# 1 Framed Pair of Discovery Crew Mission Patches 2001: A Space Odyssey (1968)


A pair of framed Discovery crew mission patches from Stanley Kubrick's 2001: A Space Odyssey. Dave Bowman (Keir Dullea), Frank Poole (Gary Lockwood), and other crew members aboard the Discovery One wore matching patches on their standard-issue jumpsuits throughout the film.

Often considered among the greatest films ever made, 2001 was created through intensive research and design teams headed by Kubrick, who legendarily oversaw every aspect of production, down to the actors' costumes. The Discovery One uniforms in particular were designed by NASA veteran Harry Lange, whose painstaking attention to detail lent the production an air of unprecedented realism.

Indeed, Lange received an Academy Award® nomination for his work two months before Apollo 11 landed on the moon.

Custom-made for the film, these patches were originally obtained from an employee of UK costume house Bermans & Nathans, who saved them when the jumpsuits were stripped for re-use in another production. This pair consists of one round denim patch designed in the style of Apollo-era NASA patches with "United States Astronautics Agency" and "Discovery" printed in black around a blueand-gold-color sun emblem, as well as one blue felt-backed, wing-shaped patch embroidered with celestial bead patterns. Both come mounted to muslin with archival glue and archivally framed in a custom black frame equipped with a hanging wire on the reverse. The denim patch exhibits creasing and light fraying around its edges from being removed from a uniform, while the felt on the other patch is pilling at both ends. ## 2 Jack Bauer's (Kiefer Sutherland) Costume and Photo-Matched Kevlar Vest 24 (2001-2010)

Jack Bauer's (Kiefer Sutherland) costume and photo-matched Kevlar vest from the drama television series 24. CTU agent Bauer wore his top throughout the second half of Season 3, his jeans in episodes 21 through 23 of Season 4, and his Kevlar vest in various scenes throughout Seasons 1 through 6. Intentional points of distress on this vest photo-match to page 11 of Michael Goldman's guidebook 24: The Ultimate Guide. This is one of only three hero vests used by Sutherland over the run of the scenes, with this particular vest having been heavily utilized throughout Season 2. Behind-the-scenes, Sutherland enjoyed the weight and feel of the vest and used it to stay in character, even while on breaks between filming. This lot consists of a blue-gray John Varvatos thermal top (Size "S"); a pair of distressed, low bootcut Levi jeans ("W30 L32"); and a hero, police-issue Kevlar vest, manufactured by Second Chance. The jeans exhibit staining on the lower lea from wear.


# Jack Bauer's (Kiefer Sutherland) Hero CTU Badge **24 (2001–2010)**

Jack Bauer's (Kiefer Sutherland) hero CTU (Counter Terrorism Unit) badge from the drama television series 24. Bauer carried his badge with him throughout the show's first six seasons.

The gold-color metal badge is mounted on a leather backing with a metal chain at the top and a metal clip on the back.

The lot is accompanied by a letter of authenticity signed by the series Prop Master Randy Gunter. Dimensions: 3.25" x 2.25" x 2.75" (8.5 cm x 6 cm x 6 cm)

Jack Bauer's (Kiefer Sutherland) CTU (Counter Terrorism Unit) ID and badge from the drama television series 24. Bauer carried his identification credentials with him throughout the series.

This lot features a black leather wallet, inside which is a gold-color metal badge on one side and an ID card on the other. The card features an image of Bauer above the CTU logo. The image was taken on location at the Sybil Brand prison during the filming of Season 3.

### 3:10 To Yuma (2007)

Ben Wade's (Russell Crowe) screen-matched costume from James Mangold's 3:10 to Yuma. This hat screen-matches to scenes throughout the film, and the overcoat matches to Wade's introduction scene.

Originating from Russell Crowe's personal collection, this costume consists of a black felt hat with an embroidered band inset with turquoise stones; a black velveteen overcoat; a diamond-patterned black cotton vest; a gray cotton long-sleeve shirt labeled "RC Oct 2006" at the neck; a beige cotton long-sleeve thermal; and black felted polyester pants featuring braided accents, a button placket, and a reinforced leather cup for horseback riding. Also included are a brown leather replica belt with brass-color hardware and a gun holster added to complete the costume; and a black velveteen pouch with earplugs. The belt was made by Will Ghormley, who made the original for the film. This costume exhibits discoloration, fading, snagged fibers and threads, and loose components.

Additional Provenance: A handwritten Letter of Authenticity from Crowe on his personal letterhead describing this as "Ben Wade's #1" costume.

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# 6 Elise Sellas' (Emily Blunt) Costume The Adjustment Bureau (2011)

Elise Sellas' (Emily Blunt) costume from George Nolfi's The Adjustment Bureau. Elise wore her costume when she intruded on David Norris (Matt Damon) practicing his speech in the restroom during election night, whilst she was hiding after crashing a wedding.

This lot consists of a black lace and light blue satin dress with changeable straps; a black and navy blue wool Rag & Bone jacket with metal buttons; black suede Prada cross-strap stiletto heels (Size 37); a black metal lace design bracelet; dark gray metal lace design dangle earrings; and a metal bracelet wrapped in black thread and decorated in faux diamonds. This lot exhibits minor tarnishing on the earrings, missing faux diamonds, and scuffing on the heels.

