Mint

Poor	A poster that is worn, torn, and/ or badly damaged. May have staining or spotting and be heavily soiled with large areas of paper loss. Paper is cracked or brittle through age or moisture loss. We would recommend restoration and conservation linen backing.
Fair	A poster that has faded colors and/or brittle paper, showing significant signs of use. May have large tears and significant paper loss. May have tape, writing, stains in image area, border or on reverse. It may have had major restoration or need significant restoration.
Good	A poster that may have tears, paper loss, and/or a significant degree of general wear. It may have some slight color fading, stains, tape or tape stains, and be in need of restoration. It may also have significant restoration work.
Very Good	A poster that may be slightly brittle due to age, and/or it may have some paper loss and/or staining from tape, water, or similar. The poster may have writing in an unobtrusive place or on the reverse which isn't evident from the front. The poster may have some varying degrees of restoration.
Fine	A poster with good colors and a very presentable appearance. It may have small tears, slight paper loss (border and cross folds), pinholes and minor stains. It may have some fold separation. It may have restoration.
Very Fine	A poster with bright color and a clean overall appearance. It may have light signs of use such as minor fold separation and fold wear. It may have pinholes or very small tears. The poster may have had some light restoration and been backed to linen or acid-free backing paper.
Near Mint	A very lightly used poster with strong, unfaded color tones. If folded, the posters may show the most minimal wear at the folds but no splits, holes, tears, or paper loss







Poster Size Guide

Italian Two Fogli and Four Fogli	The same principle as the US and UK large format posters. The Two Fogli measures $39 \times 54 \text{ 1/2}$ inches ($99 \times 139 \text{ cm}$) and the Four Fogli measures $54 \text{ 1/2} \times 78 \text{ inches}$ ($139 \times 198 \text{ cm}$). The Four Fogli is usually comprised of two separate pieces.
French Lobby Card	Each card measures approximately 8 1/2 x 11 inche (21 x 27cm) and are usually issued as sets of 8 in a liveried envelope, but can also be issued as a set of 6, 10, or 12 with some films having up to three different sets issued which are then designated with 'A', 'B', and 'C.

French 'Moyen' **Affiche**

A scarce French format that places itself (size wise) between the more commonly used large format 'Grande' and much smaller 'Petite'. Sometimes can be referred to as a 'Medium' Affiche. Measures approximately 23" x 32" (60 x 80 cm).

French One Panel (Grande Affiche)

Large poster measuring 47 x 63 inches (119 x 160 cm) in portrait.

French Double **Grande Affiche**

Also known as a 2-Panel poster (French 2P) and measuring approximately 63 x 94 inches (160 x 240 cm). Usually printed in two sections that overlap to form a large format poster. Commonly made to display horizontally, but on some rare occasions can also be seen in a vertical design.

French Four Panel

Often referred to as a 'billboard' poster with apparently no official title. Printed in four sections designed to overlap that when assembled measures 91 x 123 inches (240 x 320 cm).

German A1

This is the standard German poster size and most commonly used by cinemas measuring 23 x 33 inches (58 x 84 cm).

German A0

Much less common than an A1. They measure approximately 33 x 46 inches (84 x 117 cm) and often has completely different artwork than the regular A1 poster.

German Two Panel

The scarcest format for any German poster that measures (when complete) 46 x 66 inches (117 x 168 cm) and distributed to cinemas in two pieces designed to be joined together. Often has completely different artwork than the A1 poster.

Spanish One Sheet

Printed slightly smaller than a U.S. one sheet and measuring (approximately) 27 x 39 inches (68.5 x 99 cm). The equivalent U.S. one sheet is often used but with title and credits in the Spanish language.

Belgian Affiche

The most commonly used Belgian cinema poster and as a general rule measures 14 x 22 inches (35.5 x 56 cm) and is widely used in either a vertical or horizontal design with a blank area at the top border. This allowed for hand-written screening times/dates or for a pre-printed snipe to be

Polish One Sheet

Most commonly found measuring 26 x 38 inches (66 x 96.5 cm) and notable for their (often) wild, surrealistic art with little or no connection to the film they are promoting.

Swedish One Sheet

Printed slightly smaller than a U.S. one sheet and measuring (approximately) 27 x 39 inches (68.5 x 99 cm) with different artwork (mostly) to that found in other countries.

Australian Daybill

Similar formatting to the US Insert. Before the 1960s these posters measured 13 x 36 inches (33 x 92 cm). Since the 60s they have been shortened by six inches and now measure 13 x 30 inches (33 x 76 cm).

