

## Annie Ross & Her Trio, Wally Fawkes Band And Others

A psychedelic poster promoting a jazz concert at the Roundhouse in London held on October 15, 1967. The event was a benefit concert for the Rent Surcharge, Paddy O'Connor legal costs fund and was organised by the North St Pancras Labour Party. This design is part of a series known as the Osiris Visions posters. Labelled "OA121", this artwork was created by OM Tentacle, a design duo consisting of Michael McInnerney and Dudley Edwards. The lot exhibits creasing and a small tear along the top edge. Dimensions: 76.5 cm x 51 cm (30" x 20")

Paul McCartney's Photo-Authenticated Morecambe & Wise Show Striped Blazer м Beatles, The

A blazer worn by Paul McCartney during a performance by the Beatles on The Morecambe & Wise Show, 18 April 1964, and the Night of 100 Stars charitable concert at the London Palladium on 23 July 1964. The Morecambe & Wise episode had been filmed at ATV's Elstree Studios four months earlier, on Monday 2 December 1963. The blazer is verified to be authentic via distinctive photo-matches.

The Fab Four wore striped blazers and boater hats to perform a light-hearted version of the song "Moonlight Bay" with comedians Eric Morecambe and Ernie Wise. The Morecambe & Wise appearance features on Disc 1 of The Beatles Anthology. The Night of 100 Stars performance was in aid of the Actor's Charitable Trust and featured many other celebrities. The Beatles performed a flying ballet act and a short musical set. Initially, this jacket was saved from destruction during a clearance from the costume company Bermans & Nathans. It was also displayed at the Beatles Story museum in Liverpool in 2015.

Each of the five striped jackets, worn by the Beatles and comedian Ernie Wise for the musical number, were custom-made for the television taping. This particular blazer is made from a custom-printed fabric and was tailored to fit McCartney. The fabric features a distinctive cream-and-blue striped design, which meant the pattern was uniquely positioned in different places on each individual jacket.

This garment can be proof-matched to photos of McCartney standing with George Harrison, John Lennon, Eric Morecambe and Ernie Wise due to the distinctive placement of the stripes on the lapels and on two of the pockets. The striping placement on the pockets, near the top button, on one shoulder and near one side of the hem can also be matched to McCartney's jacket in an image of The Beatles during a rehearsal for The Night of 100 Stars.

The blazer is made of beige cotton with three pockets, and three metal buttons adorn the front. "Torbay Hire" is handwritten in black ink on the inside of the neckline, suggesting the garment spent time in the inventory of a costume hire company in the South West of England. The jacket comes with a replica boater hat, added to complete the costume. There are minor signs of age, including some marks and a small hole near the top button.

# **451** John Lennon Custom-tailored Madame Tussauds Suit $\,^{\,\text{M}}$ Beatles, The

A suit made specifically for the John Lennon wax figure, which was part of the first Beatles display at Madame Tussauds in London. The Fab Four figures were unveiled at the museum on 28 March 1964, wearing their iconic grey collarless suits. A month later, on 29 April, the band visited the museum and were photographed with the dummies. It is believed The Beatles gave their blessing for four replica suits (including this one) to be re-created by their tailor, Doug Millings, for their Madame Tussauds figures. This particular suit was rediscovered several years ago in one of Madame Tussauds' warehouses.

The original suits were created by Millings in April 1963, as Beatlemania was taking off, and they soon became the band's most iconic look. The suits were most notably worn in a famous photoshoot with Dezo Hoffman, an image from which was used on the back cover of the band's second studio album With the Beatles (titled Meet the Beatles! in the US). They last wore this attire in December 1963.

The suit comprises a matching collarless grey woollen jacket and trousers. The jacket is decorated with black piping, two faux welt pockets and three pearlescent buttons, which run down the front. Sewn to the jacket's purple-and-gold plaid satin lining is a "D.A. Millings & Son" label with "John" handwritten by Doug Millings in black ink. A concealed zip is located on the inner seam of both trouser legs, allowing them to be easily dressed onto an inflexible mannequin. The front and back of the jacket exhibit some minor holes from moth damage over the years, but the suit remains in very good condition considering its age.










A rare, autographed "Life With The Beatles" booklet. Printed by PYX Productions, the booklet features a biography for each band member and several black-and-white photographs. The autographs were originally obtained when the Beatles' performed at the Odeon Cinema, Llandudno, 12-17 August 1963.

The front cover is autographed in blue ballpoint ink by Paul McCartney, John Lennon, George Harrison and Ringo Starr, and the name "Chris" is also handwritten on the cover. In addition, McCartney has signed an inside page, and Starr has autographed the

The lot also includes two black-and-white photographs, one showing the original owner holding the booklet; a letter from the manager of the Odeon Cinema, Llandudno, dated 22 July 1963; a handwritten set list; the addresses of the Beatles; and two additional autographs of Tony Mansfield and Mike Maxfield, from The Dakotas. There are minor marks and edge wear present on the booklet, with signs of discolouration to the paperwork. Dimensions: 24.5 cm x 18.5 cm (9 3/4" x 7 1/4")

## Cleveland Stadium Concert Poster M Beatles, The

An original concert poster promoting one of the Beatles' performances during their final US tour. This poster is for the concert at the Cleaveland Stadium, Ohio, which took place on Sunday, August 14, 1966. Advertised as a "historic show", the concert also featured several opening acts, including the Cyrcle, the Ronettes, and the Remains. The tour, in general, came under scrutiny after John Lennon' made comments stating that the Beatles had become "more popular than Jesus" several months prior.