The Lady Airwolf Helicopter 4.5-Foot Principle Filming Model Airwolf (1984-1987)

An Airwolf helicopter 4.5-foot principle filming model from Donald P. Bellisario's Airwolf. The Airwolf was an advanced stealth supersonic helicopter designed by the evil Charles Moffet (David Hemmings) and piloted throughout the series by Stringfellow Hawke (Jan-Michael Vincent) and his crew, who nicknamed it "The Lady." Although a real Bell 222 helicopter was used for many of the show's flight sequences, model miniatures based on the Bell 222 were employed for the mountain hangar sequence seen throughout the series.

This helicopter is constructed of paneled resin and metal painted dark green, khaki, and black with rotating red-and-silver-color striped rotors, a clear plastic windshield, and mesh grating over the body. The cockpit contains the upper half of a pilot model miniature figure made of plastic supported by a block of foam. Following production, the model underwent sympathetic restoration to repair breaks in its propellers, tailfins, and stabilizers. The interior of the helicopter houses a motor, but its functionality remains untested. It exhibits a coat of grime, small fractures in its paneling, and yellowing to its plastic elements from age and storage. Dimensions: 56" x 24" x 15" (142.25 cm x 61 cm x 38.25 cm)

## Ace Ventura: When Nature Calls (1995)

Ace Ventura's (Jim Carrey) Hawaiian print shirt with a belt from Steve Oedekerk's Ace Ventura: When Nature Calls. Ventura wore his tropical fish print Hawaiian shirt as he interrogated safari park owner Burton Quinn (Bob Gunton), and then later when he was strapped to a raft. He wore his cowrie-shell belt during the final "Circle of Death" trial.

This lot consists of one cotton button-up short-sleeve shirt with a colorful tropical theme print that consists of an island at sunset and tropical fish under the water; and one brown faux leather belt with three rows of white cowrie shells sewn onto it, and a decorative white hem whip stitch. This lot exhibits a missing shell, discoloration, and adhesive residue.




USCSS Nostromo Prototype Jacket Alien (1979)

A USCSS Nostromo prototype jacket from Ridley Scott's Alien. The crew of the Nostromo wore brown jackets often with Yutani Weyland and officer rank wing patches. This style of jacket did not make it to the final cut of the film.

This brown cotton jacket has a button front and quilted channels throughout. The front breast features a white and off-green embroidered officer rank wing patch. This jacket exhibits snagged, loose threads and discoloration.

# 10 USCSS Nostromo 11-Foot Principal Filming Model △ **Alien (1979)**

The 11-foot USCSS Nostromo principal filming model miniature from Ridley Scott's

Alien. The crew of the Weyland-Yutani Corporation's USCSS Nostromo were awakened from hypersleep by a distress signal from a desolate moon, and soon found themselves hunted by the deadly xenomorph. The Nostromo, a tug-ship that pulled the massive flat refinery model, was the primary spacecraft featured in the film and was the setting for the majority of its events.

The tug-ship was called the Leviathan in early script drafts and took its final name, Nostromo, from a 1904 Joseph Conrad novel that was significant to Alien writer Dan O'Bannon. The look of the ship was explored for months by concept artists Chris Foss and Ron Cobb; Foss especially produced a large volume of concepts for the exterior while Cobb focused on interiors. Cobb was focused on function as well as form, and did some exterior designs as he thought through the logic of his interiors. The producers and director had trouble agreeing on a final design and eventually a large number of the concepts were passed to Academy Award-winning effects supervisor Brian Johnson. Johnson assembled a veteran effects team for Alien and a number of his crew were involved with the Nostromo final design and construction, including Ron Hone, Bill Pearson, Simon Deering, Martin Bower, and a number of others. Working primarily from one of Cobb's exterior designs, Hone and Pearson built a final prototype of the Nostromo as a small 3D model, which Johnson had Ridley Scott approve, enabling the team to proceed with construction on the final filming models.

Three scale models of the Nostromo tug-ship were made at Bray Studios: this, the principal 11-foot hero used for the majority of the shots in the film, a four-foot medium model with illuminating engines for rear shots, and a 12-inch model for shots incorporating the large, flat ore refinery platform that the Nostromo was towing. The largest model was the primary construction effort, and was first built with a yellow finish in line with Cobb's industrial designs. When Ridley Scott finished the film's live-action photography, he personally took over filming the effects sequences (underway at Shepperton Studios) and had the models repainted dark gray and distressed extensively to imply decades of deep-space travel.

The Nostromo model is constructed primarily of wood paneling and hand-carved wood forms assembled around a robust steel frame and clad with plastic surface panels and detailing from various pieces from off-the-shelf model kits, a process the model makers referred to as "widgeting." It follows an overall deep-space aesthetic seen in both 2001: A Space Odyssey and Star Wars before it. The symmetrical design features various intake vents, engines, antennae, lights, and landing gear.