Australian One Sheet

Measuring 27 x 40 inches (68.5 x 101.5 cm) Australian one sheets are much rarer than the more popularly used Australian daybills.

Mexican Lobby Card

Issued in sets of eight with each card measuring 12 1/2 x 16 (31.5 x 40 cm). Notable for their colorful border artwork combined with a black and white photographic image from the movie.

Argentinian One Sheet

The most common type of movie poster used in Argentina. Portrait format that normally measures approximately 29" x 43" (73.5 x 109 cm) making them slightly larger than a regular U.S. one sheet. The title of the movie and credits are typically printed in the Spanish language.

Pre-War Belgian Affiche

This was the standard poster size before WWII. A smaller size was implemented during and after the war due to paper shortage within the country.

Pre-War German **One Sheet**


This was the standard size used to promote posters before WWII. It was discontinued after the war when Germany was split between East and West, and smaller standard-size posters were implemented.












There is light and sporadic airbrush to the border and a small amount within the yellow title field. The poster displays magnificently.



There are few images in the realm of campy, 1950s sci-fi that are more recognizable than this Reynold Brown illustration of an enraged Allison Hayes, a giantess on the warpath searching for her philandering husband. Created with a plot made of pure '50s pseudo-science and a shoestring budget, this cult classic has grown into mainstream pop culture, making its posters a prime piece in any sci-fi collection.

Before restoration, this poster included edge wear, chipping, tears, additional creasing, and sporadic staple marks. There have been some touchups including the area around the center point crossfolding in the woman's arms and legs and sporadically in the yellow field. Both the lower credit area and borders have also all been airbrushed. Now on linen, the poster displays gorgeously.

Allison Hayes stars as the tragic Nancy Archer, who only wants a happy home with her husband, yet he only has eyes for Yvette Vickers. Hayes' troubles begin when she encounters aliens who steal her priceless diamond and accidentally scratch her, which turns her into a giant. This fun sci-fi flick has remained a popular cult classic.






A very presentable poster that has had much of the pink and yellow airbrushed, but overall displays quite well.

This scarce 40" x 60" rolled poster for Ridley Scott's sci-fi classic is not only unique because of the format size but this poster has also been autographed by poster artist John Alvin personally just above the ALVIN sign on the side of the building on the poster right.



Rarely does anything appear from this film, especially of German descent but this is an amazing artifact by artist Herbert Schwandt. The poster resembles in many ways one of the original German posters that has survived, the image of Emil Jannings sitting in the box to the left and Marlene Dietrich seen dancing below. Jannings was very famous in 1930 and won the prize as Best Actor at the 1st Academy Awards ceremony in 1929, which makes him the first actor in history to win this title. The small type used with Dietrich's name in comparison to Emil Jannings indicates the time in which it was produced, as this was the film that catapulted Dietrich to International fame.

This is a beautiful painting in gouache produced for a study for advertising for the famous Josef von Sternberg film, The Blue Angel. Obviously of the period, it shows wear to the borders and small chips to the lower image.

One of the inarguable classics of German cinema, this film, based on the novel Professor Unrat by Heinrich Mann and directed by Josef von Sternberg for UFA, stars the incandescent Marlene Deitrich as Lola-Lola, a vampish cabaret singer who becomes the obsession of Professor Immanuel Rath (Emil Jannings), an obsession that eventually leads to madness, humiliation, and eventually death. One of the first talking pictures to come out of Germany, The Blue Angel was simultaneously filmed in German and English in recognition of the new technology. A massive hit upon release, the movie instantly shot Dietrich to the heights of international stardom, launching a career that would last for decades.







The French poster offered here, with splendid artwork by Rene Lefebvre, a prolific European poster artist known for his bold designs and vibrant color choices, features a scene from the climax of the film in which the monster first meets his mate.

In 1976, celebrity photographer Steve Schapiro had high-quality, full-size (27"x 41") prints made of the one-sheets for the Marx Brothers' "The Cocoanuts" and "Duck Soup" on heavy paper. His plan was to have Groucho Marx hand-sign each in pencil with his full name, at which point Schapiro would add the edition number. However, due in part to old age, Marx altered the "G" in "Groucho" while signing, after previously maintaining a consistent signature style for years. "The poster artwork that had been approved before, shows a green creature in the middle that carries in its arms an unconscious woman, clad only in a bathing suit. The sexual association and the threat that emanates from this image were the main reasons to disapprove this poster for teenagers of all age groups."

