marks 85 years since Batman made his debut in 1939's Detective Comics #27 in the story "The Case of the

Chemical Syndicate." In the decades since, Batman has grown to become one of the most popular fictional characters of all time, recognized globally from his many portrayals in comics, television series, cartoons, video games, and movies. To multiple generations of fans, Batman has stood as a symbol of determination, courage, and justice.

Born out of tragedy when young Bruce Wayne's parents were killed in front of him, Batman became Wayne's righteous alter-ego: a masked hero dedicated to protecting others from the violent crime spreading through Gotham City. Unlike many of his Super Hero peers, however, Batman notably had no superpowers, relying solely on intelligence, skill, and technical savvy in his relentless pursuit of justice. While Batman typically worked alone, he has also teamed up with a number of allies over the years, including fellow Gotham City crime fighters Robin and Batgirl, as well as Super Heroes from throughout the universe, such as Superman and the members of the Justice League.

Batman made his live-action debut in the early film serials of the 1940s, and famously returned to theaters in the hit 1966 film based on the popular television series. But it was the blockbuster 1989 film that elevated the Super Hero genre to new heights and cemented the Caped Crusader - and DC Comics - as major players in cinema. From there, the film franchise continued to grow and evolve, while always remaining true to the inspiring ideals that the character was built upon.



After The Joker revealed he had contaminated various household products with Smilex, newspapers covered the fear that beset the citizens of Gotham City. This headline differs from the version seen in the final cut, which read "Cosmetics Scare in Gotham."

A Gotham Globe newspaper cover headlined "Penguin Forgives Parents" from Batman Returns. After visiting his parents' graves, Oswald Cobblepot, also known as The Penguin, announced that he forgave his parents for abandoning him. The local newspaper immediately picked up the story and sold papers covering it to the curious crowds in the streets of Gotham City.

This cover, printed on newsprint, features the Gotham Globe header logo and the headline "Penguin Forgives Parents I'm Fully At Peace With Myself And The World" along with a photograph of Oswald Cobblepot and other unrelated stories in smaller print. 13 The Riddler's Green Unitard Costume and Hat Batman Forever (1995)

The Riddler's green unitard costume and hat from *Batman Forever*. After having his invention rejected by Bruce Wayne, the disgruntled Edward Nygma donned his green unitard as The Riddler and partnered with Two-Face to implement his brainwave transmitting device throughout Gotham City.

This long-sleeved lime green velvet and nylon unitard is decorated with variously sized black question marks throughout, and features two zippers on either side of the neck and thumb holes at the hands. The green felt bowler hat has a matching ribbon hat band, a black felt question mark on the front, and a black leather sweatband inside marked "L". There are some pulled fibers in the hat.

14 The Riddler's First Riddle Envelope Batman Forever (1995)

The Riddler's first riddle envelope from *Batman Forever*. The first riddle that Edward Nygma, who would soon don the name The Riddler, left for Bruce Wayne was contained in a black envelope that Wayne found waiting for him at Wayne Enterprises.

This black paper envelope features a bright green question mark on the front and an opening along the side where the riddle would have been inserted. It exhibits some edge wear and discoloration. Dimensions: $12^{\circ} \times 9.5^{\circ} \times 0.5^{\circ}$ (30.5 cm x 24.25 cm x 1.5 cm)



A set of five magazine covers featuring Bruce Wayne from *Batman Forever*. Being a prominent figure, Bruce Wayne appeared on several magazine covers, many of which Edward Nygma kept in his workspace at Wayne Enterprises and in his apartment.

This lot consists of five color-printed magazine covers for TIMES, Persons, Architectural Diary, and two different covers for GQ (Gotham Quarterly); all of which feature photos of Bruce Wayne on the cover, except for Architectural Diary, which depicts Wayne Manor. Two-Face's coin from *Batman Forever*. Two-Face flipped his signature coin to let fate make decisions for him, which ultimately led to his downfall when Batman tossed too many coins into the air for Two-Face to keep track of his own, resulting in him falling to his death.

This silver-color metal coin is engraved "E Gothamus Unum" with the face of Lady Gotham, Gotham City's version of the Statue of Liberty, on both sides. One side is unmarred, while the other was intentionally gouged throughout by production. The coin exhibits discoloration on the gouged side. Dimensions: 2" x 2" x 0.5" (5.25 cm x 5.25 cm x 1.5 cm)

A Circus Gotham popcorn box from *Batman Forever*. Audience members at Circus Gotham ate popcorn from boxes while watching acts such as the Flying Graysons, before Two-Face attacked during the performance.

Robin's costume from *Batman Forever*. After The Riddler's attack on the Batcave, Dick Grayson suited up in his costume as Robin to join Batman in his final confrontation with The Riddler and Two-Face.

This costume consists of a two-piece black neoprene and red, green, and gold-color foam latex bodysuit, marked with the principal performer's name and the number "5," with a zippered back and suspenders supporting the pants; a latex cape with a gold-color lining; a urethane and nylon belt, marked with the initials of a stunt performer, with a buckle featuring a Robin insignia; black leather and polyurethane gloves with resin fins marked with the principal performer's initials and "3"; and a pair of black leather and polyurethane boots marked with the principal performer's name and "C4". The costume exhibits some signs of wear and age, including some minor discoloration around the codpiece. This costume is currently dressed on a mannequin for display; the mannequin will be included.


23 Batman's Rebreather Batman Forever (1995)

Batman's rebreather from *Batman Forever*. Batman and Robin used their rebreathers while swimming toward Claw Island after The Riddler and Two-Face destroyed their vehicles as they approached the island in the film's finale.

This rubber rebreather features a black bat-shaped main body with simulated vents cast into it and a white foam inner mouthpiece attached with self-adhesive strips. It exhibits some scuffing and adhesive residue. Dimensions: 3" x 7" x 4" (7.75 cm x 18 cm x 10.25 cm)

Edward Nygma's handwritten Fred Stickley suicide note from Batman Forever. After dropping Fred Stickley to his death from high up on the Wayne Enterprises building, Edward Nygma carefully forged a suicide note from Stickley and doctored a surveillance tape to mislead investigators.

This lot consists of one sheet of cream-color cotton paper featuring a custom black ink and silver-color foil letterhead reading "Wayne Enterprises" with a "W" logo and handwriting in black ink reading "To: Whom It May Concern From: Fred Stickley Re: My Suicide Goodbye Cruel World!