The model was designed to be shot from all sides and thus could be removed from its primary rolling frame and hung from above, or mounted through steel ports on either side (hidden under plastic cover panels) in order to raise or lower it via forklift. It was outfitted with a lighting system, featuring many tiny light bulbs fitted in small holes throughout the body, and a CO2 system that would spray "gas" from the hull for certain shots. The lighting system was sometimes augmented with a separate additional rig that could be attached for shots that required it, such as ones of the Nostromo landing on the planet, where Scott wanted to see even more extensive lighting.

After filming, the model traveled to Los Angeles to be part of the film's premiere promotions. It was subsequently stored outside under tarps for a number of years and its condition worsened from the elements. An extensive restoration of the model was performed by effects house Grant McCune Design (modelmaker Grant McCune was best known for his work on Star Wars) around 2009, led by industry veterans Monty Shook and Jack Edjourian. The team worked from an extensive body of production photo references to ensure the restoration was faithful to the original build. The intricate work involved straightening and stabilizing structural elements that had become dislodged or warped, and recreating missing surface elements, including panels and model kit detail pieces. Dislocated pieces were fitted again, and a number of missing elements were recreated, notably, two of the three landing gear, the underside component containing the three large lights at the front, two of the three engine interior detail clusters and various engine flaps, one of the intake vents, the side-panel structure mount cover plates, the front radar dish, and the antennae seen on the ship's body. The recreated pieces were made by molding existing examples (such as the landing gear and engine details) wherever possible, for the most faithful recreations possible. The lighting system and CO2 system are largely removed from the model and are not functional, though it would be possible to retrofit a new lighting system if desired.

The Nostromo is frequently cited as one of the classic examples of a spaceship in modern cinema, alongside craft such as the Millennium Falcon and the Discovery from 2001: A Space Odyssey. The historic model comes mounted on its original black steel frame for display, and exhibits good, restored condition with wear and aging visible on many components. Further details of the restoration work are covered in a series of videos on Propstore's YouTube channel and additional restoration information can be provided on request. 


















## 11 Special Effects Facehugger Alien (1979)


A special effects facehugger from Ridley Scott's sci-fi horror Alien. After the mining vessel Nostromo received a transmission from a desolate moon, the crew discovered mysterious eggs in the bowels of a crashed vessel. Kane (John Hurt) got too close to one, and a creature attached to his face. Captain Dallas (Tom Skerritt) and navigator Lambert (Veronica Cartwright) brought him aboard the Nostromo, placing the rest of the crew in danger.

This facehugger originated from the collection of its maker, special effects legend Roger Dicken, who was its owner from the completion of filming until his passing in 2024. The facehugger was originally designed by Swiss surrealist artist H.R. Giger, who was responsible for creating the Alien aesthetic, including the Alien itself, the crashed ship they investigated ("The Derelict,") and the "Space Jockey," the large creature they found on board. However, Giger's initial facehugger design was altered considerably. It was originally a larger creature that would have wrapped around the outside of Kane's helmet. It was subsequently re-designed in collaboration with director Scott, writer Dan O'Bannon, Dicken and artist Ron Cobb. Dicken then sculpted, cast and constructed the creature utilizing a metal skeleton with a fiberglass-and-resin torso.

The facehugger skin is made of latex and features realistic detailing, including veins, wrinkles and ligaments. The flexible tail is made of foam latex to enable it to wrap around the victim's neck. A monofilament wire protrudes from the end of the tail and fingers, which would have been pulled to give the impression of the facehugger tightening its grip. The legs feature articulated wire cores attached to the skeleton, which are believed to have originally facilitated a grabbing motion of the fingers. Latex sacks on either side have an egg-shaped weight within to ensure they hung correctly over Kane's face. On the underside of the facehugger, the metal skeleton is exposed.

The piece has some wear from production use and aging, and Dicken undertook some cosmetic repair work to the surface and the embryo sacks. The facehugger exhibits discoloration due to age, turning from a pale skin color to a darker brown. Some of the foam latex on the tail has flaked away, as has some of the latex on the legs. Internally there are the remnants of dried rubber bands which were part of the original mechanis. It comes on a custom-built display, keeping it in its iconic pose. Dimensions: (displayed) 13.75" x 8" x 14.5" (35 cm x 20 cm x 37 cm)

Ron Cobb created several different versions of each weapon for production. Cast from lightweight rigid foam for easy handling, this static weapon is based loosely on existing military hardware. It consists of two M16 rifle casts spliced together, while the front section is based on an M203 grenade launcher with its handle and receiver sections evident at the center. A Colt Patent Firearms logo is embossed near the butt.

The flamethrower is painted sage green with black detailing, muzzle exhaust holes, safety switches, and textured ridges on the chassis. Following production, it underwent sympathetic restoration to repair a crack on the body forward of the fuel tank. It exhibits some minor associated paint loss and a dulling to its finish from age. ## 13 Facehugger Puppet Aliens (1986)

A facehugger puppet from James Cameron's Aliens. Facehuggers known for implanting xenomorph embryos in their victims' chests appeared in specimen jars in the medical rooms in the colony on Acheron.