This beautiful poster has paper tape support on the verso to areas of the poster where pinholes were present and wear occurred.

One of the greatest monster films of all time, this was Universal's re-entry into the genre, updating the horror film for the post-atomic age of the 1950s. The result was an absolute masterpiece. Discovered during a scientific expedition to the Amazon, the Gill Man proved popular enough to star in several sequels and remains a classic monster icon to this day.

The struggle between a human man and his unnatural creation is front and center of this iconic imaged lobby card featuring Dr. Frankenstein and his monster.

Prior to restoration, this poster had issues including fold wear with separation and some scattered chipping. The poster has had sporadic airbrushing in areas, minor touchups including to the title, and now on linen displays wonderfully.

For Marx Brothers aficionados, the five films that they released through Paramount - beginning with The Cocoanuts (1929) and ending with Duck Soup (1933) - represent their very best work. Originally developed as Wolfman vs. Dracula, this was the second of Universal's monster mash-up films, following House of Frankenstein (1944). In many ways, this film would mark the end of the Universal Monsters franchise; the next film in the cycle, Abbot & Costello Meet Frankenstein (1948), was more a comedy in the vein of the duo's other films than a true monster movie. Truly the end of an era, this was also the last time Jack Pierce, the genius who had created the looks of the monsters, would apply the make-up that made him famous, as Universal let him go in 1947. Few franchises are as collectible as the Universal Monsters, especially with so many great characters represented.





THE INVISIBLE MAN (Universal, 1934)

Offered here is a striking Czech poster from the film's first release in that country. The highly evocative image is suggestive of the avant-garde and modernist movements in art that were sweeping Europe in the 1930s, resulting in a series of bizarre and outre images on movie posters, a practice that continues to this day. These unique and intriguing designs make Czech posters extremely attractive to collectors, and to find one from such an important film in such a popular and collectible genre is quite rare indeed. This 1934 Czechoslovakian-Hungarian Pre-War 1 Sheet is a vintage 1st release poster for Bio Radio. Ungvar is a city and municipality on the river Uzh in western Ukraine at the border of Slovakia and near the border of Hungary. During the past century, the city was part of Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Hungary again, and Ukraine. Bio Radio, as listed on the poster, was the cinema of Ungvar.

This folded poster has had some light restoration to both tears and fold wear. Plus there is some discoloration and light bleed through in the upper area from a stamp and writing on the verso. A perfect poster candidate for linen backing.

By 1933 Universal Studios had scored a tremendous success with their push into the horror arena with films based on classics such as Dracula (1931) and Frankenstein (1931), both relying on horrific makeup and gore. With The Invisible Man, they turned their eye toward special effects as the fright factor in this glorious adaptation of the H. G. Wells novel. The studio brought in the director who made the "Frankenstein Monster" so exciting, James Whale. He brought to the horror film a tongue-in-cheek element which almost 85 years after the film's release makes it so very enjoyable. Claude Rains, who only appears on camera briefly in the film but whose voice is the epitome of pure evil, is brilliant in the role of a scientist whose work drives him mad. Yet it is the special effects that are the stars of this film. Though appearing somewhat primitive by today's CGI standards one can only imagine the jaw-dropping impact the effects of wizard John Fulton and his team produced in 1933.



The French Grande offered here presents a striking image of Karloff, complete with glowing hands and an expression of glowering menace against an atmospheric orange and black background, an image that is in every way superior to the American release imagery. Universal Monster paper has always been highly desirable, and the material from this title has proven exceptionally elusive. Boris Grinsson creates a spectacular image of Bris Karloff in his role as Dr. Janos Ruhk. This is the only example of this poster we are aware of selling in recent years.

Prior to restoration, this poster had only minor fold and cross-fold wear, pinholes in the borders, and some light paper splits within the image. There is a small dot on Karloff's nose that has been touched up, but otherwise, this is a very clean and desirable example of this poster.

In 1936, there were two undisputed Kings of Horror in Hollywood: Bela Lugosi, who had starred in Dracula (1931), and Boris Karloff, who played the Monster in Frankenstein (1931). It's not surprising, then, that Universal Pictures would eventually team these two cinematic titans. The Invisible Ray (1936), is about a scientist (Karloff) who finds a strange meteor made of an unknown element dubbed "Radium X," whose emanations cause him first to glow in the dark and then proceed to drive him slowly mad. The film is particularly notable for being the last of the Universal Monster films to be released under the studio's original regime, marking the end of an important era.



