate with a round circular lens in the center. This is the on-set prop and was filmed as-is before being modified by the VFX team and its projector head is a pair of retractable doors that open to reveal a square LED light panel. Production and behind-the-scenes photos show this unit, with the square projector head with retractable doors, in use on set.

According to production wrap documents, only one ceiling-mounted projection unit prop from K's apartment was created for the film.

The lot exhibits nicking and scuffs to the finish but remains overall in good condition, with untested electronics.

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) apartment wall video phone from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Officer K worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) as a "blade runner," an officer who decommissioned rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retired them. A videophone was on the wall of K's apartment and visible in several scenes, including when Mariette (Mackenzie Davis) joined Joi (Ana de Armas) and K for the evening in his apartment, and when Joi spoke to K in the kitchen.


This lot includes one mixed material wall videophone with a touchpad with silicon buttons and a lightbar at its bottom and a small camera lens as well as a concave rectangular space where the video screen component (not included) would have rested.

According to production wrap documents, only one apartment wall videophone prop was created for the film

The lot exhibits scratches to its finish, paint chipping, and gouges from installation/removal, but remains overall in fair condition.

K's (Ryan Gosling) Light-up Extendable Emanator with Black "JOI" Case, Orange Outer Box and Bubble Shipping Packaging

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) LAPD light-up extendable emanator with black "JOI" case, orange outer box and bubble shipping packaging from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. Emanators were used to "free" Joi (Ana de Armas) from the bounds of Officer K's apartment so she could travel outside its borders and interact with humans. K carried his emanator with him throughout the film and it appeared in multiple scenes. The orange box, black case, and shipping bag were seen when he first gifted the emanator to Joi.

This lot includes one emanator, a "hero" version, features an extendable and collapsible black casing that with an illuminating circular ring light. Also included one black emanator case marked JOI, one semi-translucent orange box, and an opened transparent columnar bubble wrap package.

The lot exhibits slight creasing to the bubble wrap packaging, but remains overall in very good condition. Contains electronic elements; please see notice in the Buyer's Guide.







Joi's (Ana de Armas) Complete Housewife Costume

Joi's (Ana de Armas) complete housewife costume from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Joi was an artificial intelligence (AI) hologram that people-including Officer K (Ryan Gosling)-could purchase as a live-in romantic partner. Joi wore her costume when she presented a steak dinner to K in their apartment.

The costume's components are: • One yellow blouse with perforated flower patterns; • One gathered tulle petticoat; • One graphic print skirt with a gathered waistband; • One light orange apron with a gathered waistband; • One pair of multicolor wedge sandals; • One faux pearl necklace

According to production wrap documents, only one housewife costume was created for the film.

The lot remains overall in very good condition.

Joi's (Ana de Armas) Loungewear Costume

Joi's (Ana de Armas) loungewear costume from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Joi was an artificial intelligence (AI) hologram that people-including Officer K (Ryan Gosling)could purchase as a live-in romantic partner. Joi wore her complete loungewear costume inside K's apartment.

The costume's components are one black, long-sleeve, "cold-shoulder" cutout stretch blouse, one pair of black flare-leg pants, and one pair of black leather peekaboo wedge slingback shoes.

According to production wrap documents, only one loungewear costume was created for the film.

The lot remains overall in very good condition.

Joi's (Ana de Armas) Silver-color Sequin Dress Costume

Joi's (Ana de Armas) complete silver-color sequin dress costume from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Joi was an artificial intelligence (AI) hologram that people-including Officer K (Ryan Gosling)-could purchase as a live-in romantic partner. Joi wore her complete silver-color sequin dress costume when she invited K to dance in their living room and the costume was seen briefly while Joi's wardrobe was changing in

The costume's components are one silver-color sequin A-line sleeveless dress, one pair of wraparound sandals with a chrome-color finish, and one light blonde, chin-length wig with bangs.

According to production wrap documents, only one silver-color sequin dress costume was created for the film.

The lot remains overall in very good condition.

Joi's (Ana de Armas) Screen-Matched Blue and White Dress

Joi's (Ana de Armas) screen-matched blue and white dress from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Joi was an artificial intelligence (AI) hologram that people-including Officer K (Ryan Gosling)-could purchase as a live-in romantic partner. All of the dresses for the film were hand-printed and hand-made, so the pattern placement-and especially the collar lines-vary from dress to dress. The collar pattern on this dress screen-matches the one worn onscreen in the apartment as well as in the rainy rooftop sequence.