Stan Winston Studio designed and created all of the creature effects for Cameron's sequel based on those seen in Ridley Scott's original 1979 film, which were designed for that first film by Roger Dicken and H.R. Giger. Much like its predecessor, Aliens was a commercial and critical success, earning Sigourney Weaver an Academy Award® nomination for Best Actress, the first such nomination given for a science-fiction film.

This facehugger is cast from foam latex with a wire running through the tail for positioning. It features breathing flaps on the underbelly, eight latex-skinned legs molded around an internal metal skeleton, and notably, a single adhered acrylic nail, a rarity as most examples simply have the nails cast into the foam and an indicator that this was a highly-detailed complete puppet at one time. The facehugger is painted beige and pink throughout with ridges along its tail and spine. Also included is a custom display base.

Following production, this facehugger underwent sympathetic restoration to fill and patch sections of damaged foam, including parts of the tail and topside, and reblend flaking and lost paint. The underside had minor stabilization work performed but less patching work in order to preserve its original state. It remains extremely fragile and should be handled with caution. Pvt. Crowe's (Tip Tipping) pair of Colonial Marine greaves from James Cameron's Aliens. Crowe and his fellow United States Colonial Marines donned their standard-issue body armor for their fateful expedition to the alien-ravaged colony on Acheron (LV-426).

Designed and built by renowned armorer Terry English, who custom-made all of the armor for the film, these clamshell-style plated aluminum greaves feature soft green foam knee pads, green nylon cinching straps, and leather connector straps. Both are hand-painted with two-toned green camouflage patterns on the exterior and hand-marked "Tipping" and "N" on the interior. The greaves are also numbered "4" and what appears to be "17," though the latter has faded to illegibility from age.

The pair exhibits creased and cracked leather, extensive scratching on the interiors, and yellow staining from production wear and age.







16 Colonial Marine M41A Pulse Rifle Sling Aliens (1986)

An Colonial Marine M41A pulse rifle sling from James Cameron's Aliens. The United States Colonial Marines carried their pulse rifles with sling straps when they endeavored to re-establish contact with the LV-426 terraforming colony. The same strap style was used by those soldiers tasked with operating Flame units and M314 motion trackers during the mission.

A USM Auriga Lacrime 99 Shockrifle from Jean-Pierre Jeunet's Alien Resurrection. 24th-century United Systems Military (USM) personnel aboard the Auriga wielded Shockrifles as their primary weapons against the alien xenomorphs throughout the film.

This futuristic rifle is constructed primarily from cast and textured resin with a machined aluminum barrel and muzzle. The body is engraved with serial numbers "73-NCB" and "AEAWAR-122363," while the butt is engraved "KA 073." It features a functional trigger, a ribbed fore-end, and a flashlight inset under the barrel designed to illuminate via a switch concealed beneath the barrel's bottom attachment.

This rifle is intentionally distressed by production with grime and stains applied to appear well-used. It exhibits some cracks and exposed resin, flaking paint, and tarnishing to the aluminum. A light-up Armadillo cab model miniature from Michael Bay's Armageddon. After their shuttle Independence was damaged, A.J. (Ben Affleck), Andropov (Peter Stormare), and Bear (Michael Clarke Duncan) attempted to jump over a canyon in their Armadillo on the asteroid to reunite with the crew of Freedom.

This detailed model consists of a wood frame with an exterior fabricated from metal and resin. It is dressed with various decal transfers, metal pipes, and clear acrylic windows. # Otis "Bear" Curlenbear's (Michael Clarke Duncan) Screen-Matched Light-Up Spacesuit Costume Armageddon (1998)

Otis "Bear" Curlenbear's (Michael Clarke Duncan) screen-matched light-up spacesuit costume from Michael Bay's Armageddon. Distressing on the chest of this spacesuit screen-matches to when Bear, Lev Andropov (Peter Stormare), and A.J. Frost (Ben Affleck) traversed the asteroid to meet the other mission team.

Constructed primarily from large-weave nylon-blended fabrics with resin and metal components created for the production by Global Effects, this costume consists of a fiberglass and metal helmet labeled "Bear" with a wide acrylic visor screwed on at the sides and a hose for ventilation inset on the reverse; a metal and resin collar with a sealing ring labeled "Bear"; a front-and-back pull-over pack with resin, metal, and rubber adornments labeled "USA" and inset with canisters labeled "X-851"; a matching jacket labeled "Bear" with tubing stitched along the sleeves and a Freedom Shuttle patch embroidered on the left sleeve; matching pants labeled "Bear" which secured to the jacket via a zippered waist closure; a pair of gloves with rubber finger tips and milled aluminum locking rings, one of which is labeled "Bear"; a leatherette utility belt labeled "Bear" in two places with four metallic canisters set into its pouches; and modified leatherette-covered Vans boots with adornments matching those on the sleeves and legs.

Powered by an elaborate battery system, 12V battery-powered electronic components designed to illuminate multiple LED lights on helmet, chest, and backpack are concealed within those components. Demisting fans designed to supply the wearer with plenty of air and ventilation while performing on set are housed inside the pack.