One of two known copies in existence for this 1934 classic, this poster is as unique as the characters it features. With classic artwork of both the infamous W.C. Fields and his pint-sized foe Baby LeRoy, this one sheet is a unique opportunity to own a rare piece of cinema history. The other copy is reportedly in the Library of Congress.

This poster had paper missing from all the borders which has been replaced except the left side. There has been paintwork to the titling and most of the backgrounds, but aside from a few minor chips the two central character images including the window in which W.C. Fields appears have not been touched up. Lower credits have been added as well as the "Adolph Zukor Presents" credit. The poster has been restored to its original state and now displays impressively.

A multi-talented radio and film personality, W.C. Fields perfected his persona as a hard-drinking, child-hating misanthrope. So, it made sense that he would find one of his greatest on-screen foils in the form of Baby LeRoy (Ronald Le Roy Overacker) and Charlie McCarthy. In all, Fields made four films with LeRoy, including this one, which is considered to be one of the comedian's finest efforts.

A film of profound importance in the annals of moviemaking, RKO Studio knew they had a huge hit on their hands when Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack turned in this legendary fantasy full of dinosaurs and adventure. Not only did they create a tragic version of the "Beauty and the Beast" narrative that has continued to captivate audiences for generations, but they did so by combining numerous technical innovations with awe-inspiring effects. Chief among these was the work of stop-motion animator Willis O'Brien, whose efforts on such projects as The Lost World brought him to the attention of Merian C. Cooper and Ernest B. Schoedsack. Federico Fellini's masterpiece, La Dolce Vita ("The Good Life", 1960) is a film about one man's search for a truly meaningful life. There are small mirrored paper lifts in the background of the upper section, a few ink date stamps in the background on the right, a stamp in the upper left corner, and some staining and smudging in the borders. There are also small chips along the edges, pinholes in the background and borders as well as a few nail holes in the borders, some light fold separation at the end of the upper left horizontal fold, and soft surface rippling.

The Italian maestro of the movies, Federico Fellini, put everything into this divisive drama with an ardor above and beyond that of his other works. 





This Golden Age-era window card was printed to advertise a live appearance by Louis "Satchmo" Armstrong at McElroy's in Portland, Oregon on Oct. 18th, 1945. Throughout the 1930s and 40s, Armstrong - then considered the King of the Trumpet - was known to play up to 300 gigs a year across the country.

This window card exhibits minor discoloration as well as corner and edge wear, most visibly in the upper center. It remains in excellent overall condition.

One of the most important and influential artists in the history of jazz, Louis "Satchmo" Armstrong (1901-1971) was known both for his innovative and original trumpet-playing as well as his distinctive baritone. A hard-to-find format with the classic one sheet artwork, this lush and large 40" x 60" poster for Alfred Hitchcock's Psycho not only forgoes the blue outline for more striking yellow and orange but also puts the natural color back into the movie's memorable cast of characters.

Now you can acquire an exquisite set of eight full-color lobby cards from this landmark production, one of the most beloved films of all time, selected by the Library of Congress for inclusion in the National Film Registry in 1989 as part of its very first crop of entries. This exquisitely rendered set features Snow White, the Seven Dwarfs, and even the Evil Queen (in her old hag disguise) on one card.

All of the cards are bright and in very clean condition. All but a couple of the cards have small pieces of white tape on the verso which appears to be supporting pinholes in the card. Only the title card as any surface airbrush work and that is sporadically around the borders. A very clean set and very scarce.

Walt Disney sank everything he had into this production, even mortgaging his home to raise the needed capital. Originally estimated to cost \$250,000 (ten times the budget of the typical Silly Symphonies short), the film had an initial budget of \$150,000 and eventually ran to nearly \$1.5 million, an unheard-of sum for any feature film at the time. One of the greatest achievements in film history, both a critical and commercial success, that would quickly become the most successful sound film of all time (although it would be replaced in that position by 1939's Gone with the Wind). It also laid the foundation for the Disney empire, as the profits from this film allowed Disney to build a new studio on 51 acres of land in Burbank, CA.

Most of the poster formats for this film share the same graphics, as it's hard to top the image of a seething, maniacal Swanson casting a scorching glare upon young lovers Holden and Nancy Olson. The style B one sheet is much less impressive as it is merely a logo without actors.

This poster has been restored to fix previous issues including fold line wear, chipping, and some tearing. There is also some light airbrushing in the upper center face image. Now on linen, this one sheet displays wonderfully.