This particular performance in Ohio was the first to suffer crowd control disturbances. Over 2,000 fans broke through security barriers causing the event to be temporarily stopped for around half an hour. The large fanatic crowd caused the noise levels to be so loud, making it impossible for the band to hear the music they were playing. The Fab Four decided to retire from live performances at the end of 1966 and focused entirely on recording in studios. Printed onto cardboard, the poster features a black-and-white image of all four members with black lettering detailing the event. The lot displays some crease lines, small marks and minor signs of discolouration. Dimensions: 51 cm x 37 cm (20" x 14 ½")

Promotional and Studio-used 1960s Ludwig Black Oyster Drum Kit Featuring Replica Beatles Logo M

#### Beatles, The

A rare 1960s Ludwig Black Oyster drum kit similar to the one made famous by Ringo Starr during his time with The Beatles. This kit has been used numerous times at Abbey Road Studios for several projects and recording sessions. It was notably used in June 2011 for recording sessions by Mark Ronson, and for a Bryan Adams photo shoot in 2007. The kit was also displayed at the Savoy hotel for the press release event of The Beatles Anthology in 1995, and used for the British TV show Stars in Their Eyes and the 2004 TV film The Life and Death of Peter Sellers. Other artists who used this kit during recording sessions include Yusuf / Cat Stevens in February 2005, The Horrors at The Garden in March 2011, The Magic Numbers in June 2011 and Placebo in 2013.

The kit comprises a mounted tom; a floor tom; a snare drum; a bass drum; a bass pedal; a ride cymbal and stand; a high-hat cymbal and stand; and an additional cymbal stand. A version of the iconic black "The Beatles" dropped-T logo is displayed on the bass drum, and each drum displays a black oyster pearl finish. The skins on the drums have been replaced several times over many years.

All four drums come in their original hard leather cases featuring hire company stickers. One cymbal is missing from the kit, and the drum skins display wear from use. The lot is accompanied by several sheets of rental paperwork detailing how the set was hired for various projects. John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr Autographed Musician Birthday Book M

#### The Beatles

A musician's birthday book containing a set of rare autographs and inscriptions by all four members of The Beatles.

This book initially belonged to a music teacher and organist named Albert Angell, known to many as "Uncle Albert". When Angell retired in the late 1960s, he relocated to the Welsh town of Llandudno and moved into a property owned by the parents of artist Jonathan Hague. Hague was born in Llandudno and was a figurative painter who became close friends with John Lennon after the two met at the Liverpool School of Art.


The Beatles visited Llandudno while attending an exhibition of Hague's work at Bangor Art Gallery, which ran between April and May 1966. During the band's stay, Hauge told them about Angell. One afternoon, "Uncle Albert" opened his front door and was stunned to see all four members of The Beatles on his doorstep. The band spent the entire afternoon with him, during which time they signed this book. Coincidentally, Paul McCartney wrote the song "Uncle Albert/Admiral Halsey" in 1971, based on his own uncle.

Bound in brown leather, the book comprises 351 dated pages, all with gilded edges. Each Beatle has signed the page of his birth date in blue ink; John Lennon (9 October, with the inscription "Beatles"); Paul McCartney (18 June, with the inscription "Another Beatle); George Harrison (25 February, with the inscription "All Presents To:- Nems Enterprises"); and Ringo Starr (7 July, with the inscription "Beatle").


Accompanying the book is a leaflet for Hague's exhibition and a small newspaper clipping titled "The Beatles Make Their Debut... As Art Patrons". The book exhibits signs of age, including discolouration on many pages. However, the autographs remain intact. The lot remains fragile, with many pages coming loose over time, and should be handled with care. Dimensions (book): 21.5 cm x 17 cm x 4.5 cm (8 ½" x 6 ½" x 1 ¾"); (programme): 21 cm x 13.75 cm (8 ¼" x 5 ½")

Set of Five Richard Avedon 1967 Look Magazine Posters  $\Omega$ 

#### The Beatles

Five 1967 Look Magazine posters of The Beatles shot by legendary photographer Richard Avedon in August, 1967 at Thompson House in London. Avedon applied Day-Glo colours and hippie symbols to the prints, which were published in Look Magazine in January 1968, and sold as posters.

This complete set consists of the iconic "Flame Bright John," "Flower Power Paul," "Mystic George," and "Dove Loving Ringo" posters and a black-and-white glossy poster of the full band. Included is the original Look Magazine shipping tube with a vintage "Look Building" sticker applied. The lot exhibits tape residue, some torn corners, crinkling from being rolled, and tube crumbling from age. Dimensions (each): 79.5 cm x 57.25 cm (31.25" x 22.5")

#### 457 Les Ambassadeurs Club Casino Chips †A A Hard Day's Night (1964)

Three Les Ambassadeurs Club casino chips from Richard Lester's musical comedy A Hard Day's Night. Gamblers at the famous Les Ambassadeurs Club, where the production filmed in its Le Cercle casino, used chips when Paul's grandfather John (Wilfrid Brambell) slipped away from The Beatles to place a bet.

The set features two £1 chips and one £5 chip. All three are made of plastic and feature pearlescent-red and light-blue finishes respectively. The £5 chip features a black picture of Les Ambassadeurs Club on the reverse, and all the chips are stamped with serial numbers. As it is not possible to screen-match this plaque among the many required on set, we are unable to verify if this particular prop was one used for filming. A pair of Altec 605A monitors which originally came from Abbey Road Studios. Altec monitors were introduced to the control room in Studio 2 at Abbey Road in 1959 and remained there throughout the 1960s. Additional pairs were used as transportable monitors in other studios and around the building. Record producer George Martin used Altec monitors to mix most of The Beatles' recordings. In 1969, The Beatles moved to Twickenham Film Studios and Apple Corps headquarters to record their album Let It Be and the documentary of the same name, directed by Michael Lindsay-Hogg. Four Altec 605A monitors (including these two) were taken to both locations for the recording sessions. The monitors were numbered by music studio EMI, one "4" and "6" (the other duo were numbered "3" and "8"). They can be seen in "Part 2: Days 8-16" and "Part 3: Days 17-22" of Peter Jackson's 2021 documentary series The Beatles: Get Back, as Jackson utilised original footage from the Let It Be sessions. Both pairs were later sold by another collector to music archivist Chris Hewitt.