The spacesuit is intentionally distressed by production with discoloration and grime applied to reflect its travels across the asteroid. It comes mounted to a custom mannequin for stability and display. Following production, sympathetic repairs were conducted on the electronics to restore their functionality. The costume exhibits one fractured canister splitting at the center, one missing canister at the back, crumbling and fracturing to the glove leather, tearing rubber and fiber around the wrists, fraying throughout the woven fabric, and fading labeling on the interior from wear.

# 21 Bob Falfa's (Harrison Ford) Screen-Matched 1955 Chevy License Plate American Graffiti (1973)

Bob Falfa's (Harrison Ford) screen-matched 1955 Chevy license plate from George Lucas' American Graffiti. Local drag racer Falfa drove his custom 1955 Chevy in the races against John Milner (Paul Le Mat) that culminated with a fateful crash. Dark aging to this plate screen-matches it to shots of the rear of the Chevy being driven by Falfa


Often considered Lucas' first mature feature, American Graffiti was also the first film produced under the director's Lucasfilm production banner. Though produced for only \$777,000, the film went on to receive five Academy Award® nominations, including one for Best Picture, and is now among the most profitable films in world history. In 1995, the Library of Congress selected it for preservation in its National Film Registry.


At the time of his casting, Harrison Ford was focusing on a carpentry career and had thus far only appeared in small roles. Ford's performance as Falfa resonated with audiences and jump-started his career, and it was through working together on American Graffiti that Lucas got to know Ford, soon calling upon him to help with line readings during auditions for Star Wars, which itself led to Lucas casting Ford in his iconic role as Han Solo.

This license plate - a key component of the car so closely associated with Ford's star-making role - was originally obtained by Sam Crawford, who purchased Falfa's 1955 Chevy directly from the studio after American Graffiti was released. Crawford sold the vehicle in the late 1970s, but kept the original prop license plate.

This dark yellow cardboard license plate numbered "GLD 204" features printed black lettering, a 1962 registration tag numbered "91486789," and "FALFA" handwritten on its reverse in black marker. It is screwed into an upside-down frame with chrome-color tape added to obscure the detail on the lettering. 

# Screen-Matched Batman's (Michael Keaton) Batwing 6-Foot Motorized Filming Model **Batman (1989)**

The screen-matched 6-foot motorized filming model of Batman's (Michael Keaton) Batwing from Tim Burton's Batman. This highly detailed model features practical lighting and functional motorized components used for specific shots in the film, such as the Gatling gun and balloon clippers. It was the only model built at this size and was used for the Batwing's close-up shots, matching both film shots and production photos. The model was built large-size, with a wingspan of just over 6 feet, to withstand scrutiny when seen in close-up. After filming, the model was given an inaccurate repaint. It has since been updated with a revised, highly-accurate paint scheme based on all available archival reference photos, and all of the mechanical and electronic elements have been restored. Batman's visual effects were overseen by Derek Meddings of the Meddings Magic Camera Company, a U.K. effects legend, who specifically oversaw this model's filming.

This model is primarily cast fiberglass with an internal metal armature that includes a structural mounting bar at the craft's rear. It features a detailed cockpit interior and a miniature Batman figure with an acrylic cockpit cover. It is also outfitted with numerous practical elements that were utilized in filming, including rotation of the Batman figure's head; nose-mounted clippers with extend/retract and close/open capability, and associated saw-blade, featured in the memorable shots where the Batwing steals the Joker's balloons; Gatling gun with deploy/retract and spin capability; deployable missiles; steering flap with open/close functionality; running lights; and strobes in the nose cannon and near the Gatling gun. The mechanisms were originally pneumatic, and there is an opening cut into the back of the body where the hoses and electrical wires exit the body, as the cutout and mounting bar were always framed out of the shot during filming.

The 6-foot model is one of several Batwings built for the film: a 2-foot model was created for wider shots where the craft moves significantly in the frame, and an even smaller model was used for the shot of the Batwing in front of the moon. An insert cockpit was also built for filming performer Michael Keaton. The 6-foot version is the one most prominently featured in the film and is seen in the Batwing's close-ups. Production blueprints and canon sources place the inuniverse width of the Batwing at between 27' or a bit over, meaning the model is approx. 1/4 or 1/5 scale. The Batman figure in the 6-foot model was made slightly undersized to this scale, making the craft feel larger in the close-ups.

Like the 1989 Batmobile, the design of the Batwing is considered one of the most successful in any Batman film. It is credited to director Tim Burton, production designer Anton Furst, and concept artist Julian Caldow. Caldow did several concept illustrations of the Batwing and Batmobile based on instruction from Furst. Caldow's concept illustrations for both of these now-legendary vehicles are well-known, having been published on lobby cards, magazines, books, and trading cards. Formal blueprints were drawn up from the concepts, and the construction of the 6-foot model began at Model Effects Ltd, headed by Peter Aston. Model makers Brian Cole and Garry Hood began the build, before expert technician Greg Morgan took over and completed most of the work. Jose Granell sculpted the Batman figure in the cockpit separately. In addition to the build, Morgan was on stand-by with the model through the shooting at Shepperton Studios, alongside Derek Meddings himself. Meddings and Morgan did the final weathering, and Letraset did the detailing work at Shepperton just before the model was filmed.