"All right, Mr. DeMille, I'm ready for my close-up." Gloria Swanson showed true professionalism when she took on the role of aging actress Norma Desmond in this sensational and dark look at Hollywood. Billy Wilder directed this nightmarish film noir thriller and it became one of the absolutely timeless classics. Erich von Stroheim and William Holden (as Joe Gillis) co-star, but it was Swanson's show and comeback vehicle. The film was nominated for 11 Oscars and took three: Best Art Direction, Score, and Screenplay.

Subject to the auctioneer's reasonable discretion, the Bidder placing the highest bid accepted by the auctioneer will be the Buyer and the striking of his hammer marks the acceptance of the highest bid and the conclusion of a contract for sale between the Seller and the Buyer. Each Bidder understands and agrees that Propstore, as auctioneer, is not a party to any contract for sale that results from the Auction. Risk and responsibility for the Lot (including frames or glass where relevant) passes to the Buyer upon the fall of the hammer and the Buyer should arrange insurance cover for the Lot if required.

5. After the Auction

- 5.1. Payment by Buyer
 - 5.11. Propstore will notify the Buyer and send (by email unless requested otherwise) a payment invoice setting out the Purchase Price and itemizing the Hammer Price, the Buyer's Premium, plus any applicable Buyer's Expenses, applicable Credit Card Fee, or sales tax, within 7 business days of the end of the Auction. State and local sales tax, as required by law, shall be applied at the prevailing rate applicable to the recipient where Propstore is obligated to charge sales tax.  - 5.1.2. Unless you have been approved for a payment plan as set forth in Paragraph 5.1(c) of the Terms and Conditions of Sale, payment of the invoice is due within 7 business days from receipt of the invoice and must be made by the Buver.
 - 5.1.3. Payment plans may be available in increments of up to three (3) months for purchases where total Hammer Price and Buyer's Premium are greater than \$1,000. Purchases where total Hammer Price and Buyer's Premium are less than \$1,000 are not eligible for a payment plan; buyers paying via Cryptocurrency are also not eligible for a payment plan. - 5.1.5. No title to any Property shall pass to the Buyer except upon payment in full of the Purchase Price, and any and all other sums due to Propstore and/or the Seller, even in circumstances where Propstore has released the Lot to the Buyer. Among other remedies available to Propstore and the Seller for failure to render full payment of the Purchase Price, Propstore and/or the Seller shall be entitled to immediate possession of the Lot purchased by the Buyer, if delivered to the Buyer.
- 5.1.6. Propstore vouchers and other discount codes are not valid as payment for auction items.

This interest shall accrue on a daily basis from the due date until the date of actual payment of the overdue amount. The Buyer must pay Propstore interest together with any overdue amount.
- 5.2.2. If any applicable conditions herein are not complied with (to a material extent), the Buyer will be in Default and in addition to any and all other remedies available to Propstore by law, including, without limitation, the right to hold the Buyer liable for the total Purchase Price, including all fees, charges and expenses more fully set forth herein, and as set forth in paragraph 4.2(a) herein, Propstore, at its option and to the extent permitted by law, may (i) cancel the sale of that, or any other items sold to the defaulting Buyer, retaining as liquidated damages all payments made by the Buyer, (ii) resell the purchased item, or (iii) effect any combination thereof. In any case, the Buyer shall be liable for any deficiency, any and all costs, handling charges, late charges, expenses of both sales, legal fees and expenses, collection fees and incidental damages.
- 5.2.3. Propstore may, in its sole discretion, apply any proceeds of sale then due or thereafter becoming due to the Buyer from Propstore or any affiliated company, or any payment made by the Buyer to Propstore or any affiliated company, where or not intended to reduce the Buyer's obligations with respect to the unpaid item or items, to the deficiency and any other amounts due to Propstore or any affiliated companies. In addition, a defaulting Buyer will be deemed to have granted and assigned to Propstore and its affiliated companies, a continuing security interest of first priority in any property or money owing to such Buyer in our possession or in the possession of any of its affiliated companies, and Propstore may retain and apply such property or money as collateral security for the obligations due to Propstore or to any affiliated company. Payment will not be deemed to have been made in full until Propstore has collected good funds.
- 5.2.4. Propstore may further reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the Buyer or to require a deposit from the Buyer before accepting any further bids;
- 5.2.5. Propstore may take such other action as Propstore deems necessary or appropriate.
- 5.2.6. At its option, Propstore may pay the Seller the entirety of the balance due from the Buyer. If Propstore pays such amount to the Seller, the Buyer acknowledges and agrees that Propstore shall have all of the rights of the Seller against the Buyer.