Both these monitors have received sympathetic restoration to the plywood carcasses and have been restored using the original type of Altec paint used in the 1950s. They comprise a silver-painted plywood exterior; a protective black fabric panel on the front; and a green plaque with the Altec branding and a control switch on the back. Inside both monitors is an EMI Records Limited branded label with the Abbey Road address printed along the top. One label reads "Altec 605A No 4", and the other features the text "Altec 605A No 6". Each monitor has intertwined red and black cables running out of the back; the electronics were tested by Hewitt and are still functioning. The exteriors exhibit minor scuffing, and one of the green plaques displays notable marks. The lot is accompanied by three printed behind-the-scenes photos.

This lot comes from the personal collection of Chris Hewitt, noted audio archaeologist and author of several books on vintage sound equipment. A letter from him is included. Dimensions (each monitor): 45 cm x 64.5 cm x 75 cm (17 3/4" x 25 1/4" x 29 1/2")

John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr Autographed Concert Ticket M Beatles, The

A concert ticket for the Beatles autographed by all four members of the band. Printed on orange-coloured card, this ticket was for the Beatles' gig at The Grosvenor Rooms in Norwich, England, on Friday, 17 May 1963. This was the only time The Beatles performed in Norwich, and the support act was Ricky Lee and the Hucklebucks.

The reverse of the ticket is autographed in blue ballpoint pen by John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr, and is stamped "W.A.H Enterprises". The lot exhibits several visible crease lines and minor marks. Dimensions:  $6 \text{ cm } \times 9 \text{ cm } (2 \frac{1}{4}\text{"} \times 3 \frac{1}{2}\text{"})$

"We Can Work It Out" Gold Disc м **Beatles, The** 

A gold disc presented to the Beatles to commemorate more than a million sales of their December 1965 single "We Can Work It Out". Released in the United States by Capitol Records, "We Can Work It Out" was a double A-side single with the song "Day Tripper".

Presented in a wooden frame, the display features a gold-coloured disc with an orange-and-yellow label featuring the single title, and a metal plaque beneath, which states this is a certified RIAA sales award. There are signs of scuffing present on the frame, and there is string on the reverse for wall mounting.

A limited edition Yellow Submarine jukebox manufactured in 2001 by Rock-Ola, in collaboration with Apple Corp.

Designed by Lordsvale Sales Ltd CEO Mike Ansell and two Apple Corp. studio artists, the jukebox is finished in bright yellow with colourful psychedelic artwork of scenery and characters from the 1964 animated film. 


An important 26-page agreement dated "25th June 1974" and personally signed by John Lennon. The last page in the agreement lists early original Beatles songs credited to the Lennon-McCartney partnership.

Before the Beatles became a worldwide phenomenon, Lennon and Paul McCartney established a songwriting partnership, meaning they were both credited equally for the songs either of them created. They formed Northern Songs Ltd in 1963 alongside Brian Epstein and Dick James, who received a share of the royalties from Lennon and McCartney's music.

This contract was created when Lennon decided to split the partnership and began writing music with Yoko Ono. The agreement features several typed paragraphs stating that the ownership of Lennon and Ono's musical compositions should be transferred to both of their companies in New York. In return, Northern Songs Ltd was entitled to receive a percentage of the gross royalties from those songs. 



A custom ice cream van used on British rock band Blur's The Magic Whip tour. Released in April 2015, The Magic Whip was Blur's eighth album, and their first album in 12 years.

Lead singer Damon Albarn donated this van to the Star Boot Sale charity auction, held from 19 to 29 May 2016 to raise money for the International Rescue Committee. It was notably seen on stage during Blur's headline performance at British Summer Time in Hyde Park on 20 June 2015. It was also parked outside certain venues during The Magic Whip Tour as added advertising for the album.

This custom-modified 1979 Bedford CF ice cream van features a pink-and-white fibreglass-and-resin exterior with custom imagery, including the Chinese writing seen on The Magic Whip album cover. Inside is one seat and a Carpigiani ice-cream machine in working condition, complete with instructions. The vehicle plays music, which was played at the beginning of the band's Hyde Park set. Also included are two trays used by Albarn at the concert to hand out ice creams to the crowd.



A spacesuit worn by legendary singer-songwriter David Bowie (in his Major Tom persona) in the music video for his 1980 single "Ashes to Ashes", the lead single from his album Scary Monsters (and Super Creeps). Bowie wore his spacesuit early in the video, seated on a rocky beach, and again in the closing shot, suspended via several tubes. Directed by Bowie and David Mallet, "Ashes to Ashes" is regarded as one of the most iconic videos of the early '80s, and remains one of the most expensive ever made. The song's chorus, "Ashes to ashes, funk to funky, We know Major Tom's a junkie, Strung out in heaven's high, Hitting an all-time low", makes specific reference to Bowie's Major Tom character and the situation he finds

The suit originated from the collection of musician Gideon Wagner, who shared a manager with Bowie in Kenneth Pitt. Over the years, Wagner was given several items of Bowie's clothing by both Pitt and Bowie. Wagner stated he was given this suit soon after the completion of filming, and wore the garment on several occasions for his own performances.

This futuristic garment is a customised high-altitude pressure Mk. 2A suit, designed in the 1950s to be worn under a flying suit and help keep its wearer cool while in the high-temperature cockpit of an RAF jet. It is made of thin white nylon and features a system of PVC tubes sewn all over, with Velcro fastening at the back of the neck. Within the neckline is a maker's label marked "Size No. 4" and deted 1961





Elvis Presley's Gun License Application M

#### **Elvis Presley**

A State of California gun licence application for a concealed weapon permit featuring the personal details of Elvis Presley. It is well documented that the "King of Rock and Roll" had a vast collection of firearms and was fascinated by them for most of his life. From a young age, he would shoot snakes near his family home in Tupelo, Mississippi, and it was reported in the early 1970s that he shot at his TV and one of his cars at his Graceland mansion.