After a prior, lesser-quality attempt to update the model's paintwork, a high-quality restoration was performed more recently to restore the model as closely as possible to its original filming appearance. It was repainted with graphite metallics and weathered down to match the original finish based on all existing photo references. During the repaint process, original stencil markings

were uncovered below layers of paint, traced, and recreated precisely. Some remain original as they were never repainted, such as the cannon and dashboard markings. The Batman figure was also repainted, and a replica cape was created, the original having been lost. The mechanical components that were originally pneumatic were updated to run on linear actuators and servos, meaning the functionality could be demonstrated without compressed air. The mechanisms themselves remain original. Running lights were updated to LEDs, and modern strobes replaced the original damaged ones. A new control box was fabricated to drive the mechanical functions. The upper fin on the Gatling-gun side had been lost to time and was patterned off the remaining fin and recreated. The cockpit's side rails were also recreated. All other detailing, including the cockpit itself, remains original.

The Batwing sequence was frequently cited as an audience favorite when Batman was released. The memorable shot of the Batwing in front of the moon was used for the film's soundtrack album cover, and the Batwing found its way onto all forms of consumer products. The craft is known to film fans worldwide, and its success as a design mirrors the wider success experienced by the film both in 1989 and beyond. Batman's blockbuster success is regularly cited as being the best of all Batman films. It was the fastest film to ever gross \$100 million and ignited a wave of "Batmania". The film won an Academy Award for Art Direction, amongst numerous other awards and nominations.

The 6-foot Batwing model is presented on a custom-fabricated display stand to support its substantial frame, with adjustments possible for display height, rotation, and tilt angle. It is the only 6-foot Batwing built for the film and matches shots in the film as well as production photos. The model is in excellent restored condition and is one of the most significant Batman-franchise artifacts we have offered at auction. 

# Jon Peters' Personal Travel-Size Production Binder **Batman (1989)**

Producer Jon Peters' personal leather binder from the production of Tim Burton's Batman. This binder of production documents was made smaller so that Peters could keep it with him easily during filming in London.

It consists of a two-sectioned black leather Lefax binder featuring: a page of International Direct Dialing Codes; 24 blank lined pages; a 20-page Unit List dated November 19, 1988; 10 pages of a cast list dated November 7, 1988; a 42-page Main Unit one line schedule on pink paper; and a 113-page fifth draft script printed on various colored paper dated October 6, 1988. This leather bind features sixrings, a pen holder for two pens, and extends with metal clasps between the two sections. 

The blood staining and hole placement screen-match to when Bonnie is shot while crossing the creek.

Rick Deckard's (Harrison Ford) photo-matched shirt from Ridley Scott's Blade Runner. Deckard wore his light-green and salmon-color shirt while tracking, confronting, and "retiring" Zhora (Joanna Cassidy), changing out of it after Rachael (Sean Young) saved him from Leon Kowalski (Brion James). Blade Runner had a unique visual aesthetic, with costumes designed by Charles Knode and Michael Kaplan. The designers sometimes referred to the aesthetic as "Mexican deco."

The placement of the patterned fabric, specifically on the collar and chest of this red and green cotton-blend shirt, matches publicity photos from the promotion of the film. It features two front pockets, shiny red plastic buttons, and strips of patterned fabric sewn onto the collar, chest, back, shoulders, and arms. The buttons are original. Also included is a vintage paper identification tag reading "Harrison Ford Blade Runner 1981 Michael Kaplan."

The costumes from Blade Runner were sold off after production, and this piece has been in the same collection since the 1980s. Deckard pieces from the film are exceedingly rare, with one of his costumes sold by Propstore for over \$250,000 in 2023. The shirt exhibits fading, small stains, green paint spatter on the right sleeve, and missing buttons on the collar and left cuff from production wear and age.

A matte painting of replicant Roy Batty (Rutger Hauer) jumping over to a rooftop hand-painted by matte artist Matthew Yuricich for Ridley Scott's Blade Runner. Batty effortlessly leapt over to the rooftop where Rick Deckard (Harrison Ford) was hanging off a girder in moments just before his unforgettable "Tears in rain" monologue.

The sequence – one of the most recognized in all of 1980s cinema – was accomplished by compositing live-action photography with a matte painting Yuricich created with his brother Richard Yuricich and Douglas Trumbull's Entertainment Effects Group (EEG), setting the film's compositing effects apart from the chroma key compositing that had become prevalent in other films by that time.

Yuricich - the recipient of a Special Academy Award® for his groundbreaking effects work on Logan's Run - was assisted by Rocco Gioffre and Michele Moen to create around 15 matte paintings for the film, which was nominated for an Academy Award® for its revolutionary visual effects work. Gioffre and Moen went on to become acclaimed matte painters in their own rights, cementing Yuricich's legacy as both artist and mentor.