The costume features a blue and white sleeveless A-line dress with a jewel

The lot remains overall in very good condition.



40 K's (Ryan Gosling) Drinking Glass

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) drinking glass from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners-including Officer K-worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. K smoked and drank as stress relievers and poured himself a drink in a glass after returning home from the Sapper fight as well as the scene where he met with Lt. Joshi (Robin Wright) in his apartment and she pressed him to recall childhood memories.

This lot includes one clear drinking glass cut with multiple faceted diamondshaped cuts on a hexagonal base.

According to production wrap documents, this is one of six drinking glass props that were created for the film.

It remains overall in very good condition.

41K's (Ryan Gosling) Set of Decorative Apartment Tiles

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) set of decorative apartment tiles from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Blade runners, including Officer K, worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to decommission rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retire them. K's apartment was sparse but stylish in a brutalistic manner, and these tiles were visible in its kitchen

This lot features 12 decorative tiles in various shades of gray with identical geometric designs carved into them. The tiles are made from a cast material and were likely made specifically for the film. They are a nod to the geometric "Ennis tiles" seen in the original Blade Runner film.

The tiles exhibit chips, nicking, and scratches but remain overall in good condition.

This blaster was custom designed and built for the films. The lot contains one stunt blaster with two barrels composed of dense urethane in matte black and a black and grey checkerboard pattern on the ergonomic grip, without functioning lights.

According to production wrap documents, this is one of three prop stunt K blasters that were created for the film.

The blaster exhibits minor wear to the edges of the matte black finish, but remains overall in very good condition.

Rick Deckard's (Harrison Ford) photo and poster-matched stunt light-up LAPD 2019 PKD Detective Special Blaster 03 from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Deckard was the human father of a half human/half replicant child, Ana Stelline (Carla Juri), a scientist who designed memories for replicants with the help of Officer K (Ryan Gosling), otherwise known as the Nexus-9 Replicant, KD6-3.7. Deckard used his blasters to defend himself when he first met K before K took the blaster. This stunt prop matches to a production photo of the blaster in K's jacket pocket while he sits in a chair at Deckard's apartment. It also matches the image of Deckard on the primary one-sheet poster that also features K, Joi, and Wallace, based on distinct wear to the painted finish.

This lot includes one light-up blaster in black and dark silver-color mixed materials-primarily rubber- with a textured amber color rubber grip. It features working lights-the light-up cartridge element is hard plastic.

According to production wrap documents, this is one of three stunt Deckard blasters that were created for the film. It is the only one of the three with functional LED lights.

The blaster exhibits paint wear throughout and surface abrasions but remains overall in good condition. Contains electronic elements; please see notice in the Buyer's Guide.



200K's (Ryan Gosling) Screen-Matched Seawater-Distressed Costume

Officer K's (Ryan Gosling) screen-matched seawater-distressed costume from BLADE RUNNER 2049. Officer K worked for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) as a "blade runner," an officer who decommissioned rogue replicants-bioengineered humanoid servants that broke free of their human masters-and retired them. The costume screen-matches to the final water and snow scenes and the sweater screen-matches shots of K in Lt. Joshi's (Robin Wright) apartment after his failed baseline test. The sweater was later modified to be a bloody version and used in the final scene outside of Dr. Ana Stelline's (Carla Juri) lab where it was stained with seawater from the sea fight.

The costume's components are: • One shearling collared, black leather insulated bloodied coat marked "Stunt" and a yellow tag labeled "Triboro #1 K Sc. 161 only" (note: the coat is labeled Stunt and may have been used for stunt sequences as well, but screen matches to Gosling in the final scenes in the film.); • One unmarked bloody sweater with snowflake remnants and a hole in front; • One long-sleeve undershirt marked "K" at the interior bottom; • One bloodied pair of khaki color pants marked "6" and "K 6"; • One fabric bandage for the left hand with a red tag labeled "K" and "SC 161"; • One pair of unmarked brown leather gloves with decorative repair stitching; • One pair of black mixed material boots marked "Stunt"; • One production tag labeled "Triboro #1 K 4.U D.8."

The lot exhibits overall tears, stage bloodstains, holes, snowflake residue, and white staining and remains overall in production-distressed condition.