Presley would insist on being armed whenever he travelled in the US, so he would file the necessary paperwork for every state he visited. During the early '70s, Presley would even carry a pair of derringer pistols in his boots when performing on stage, after becoming paranoid in the wake of multiple death threats.

On one side, the licence is stamped "Oct 30 1970" and states Presley was permitted to carry a Colt 38 revolver (serial number 2845Y) and a Beretta 7.6 automatic (serial number A65258). The other side of the application displays several details for Presley, including his driver's licence number, social security number, date of birth, weight, height, full name, hair colour, eye colour, residence address, business address, and a full set of his fingerprints. Only one other complete set of Presley's fingerprints is known to exist, making this lot incredibly rare. The application gives the date he was fingerprinted as "10.22.70", and Presley has also signed the same side in blue ink. The application displays minor discolouration. 

George Harrison Owned Dallas 'E' Banjolele м

#### George Harrison

A gold-plated Dallas 'E' banjolele owned and played by renowned musician and former Beatles guitarist George Harrison. This banjolele originally belonged to comedy performer George Formby and was presented to him in 1930 by Dallas, the instrument makers. It remained in his collection until his death in 1961.

On 20-22 June 1961, an auction took place in St. Annes, England at "Beryldene", the last home of Formby and his wife, Beryl. Here, the banjolele was purchased by Frank Formby, George's brother. It was sold a decade later to Bill Logan, President of the George Formby Society. Then the instrument was acquired in 1990 by Stan Evans on behalf of Harrison, who was a member of the George Formby Society.

In 1991, at a concert held at Digswell, Welwyn Garden City, George Formby's nephew Jeffrey met Harrison and informed him of the instrument's history. Harrison offered to give the banjolele back to the family, but Jeffrey preferred to purchase the instrument.

Harrison watched Formby's films and listened to his music throughout his childhood, which later sparked an obsession with ukuleles during the 1980s. His love of the instrument is referenced in an interview with musician Tom Petty in the Martin Scorsese documentary George Harrison: Living in the Material World.

This Dallas 'E' banjolele comprises a walnut neck, a walnut-veneered maple body and gold-plated metal components around the head. The ebony fingerboard is decorated with mother-of-pearl dots and markers, and the top of the headstock features a "George Formby" inlay. The model "E" and serial number "1169" adorn the back of the headstock, and it is presented in its original brown leather case. The banjolele displays some tarnishing, scuffing on the wood and a small chip on the headstock. However, it remains in excellent condition considering its age. 

A limited-edition bass guitar known as the Hac 51 model, constructed from pieces of the Haçienda nightclub in Manchester, England. The Haçienda became famous during the rave scene in the late 1980s and early 1990s, during which time it was primarily funded by the band New Order and their label Factory Records. After escalating debts, it lost its licence in June 1997 and was demolished in 2002.

When this happened, the club's maple dance floor was mostly scrapped. However, some pieces were salvaged by a band that rehearsed upstairs in the same building, who stored them in a garden shed. In 2010, the publisher of The Haçienda: How Not to Run a Club, written by New Order co-founder and bassist Peter Hook, suggested putting pieces of the floor with special-edition versions of the book. So music archivist Chris Hewitt - who has worked with Hook on and off for the last 40 years - tracked down the salvaged maple dance floor pieces. While he examined and cut pieces for the publishers, it occurred to him that they could also be used to create the neck maple fretboard on guitars. After discussing the idea with Hook, Hewitt commissioned custom guitar builder Brian Eastwood to create 10 bass guitars with maple fretboard from the pieces. The instrument comprises a headstock formed into the shape of the Haçienda dancefloor; a neck with fretboard made from the maple dance floor; and a yellow-and-black striped body, representing the Ben Kelly designed nightclub's iconic chevrons. Metal checker plate pieces the same as the nightclub's staircases decorate the headstock and back of the body. This particular guitar also has a piece of the original granite bar top mounted into the body. Additionally, what are normally f-holes on a hollow body guitar have been changed to "5" and "1" shaped holes, representing FAC 51, the catalogue number issued to the Haçienda by Factory Records. The guitar comes in a protective flight case with a black faux-fur lining, and the neck exhibits markings from its time as part of a dance floor.

Gallagher wore round John Lennon-style glasses until around 1996, and notably wore a pair in the music video for Oasis hit "Don't Look Back In Anger". This lot originally came from one of Gallagher's employees, and an image of these sunglasses can be found in Buying Into Britpop by Rob Fiddaman, published by Panda Press.

The Cutler and Gross Savile Row sunglasses feature round pink-tinted lenses with a 14-karat gold-plated frame. The glasses are presented in a textured leather Cutler and Gross case, and one lens exhibits minor marks. Noel Gallagher's Custom Silver Sparkle Gibson Les Paul Florentine Guitar †A

A one-of-a-kind Silver Sparkle Gibson Les Paul Florentine used and owned by Noel Gallagher during his time in the iconic British band Oasis. This guitar, described by Gallagher in a 1997 interview as "the best guitar in the world," was made specifically for him by Gibson's custom shop in 1997 and was used extensively during 1997 and 1998 for recordings and live performances.

The Florentine was used prominently during the recording of Oasis' third album Be Here Now, released in August 1997. The record became the biggest-selling album of that year, and the fastest-selling album in the UK in 1997. Gallagher subsequently used the guitar on the record-breaking Be Here Now world tour. The Florentine is one of his primary guitars from the Oasis era and is believed to be the most-extensively used and documented Noel Gallagher guitar outside of the artist's personal collection; hundreds of photos exist of Gallagher with this guitar.