This painting is rendered in mixed media, including acrylic paints on a large masonite board marked "FX 96B." Strips of white tape in read "Blade Runner" and "FX 96B," "V=50," "H=50," and an additional bit of tape marked "BR" is adhered in the top right. The artwork is finished in mainly green and brown tones, chosen specifically based on how the color and contrast would be picked up by the film stock selected by Douglas Trumbull and Yuricich's brother Richard to photograph and composite the mattes. # MATTHEW YURICICH MATTE PAINTING RETROSPECTIVE

Matthew Yuricich, better known (and appropriately so, given his life's work) as Matt, was an American artist regarded as one of - if not the - foremost matte painters in the history of world cinema.

Born in Ohio to Croatian immigrants on January 19, 1923, Yuricich studied Fine Arts at Miami University after serving in the US Navy during World War II. Upon the completion of his education, he sought and found work in the effects departments of Hollywood studios, excelling quickly as a painter on the productions of post-war classics like Ethel Merman's *Call Me Madam*, Fred M. Wilcox's *Forbidden Planet*, and Stanley Donen's *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers*.

Soon, Yuricich developed a specialty in color-matching background paintings to color-shifting film stock, an essential skill required to integrate mattes seamlessly into live-action photography. At the time, matte artists were expected to keep their artistry "invisible" to the naked eye in order to help audiences suspend their disbelier at certain images that were otherwise impossible to achieve. Yuricich's technical precision in executing invisible glass matte shots - in which painted plates of glass set in front of the camera simulated extensions to a set or environment - put him in demand with some of the most successful directors of his time.

In 1959, Yuricich worked as a matte artist on two films that would permanently secure his place in the pantheon. For Alfred Hitchcock's North by Northwest, he created the illusion of a modernist Frank Lloyd Wright-style home built atop Mount Rushmore for the film's rip-roaring climax. Then in William Wyler's equally seminal Ben-Hur, he painted mattes simulating the presence of tens of thousands of ancient audience members in the unrivaled chase scenes. Both films were immediately hailed as visual masterpieces for their groundbreaking photographic effects, securing Yuricich 30 more years of work as well as unparalleled renown amongst several generations of Golden Age filmmakers.

Over the next three decades, Yuricich contributed matte paintings to many of the most renowned movies ever made, among them Mutiny on the Bounty, The Greatest Story Ever Told, The Poseidon Adventure, Westworld, The Towering Inferno, Young Frankenstein, Ghostbusters, Die Hard, Dances with Wolves, and Field of Dreams. Recognition for effects artists was always slow-in-coming from film studios and it was not until 1976 that his contributions to cinema were formally acknowledged. The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences awarded Yuricich (along with L.B. Abbott and Glen Robinson) a Special Achievement Award for his work on Logan's Run. The following year, Yuricich – along with his brother Richard and a team of other effects visionaries including Douglas Trumbull – received a competitive nomination for Best Visual Effects for Steven Spielberg's Close Encounters of the Third Kind.

Yuricich also emerged in this period as a committed teacher and advocate for the field of matte painting at large, which was soon to be threatened by the advent of computer-generated effects. As the chief matte artist for companies including Entertainment Effects Group (EEG), its follow-up Boss Film Corporation, and Video Image throughout the 1980s and 90s, he took on a series of studio apprentices who learned to emulate both his notorious early-to-rise work ethic and impeccable artistic form. Several of these apprentices went on to create film art nearly as acclaimed as his own, with a raft of awards and blockbuster hits earned by work inspired by their mentor.

In 2006, Miami University bequeathed Yuricich with its Distinguished Achievement Award for his accomplishments as an educator and artist in the visual effects realm He died six years later leaving a legacy that included effects contributions to over 70 film and television titles. And in 2017, he was posthumously inducted into the Visual Effects Society's Hall of Fame, where his legacy as both artist and advocate continues to be preserved into perpetuity.

Propstore is pleased to present these never-before-offered mattes from some of Yuricich's most beloved films. From Logan's Run to Blade Runner to Ghostbusters to Star Trek: The Motion Picture, this selection of extraordinary hand-painted artworks offers veteran collectors and casual movie fans alike unique access to one of cinema's great masters. The matte paintings offered speak to the rich history of cinema and the grand tradition of innovation that was necessary to bring so many of the world's favorite stories to life.

The physical matte shot is now a lost art that will never return again; all matte shots for modern filmmaking are accomplished digitally. Matte paintings were always simply a step in the process on the way to capturing a VFX shot in celluloid, rather than an end-product in themselves, but these hand-painted original artworks existed as evidence of how the shot was achieved. That is no longer the case—the matte shots of today, like nearly all visual effects shots, do not exist in any physical form. It is most likely that no new matte paintings will ever be created again, and the paintings from yesteryear that still exist are exceedingly rare.

Indeed, these offered works are among the scarce few original paintings still known to exist from Yuricich's career. The paintings are some of the last of their kind and in the years ahead will be the sole link to this great lost art form. Aside from their aesthetic qualities and inherent beauty, seeing them in person offers a rare peek behind the magician's curtain and insight into a once-prevalent art form that is now extinct and will not return again. These paintings are a moment in time — a tribute not only to the eternal magnificence of this captivating form, but to the Silver Screen on a global scale.