5.3. Shipping and Storage

- 5.3.1. The Buyer is solely responsible for all shipping, handling, and delivery costs. Propstore ships Lots directly through FedEx or USPS for smaller items, orspecial freight carriers for larger items, or you can use your own licensed carrier, approved by Propstore. Please contact Propstore at +1 818 727 7829 for further details. Propstore does not warranty the Lots against and shall have no liability for any damage that any Lot may incur or suffer during the shipping or delivery process. Propstore offers insurance for shipments in transit at an additional charge; buyers will have an option to select this when finalizing your purchase after auction. Propstore shall not be obligated to rescind or cancel a sale nor to refund any monies paid by the Buyer to Propstore as a result of or related to the Buyer's failure or inability to obtain an export license.
- 5.3.6. Should the Buyer make own arrangements with third parties for shipping, handling, or delivery of any Lots, Propstore shall have and accepts no liability or responsibility for the acts or omissions of any such third parties. Similarly, where Propstore suggests other handlers, packers or carriers, its suggestions are made on the basis of its general experience of such parties in the past. Although Propstore shall use reasonable efforts to take care when selecting third parties for shipping and delivery, and the Buyer understands and agrees that Propstore is not responsible to any person to whom it has made a recommendation for the acts or omissions of the third party concerned.

5.4. Propstore's Liability

- 5.4.1. Except where expressly stated to the contrary above, under no circumstance will Propstore incur liability to any Bidder or Buyer in excess of the purchase price actually paid.
- 5.4.2. Propstore offers insurance for shipments in transit at an additional charge; buyers will have an option to select this when finalizing your purchase after auction. Winning bids are legally binding and must be paid regardless of final shipping expenses.
- 5.4.3. Propstore will not be liable or responsible for any failure to perform, or delay in performance of, any of its obligations under these Conditions that is caused by an event outside its control, that being any act or event beyond Propstore's reasonable control, including without limitation strikes, lockouts or other industrial action by third parties, civil commotion, riot, invasion, terrorist attack or threat of terrorist attack, war (whether declared or not) or threat or preparation for war, fire, explosion, storm, flood, earthquake, subsidence, epidemic or other natural disaster, or failure of public or private telecommunications networks. Propstore's obligations shall be suspended and time for performance extended until such time as the event outside its control is over, following which a new collection or shipping date can be agreed.

6. Terms of Guarantee

- 6.1. Propstore warrants the attribution of each Lot as stated in the title block of that Lot in the Auction catalog, subject to any revisions (which may be given in writing or online before or during the Auction at which the Lot is purchased by the Buyer); this is Propstore's Guarantee of Attribution.
- 6.2. If a Buyer demonstrates, to Propstore's reasonable satisfaction, that the Guarantee of Attribution is materially incorrect, the sale will be rescinded if the Lot is returned to Propstore in the same condition in which it was at the time of sale. In order to satisfy Propstore that the Guarantee of Attribution is materially incorrect, Propstore reserves the right to require the Buyer to obtain, at the Buyer's expense, the opinion of two experts in the field, mutually acceptable to Propstore and the Buyer.
- 6.3. In the event a sale is rescinded in accordance with condition 10.2, Propstore shall repay to the Buyer the Purchase Price. Repayment of the Purchase Price shall be the Buyer's sole remedy for an incorrect Guarantee of Attribution, to the exclusion of all other remedies to the extent permissible at law. It is specifically understood that this will be considered the Buyer's sole remedy under this clause 10.
- 6.4. The Buyer expressly agrees that Propstore shall not be liable in whole or in part, for, and the Buyer shall not be entitled to recover, any special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages including loss of profits or value of investment or opportunity cost.
- 6.5. Bidders are aware that description revisions may occur on some Lots, and should inquire before the Auction whether any description revisions have occurred on a given Lot and/or examine a lot before bidding on it. Propstore will make all reasonable efforts to make description revisions readily available during the Auction.

7. Warranties and Representations

- 72. Propstore neither warrants nor represents that the Buyer's use of any materials displayed on the site will not infringe rights of third parties not owned by or affiliated with Propstore.
- 7.3. In the catalog descriptions, Propstore takes steps to identify and provide background for Lots offered at Auction. In many cases, the Lots offered were created in conjunction with motion pictures or other programs and information is furnished in order to fully identify and describe the Lot offered at Auction, including photographs and illustrations. . If any part of these Conditions is found by any arbitrator or court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part shall be discounted and the rest of the Conditions shall continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.