Other notable use of the Florentine includes a rare solo set for the Tibetan Freedom Concert in New York; a concert at the Oakland Coliseum on 18 June 1997; The David Letterman Show; Saturday Night Live; and the BBC documentary Oasis: Right Here, Right Now. It was also used to record the track "Temper Temper" by Goldie.

A 1997 article on Oasis in Spin magazine featured Gallagher singing the guitar's praises directly:

"That's the best guitar in the world," says Noel Gallagher. "It's not one of the best guitars, it's the best guitar." The guitar Noel speaks of is his own—a Les Paul Florentine Diamond Sparkle. It sits in its open case like a diamond in a jewel box, and Noel stares down at it lovingly. It's covered in bright silver glitter. The guitar costs \$3,590, but you can't buy one. It's custom made. "The thing about that guitar is it's got that extra...You know what I mean? When you've got everything turned all the way up, this one gives you more. It goes to '11'."

This guitar, serial number "7 9007", was part of a batch of instruments that Gallagher sold circa 2001 through the New Kings Road Vintage Guitar Emporium. The Les Paul Florentine comprises an ebony fingerboard, a distinctive silver glitter finish on the body, and nickel-plated hardware. Gibson's hallmark five-piece diamond-like pearlescent inlay adorns the black headstock (unique to custom models). It also features two volume knobs, two tone knobs, and a selector switch. A "U" Underworld sticker is adhered under the tailpiece, as placed by Gallagher circa June 1997; Underworld was a company that produced Oasis merchandise in the 1990s.

The guitar comes in its original protective case, featuring a white "Oasis" stencil and remnants of a "Metalheadz" sticker on the exterior. Metalheadz was a UK drum and bass record label founded by Goldie and Kemistry & Storm, so the sticker was likely added during the recording of "Temper Temper".

The guitar remains in very good condition, with light horizontal cracking to the body's varnish layer and some light wear to the nickel-plated components. There are some residue marks on the "U" sticker where a "Metalheadz" sticker was once placed over the top (sticker was retained and is present in the guitar case.)

In 2022, iconic Microdot photographer and designer Brian Cannon, who worked design for the original album, photographed the guitar with a red Matchless amp (see the following lot) to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Be Here Now.

The guitar was a treasured possession in the previous owner's collection for many years and its history was documented in issue 455 of Guitarist magazine. A printout of information from Gibson on the guitar's history is included, which states "This guitar was indeed given by ER London to Oasis back then."

The lot is also accompanied by a handwritten note of provenance from Gallagher's guitar technician Jason Rhodes, a letter of provenance from New Kings Road Vintage Guitar Emporium, and an array of material featuring the guitar, including a custom-made booklet showcasing the guitar, magazines, newspapers, framed photographs, additional loose photographs and slides, and a framed Right Here, Right Now poster. ### Noel Gallagher's Red Matchless Superchief 120 Amplifier +A

#### Oasis

A red Matchless Superchief 120 amplifier and matching cabinet used by Noel Gallagher during his time in the iconic British band Oasis. This amplifier and cabinet were initially owned by The Smiths guitarist Johnny Marr, who ordered this and another custom amplifier - coloured green - to be built by Matchless founder Mark Sampson.

The red amplifier and cabinet were loaned to Noel Gallagher in 1997. Gallagher used the amplifier extensively during 1997 and 1998, including on the record-breaking Be Here Now world tour, and in several television appearances - most notably when Oasis performed "Don't Go Away" on The David Letterman Show. It can also be seen in the BBC documentary Oasis: Right Here, Right Now. In addition, several images of Gallagher performing during this period feature the Matchless amp in the background. Gallagher later returned the amp to Marr, who sold it through Rick Zsigmond of the New Kings Road Vintage Guitar Emporium.

This Matchless amp was also photographed alongside the Gallagher's Silver Sparkle guitar for the 25th anniversary of Be Here Now by iconic photographer and graphic designer Brian Cannon, founder of Microdot. Cannon famously created the album covers for Oasis, including Definitely Maybe, (What's The Story) Morning Glory and Be Here Now.

Both the amplifier's head and cab feature a red leather exterior with cut-out sections at the back. Various control knobs, switches and power inputs adorn the front and back of the head. A sticker with the text "Big Dogs Bollox" was added to the front by Gallagher's guitar tech Jason Rhodes to represent how loud it was, and its serial number is "M4775". The cab contains four speakers, and a plaque on the back reads "Model ES 412, Serial No. B 01 08 97". The back of the cab is autographed by Johnny Marr in silver-coloured ink. Also included in the lot is the amplifier's original metal flight case on wheels, with "Oasis" stencilled in white and two "Terminal Studios" stickers adhered to the exterior. An additional strip of yellow tape reads "OA-O5G-Noel". There are small patches of wear on the leather, scuffing on the case and corrosion on the metal components.





Two limited-edition photographic prints featuring Noel and Liam Gallagher. These candid, behind-the-scenes images by acclaimed rock photographer Jill Furmanovsky were taken during the music video shoot for Oasis' hit single "Wonderwall", with the guitars being used by them available in the subsequent lot.

The first print shows both Brothers sitting down with Noel playing an Antoria Folk J200 guitar with green-coloured paper adhered to the front and the second print shows Noel (again seated), playing a Gibson J200 acoustic guitar as Liam is crouched down in front of him. #### Oasis

A set of three guitars used by Oasis in the "Wonderwall" music video. Released on the acclaimed 1995 album (What's the Story) Morning Glory?, "Wonderwall" remains one of the band's most successful and recognisable songs.

The guitars used for the video were rented specifically for the shoot from the specialist music hire company Beat About The Bush. Labels featuring the company's name are stuck onto the back of two headstocks, one of which is seen in the video at one point.

The three instruments included in this lot are an Antoria Folk 698M (J200) guitar (Antoria's clone of the Gibson J200 model), a Gibson-brand J200 guitar and a Hofner semi-acoustic bass guitar. All three are used in different ways by different band members during the video. Each guitar is played by Noel Gallagher, and all feature prominently. The Antoria and Gibson guitars also photo-match to behind-the-scenes images shot by lauded rock photographer Jill Furmanovsky, with two prints of her images available in the preceding lot.

Nigel Dick directed the video, which won the Best British Video at the Brit Awards in 1996. Gallagher initially briefed director Nigel Dick that the video should be black-and-white, with hints of colour. The video was initially shot in colour and then converted to black-and-white. At one point during the shoot, pieces of coloured paper were attached to the top surface of the Antoria and Gibson guitars. The Antoria and Gibson colours were digitally enhanced for certain shots; each guitar also appears in the video in its natural state without the paper cover or digital effects.

A close-up shot of Gallagher playing the Antoria Folk 698M (J200) guitar – without the paper – is seen at 4 minutes 20 seconds in the video. Markings on the saddle and pickguard can be screen-matched to this shot. The "Beat About the Bush" label adhered to the back of the headstock features in a close-up shot of Bonehead quickly spinning around the guitar. It can also be matched to the print showing Gallagher holding the Antoria (with paper adhered) seated next to his brother Liam. The guitar is decorated with mother-of-pearl inlays on the headstock and neck, and a floral patterned tortoiseshell pickguard. Additional pearl sections are present on the dark-stained wooden saddle.

The Gibson J200 guitar (serial number 91431010) is clearly seen being played by Gallagher at 1 minute 45 seconds, and is coloured blue. Patterns in the pickguard and colouring on the neck can be matched to the other behind-the-scenes photo print of Gallagher holding this guitar. Additionally, the Gibson is the front instrument in shots showing all three guitars hanging on a rack, with a showgirl in the background. The Gibson has similar decorative components to the Antoria, but with cut-out sections on the bridge.

The Hofner 500/5 semi-acoustic bass (serial number 863) is played by Gallagher in a close-up at 1 minute 32 seconds. Patterns in the woodgrain and specific markings can be screen-matched to the close-up. It is primarily seen in group shots being played by Scott McLeod, who joined Oasis for a short period after bassist Paul "Guigsy" McGuigan quit. "Wonderwall" was the only music video McLeod appeared in, and he himself quit soon after. In addition, the Hofner bass seen hanging on a rack by itself with the showgirl still in the background. The bass guitar features a pearlescent pickguard, similar floral patterns on the black headstock, and white-coloured tone and volume knobs. Another "Beat About The Bush" label is stuck to the rear of the guitar's body.

All three guitars come in protective leather cases that were not used for the production, and have adhered labels that do not relate to the instrument within. The set exhibits minimal wear, and the bass pickguard is slightly loose.

Oasis remains one of the UK's most successful and influential groups. These guitars were used in arguably their most successful song, which sparked their worldwide popularity. "Wonderwall" continues to be loved by many, being the first 1990s song to reach over one billion streams in October 2020. Like many other Oasis hits, its lyrics were written by Noel Gallagher, who has firmly established himself as one of the most influential songwriters in British music history. The lot is accompanied by a letter of authenticity from Beat About The Bush. A 1962 Epiphone Casino guitar used and owned by Noel Gallagher during his time in the iconic British band Oasis. Gallagher obtained this Epiphone Casino guitar in 1995 after being advised to do so by The Jam's Paul Weller. The guitar was initially advertised in a local newspaper, and Gallagher went to the seller's house to personally collect it. It was played on various recordings circa 1996-97, including Oasis' third album, Be Here Now and demos of songs for the band's fourth album, Standing on the Shoulder of Giants. The guitar can also be seen held by guitarist Bonehead in a couple of images taken by acclaimed rock photographer Jill Furmanovsky during the recording sessions of Be Here Now. These images feature in her book Was There Then: Oasis: A Photographic Journey.

In 1999, Noel's guitar tech Jason Rhodes was instructed to clear out some of his possessions, including several guitars. The instruments were sold through Rick Zsigmond of the New Kings Road Vintage Guitar Emporium. Rhodes incorrectly referred to this guitar as a "USA '63" in an issue of The Guitar Magazine and also referred to the guitar as "a beautiful specimen".


The 1962 Epiphone Casino comprises a vintage sunburst-finish maple body with two black pickups (a component specifically used on the 1962 model), nickel hardware and a mahogany neck decorated with mother-of-pearl inlays. Two volume knobs, two tone knobs and a selector switch are located on the body's right side. The serial number 99322 is located on the rear of the headstock. A custom Orange NG140 amplifier created for Noel Gallagher and used during his time in the iconic British band Oasis. Gallagher used Orange Amps custom stacks throughout the late '90s and early 2000s. Orange Amps stacks can be seen in the music video for "Stop Crying Your Heart Out", released in 2002, and in footage and images included in the BBC documentary Oasis: Right Here, Right Now and Mat Whitecross' documentary Oasis: Supersonic.

Built by the Orange Amps custom shop in 1998, this particular amplifier was requested by Gallagher and originally came directly from his personal collection. He specifically requested that the amplifier be able to produce loud distortion.

The 140W amplifier is made of plywood with steel hardware and a vibrant orange Tolex exterior, and contains three 12" Celestion speakers. Its top edge features various control knobs and switches, with the text "Custom Shop 140 Noel Gallagher" printed in black. A strip of tape with handwritten reference text is stuck along the top. The amplifier has the serial number "M20042805292", and a plated plaque is adhered to the back with an engraving of a stick figure and the words "Orange, Custom Shop, Noel Gallagher". The plaque also features "#1", denoting the amplifier as unique.

Also included is the amplifier's original wheeled metal flight case, which features "Oasis" stencilled in white on one side. A bright yellow tape strip reading "OA 112 – Noel..." is adhered to one side, and an additional tape strip with handwritten reference text is stuck on the top. 

A tarnished metal zip fastening runs down the front of the jacket, and the hood also has a similar zip running down its centre. The coat's size label is no longer present. Keith Grant's Olympic Studios Mixing Desk Used in the Recording of Division Bell and Many More M

#### Pink Floyd, Barbra Streisand, Joan Armatrading And Others

An Olympic Studios mixing desk used by the legendary production engineer Keith Grant. An inspirational character in the British music industry, Grant worked with many established acts during the 1960s and '70s, including The Beatles, David Bowie, Pink Floyd, Eric Clapton, The Eagles, The Jimi Hendrix Experience, Led Zeppelin, Queen, the Small Faces, Dusty Springfield, Scott Walker and The Who. He later worked on movie soundtracks for various productions, including The Rocky Horror Show, Cry Freedom and Jesus Chris Superstar. It is worth noting that this is only the second prominent Pink Floyd recording console to ever reach open market, and the previous one was sold for 1.8 million dollars in 2017.

Opening its doors in the late 1950s, Olympic Studios quickly became a revolutionary venue, and was considered to be as significant as Abbey Road Studios. Grant worked at Olympic Studios from around 1959 to 1987 and was a key figure in helping it become a sought-after location for musical acts. It gained an impressive reputation for creating high-quality sounds with new cutting-edge recording technology and equipment, including its renowned mixing desks.

This console is a unique wrap-around design specially built to Grant's requirements for optimum sound quality. It was located in Studio 3 at Olympic and was the only one custombuilt by Raindirk Audio during the late 1970s. Grant kept the desk in his possession, moving it to Twickenham Film studios and eventually to his home studio in Sunbury-On-Thames, where it remained until the day he passed away, in June 2012. This Olympic Studios mixing desk was notably used during the recording of Pink Floyd's iconic album The Division Bell, the track "Love and Affection" by Joan Armatrading and the soundtrack to Barbra Streisand's Yentl which won the Academy-Award® for Best Original Score in 1983.

The desk comprises an extensive number of controls and switches housed within a dark-stained wooden frame, with brown faux leather along the frame's inner edge. The controls include 16 mic pre-channels on the right-hand side, and 24 line channels. Each channel contains four aux sends and two inserts. In addition, there are ten external EQ channels fitted. These are exact replicas of the EQs fitted to the first-ever Olympic console, designed by Dick Swettenham. A huge amount of work went into creating these EQ units.

The two main parts of the console come presented on specially built metal stands, and the desk separates into three sections for transportation purposes. An external power supply is included, and some restoration has been undertaken over the last 10 years. It has been mostly recapped, and comes with service manuals, an automation system, spare channels, pots and op amps. There are signs of scuffing and scratching on the wood, with minor wear on the leather. The desk is accompanied by an assortment of electronic circuit diagrams and schematics. 

#### Sex Pistols, The

A vintage TEAC A3340 reel-to-reel tape recorder used by sound engineer Dave Goodman to record early bootleg demos by iconic punk rock band The Sex Pistols. Goodman was originally tasked to engineer for the 101ers – fronted by Joe Strummer – at the Nashville Rooms in London, April 1976. The support band were The Sex Pistols, and this event is infamous for members of the band getting into a brawl with some of the audience. After hearing their brash and unique sound, Goodman offered his services and began working with The Sex Pistols.

This TEAC, a four-track machine, was used by Goodman to record some of the subsequent Sex Pistols live shows. However, it was most notably taken to the Denmark Street residence leased as a rehearsal space and a place for guitarist Steve Jones to live by the band's manager Malcolm McLaren. Here, the tape machine was used to record the band's earliest known studio demo sessions, capturing an important moment in British music history and the very first UK punk music recordings. These recordings became part of the unofficial Spunk bootleg album, and featured original bassist Glen Matlock. Many fans argue that this was the Pistols' real album as opposed to Never Mind the Bollocks, Here's the Sex Pistols.

Goodman recorded three separate sessions with the band until January 1977, when recording duties for Never Mind the Bollocks, Here's the Sex Pistols were handed over to producer Chris Thomas. Goodman's recordings helped the band secure a deal with EMI; some were later used as B-sides, and on the soundtrack to Julien Temple's 1980 documentary The Great Rock 'n' Roll Swindle. Goodman sold the recorder in the late 1980s to the current owner, whom he'd met professionally.


Housed within a blue-painted wooden frame with two metal handles adhered to the top, the tape recorder (serial number 118521) features a stereo/monaural/multi-channel system that can record up to four tracks with two reels. Four output switches and four additional mic switches are located in the bottom left corner. Connected at the back are four RCA connectors and a standard UK wall plug. The internal components and cables are exposed at the back, and the electronics remain untested. There are visible signs of age, including corrosion on the internal metal parts, and the handles have loosened over time.







Slash's Leather Jacket from Paradise City Music Video and Appetite for Destruction Album  $\Omega$ 

**Guns N' Roses: Paradise City (1988)** 

Slash's leather jacket as worn extensively at gigs and public appearances in the early days of Guns N' Roses, including Nigel Dick's music video for their song Paradise City. Considered one of the greatest guitarists in the history of rock-androll, Slash (aka Saul Hudson) purchased this jacket at Let It Rock on Melrose Blvd. in Hollywood, CA in 1986.

Slash wore this exact jacket during GNR's early club tour performances on LA's iconic Sunset Strip and other local clubs prior to the band signing with Geffen Records in March 1986.

Images taken by the band's first photographer Marc Canter of Canter's Deli, a Hollywood landmark, documented Slash performing with GNR at these historic Los Angeles venues, including The Troubadour, Roxy, Fender's Ballroom, Whiskey a Go Go, and The Cathouse. The Sunset Strip clubs were influential in the 80's metal scene pioneered by Guns N' Roses, Motley Crue, Ratt, Quiet Riot, Poison, and W.A.S.P., to name a few.

According to Slash, "This jacket was stolen from me one evening at the Cathouse nightclub. My security guard and I tracked the thief down, beat him up, and got it back!"

Slash wore the jacket throughout the Appetite for Destruction world tour and prominently in the "Paradise City" music video (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Rbm6GXIIBiw">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Rbm6GXIIBiw</a>). The music video was filmed with six separate cameras during a live performance at Giants Stadium in New Jersey on August 16, 1988 in front of 77,000 fans. Additional black-and-white footage from their performance was included at The Monsters of Rock Festival at Donington Park in England on August 20, 1988. Slash can be seen wearing this jacket during both performances and in behind-the-scenes shots in the music video. Publicity photos and the back cover of Appetite for Destruction feature Slash wearing this jacket. Many of these images remain in circulation, having been featured on the cover of Rolling Stone magazine and in other renowned print and digital media for more than 25 years.

Prior to the band's record deal, they also performed in the Kibitz Room, a bar located in Canter's Deli. Marc Canter, Slash's childhood friend, provided the starving musicians with free food, as seen in the photograph of the band which hangs in the restaurant today. Slash also filmed multiple documentary interviews at Canter's including, "Slash Raised On The Sunset Strip" (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=F2KUwjvit8s).

Many of Canter's images, some of which appear in this listing, are also included in his book, Reckless Road: Guns N' Roses and the Making of Appetite for Destruction documenting GNR's explosive rise to fame (<a href="www.recklessroad.com">www.recklessroad.com</a>). In the foreword to the book, Slash says of Canter: "He's my best friend; one of the only good friends that is consistent. I can't nail down in a word what makes Marc the person that he is - he is just a character unto himself...There isn't a better person to actually release any material having to do with the coming together and history of Guns N' Roses, where it went, and what was going on behind-the-scenes."

The black leather fringed motorcycle jacket features leather epaulettes with snaps, multiple metal zippers with ball chain details, a buckled waist band, and a silver-colour snake pin affixed to the right lapel. Black leather fringe lines both arms and the back of the jacket. The original red lining was replaced with a blue satin lining due to extensive use. Stitch holes are evident in the leather where the red lining was attached. It also exhibits small scuffs and tears through the leather and some twisting to the fringe from extensive use and age. This jacket remained in Slash's possession until 2016 when he sold his collection, with the proceeds donated to a children's charity. Also included is Slash's personal framed photo of the band accepting an award with Slash again prominently featured wearing the jacket





- 10.2. If a Buyer demonstrates, to Propstore's reasonable satisfaction, that the Guarantee of Attribution is materially incorrect, the sale will be rescinded if the Lot is returned to Propstore in the same condition in which it was at the time of sale. In order to satisfy Propstore that the Guarantee of Attribution is materially incorrect, Propstore reserves the right to require the Buyer to obtain, at the Buyer's expense, the opinion of two experts in the field, mutually acceptable to Propstore and the Buyer.
- 10.3. In the event a sale is rescinded in accordance with condition 10.2, Propstore shall repay to the Buyer the Purchase Price. Repayment of the Purchase Price shall be the Buyer's sole remedy for an incorrect Guarantee of Attribution, to the exclusion of all other remedies to the extent permissible at law. It is specifically understood that this will be considered the Buyer's sole remedy under this clause 10.
- 10.4. The Buyer expressly agrees that Propstore shall not be liable in whole or in part, for, and the Buyer shall not be entitled to recover, any special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages including loss of profits or value of investment or opportunity cost.
- 10.5. Bidders are aware that description revisions may occur on some Lots, and should inquire before the Auction whether any description revisions have occurred on a given Lot and/or examine a lot before bidding on it. Propstore will make all reasonable efforts to make description revisions readily available during the Auction.

Propstore will not be liable or responsible for any failure to perform, or delay in performance of, any of its obligations under these Conditions that is caused by an event outside its control, that being any act or event beyond Propstore's reasonable control, including without limitation strikes, lock-outs or other industrial action by third parties, civil commotion, riot, invasion, terrorist attack or threat of terrorist attack, war (whether declared or not) or threat or preparation for war, fire, explosion, storm, flood, earthquake, subsidence, epidemic or other natural disaster, or failure of public or private telecommunications networks. Propstore's obligations shall be suspended and time for performance extended until such time as the event outside it's control is over, following which a new collection or shipping date can be agreed.

#### 13. Other important terms

13.1. If any part of these Conditions is found by any court to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part shall be discounted and the rest of the Conditions shall continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.

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#### **Terms & Conditions**

13.2. The contract is between the Seller, Buyer and Propstore and no other person shall have any rights to enforce any of its terms.

13.3. If Propstore fails to insist on performance of any of a Buyer's obligations under these Conditions, or if it delays in doing so, that will not mean that Propstore has waived its rights against the Buyer and does not mean the Buyer no longer has to comply with those obligations.

13.4. These Conditions are governed by English law, without regard to its choice of law provisions. The Parties agree that any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of or in connection with this agreement or its subject matter or formation may be brought in any court of competent jurisdiction located in England or Wales or, alternatively, in any court of competent jurisdiction where Propstore or the Bidder/Buyer resides, at the option of the Party bringing the claim, only. The Parties expressly agree to the jurisdiction of such courts and agree to submit to the jurisdiction of such courts. The prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of all Lawyers' fees, costs and expenses incurred by it/him/her in connection with the dispute. "Lawyers' fees and expensese" includes, without limitation, paralegals' fees and expenses, solicitor's fees consultants' fees and expenses, expert witness' fees and expenses, and all other expenses incurred by the prevailing party or its attorneys in the course of their representation of the prevailing party in anticipation of and/or during the course of the litigation, whether or not otherwise recoverable as "attorneys' fees" or as "costs" under applicable law; and the same may be sought and awarded in accordance with applicable procedure as pertaining to an award of contractual Lawyers' fees.