Hand-Painted Matthew Yuricich Dana Barrett's (Sigourney Weaver) Apartment Building Matte Painting **Ghostbusters (1984)** 

A matte painting of Dana Barrett's (Sigourney Weaver) apartment building hand-painted by chief matte painter Matthew Yuricich for Ivan Reitman's Ghostbusters. Gozer (Slavitza Jovan) took the form of a gigantic Stay Puft Marshmallow Man and wreaked havoc on New York City before the Ghostbusters destroyed him.

One street-level shot of the building on 550 Central Park West as crowds fled was achieved by optically blending a live-action plate with Yuricich's final "invisible" matte painting, so-called for its use in trick photography. Yuricich - the recipient of a Special Academy Award® for his groundbreaking effects work on Logan's Run - created more than two dozen matte-painted shots for the film with the assistance of Michele Moen and Disney veteran Deno Ganakes under Richard Edlund's BOSS Film Studios. The film's visual effects were ultimately nominated for an Academy Award®.



A matte painting of the Lincoln Memorial hand-painted by matte painter Matthew Yuricich for Michael Anderson's Logan's Run. In the post-apocalyptic 23rd century, Logan 5 (Michael York) and Jessica 6 (Jenny Agutter) stumbled upon nature-reclaimed ruins of the Lincoln Memorial and marveled at the statue's old face, having never seen someone of advanced age before.

To achieve the shot of the memorial in a state of vine-covered decay, Yuricich painted over an enlarged photograph applied to masonite with shellac, a technique he had been introduced to decades earlier using black-and-white prints of photographs as a matte artist at 20th Century Fox and Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer. Yuricich received a special Academy Award® for his groundbreaking visual effects work, earning him a reputation amongst science-fiction fans and cinephiles alike as a master film artist.

The painting is rendered in mixed media on masonite, with a piece of tape labeled "104," and depicts the interior of the Lincoln Memorial, with the seated statue and columns covered in twisting green vines. However, this being a color print per the directives of special effects visual designer L.B. "Bill" Abbott, the color ink seeped through into Yuricich's paint and affected the color, leaving the painting with a pink hue.

The color photograph beneath this matte still exhibits an uncorrected red dye. The matte comes mounted in a black wooden frame and features mounting holes along the edges. 




Rendered in mixed media by Yuricich, it depicts the base of a Mayan pyramid with rows of Mayans standing at attention with a pathway created to the bottom of the steps. Additionally, it shows trees and clouds in the background done in an impressionistic style to give them a spontaneous and natural appearance rather than something overly stylized or unrealistic looking.

Rendered in mixed media on layout board, it depicts an otherworldly orange landscape with distant cliffs in the background and statues and crystals in the foreground. Long shots of the Castle were achieved by fusing Yuricich's detailed matte paintings with live-action photography.

Young Frankenstein was nominated for two Academy Awards®: Best Adapted Screenplay and Best Sound. In 2003, it was deemed "culturally, historically or aesthetically significant" by the United States National Film Preservation Board, and selected for preservation in the Library of Congress National Film Registry.



Elwood Blues' (Dan Aykroyd) costume from Aykroyd and Belushi's musical comedy franchise The Blues Brothers. Elwood and his brother Jake (Belushi) wore their signature black suits in concerts, in appearances on Saturday Night Live, and in the theatrically-released feature film directed by John Landis. It is believed that this particular suit is likely from the concerts in which Aykroyd, Belushi, and the band performed music in character.

Most of the content for that auction was donated directly by John's widow Judy Belushi, with a few items donated by John's friends. The auction was hosted in Chicago by Leslie Hindman Auctioneers to raise money for the John Belushi Memorial Foundation, which Judy founded to disperse money to a number of different charities, including the John Belushi Scholarship Fund, which helped fund the aspirations of young comedians and actors through Chicago's Second City, where Belushi began his career. The auction included three pairs of Blues Brothers suits, each with a Jake and Elwood suit. It is believed that Aykroyd donated items directly to the auction, as there were lots related to Ghostbusters 2 which was recently released at the time of the auction.

## **76**Yul Brynner's Cowboy Boots and Holster **Yul Brynner**

Yul Brynner's personal cowboy boots and holster from the actor's collection. An Academy Award®-winning actor and legendary leading man from the Golden Age of Cinema, Brynner - the recipient of a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame - portrayed gunslingers and cowboys throughout his career in classics such as John Sturges' The Magnificent Seven, Sam Wanamaker's Catlow, and Richard Wilson's Invitation to a Gunfighter. In September 1996, Paris-based auction house Tajan auctioned off film memorabilia and personal ephemera from Brynner's Criqueboeuf Manor in Normandy, France. These boots and holster originated from that sale, where they were attributed to The Magnificent Seven. However, key differences in the boots from those Brynner wore in promotional photographs as Chris Larabee Adams, the moral anchor for the seven men defending a poor Mexican village - such as square toes in Adams' boots - suggest that these are more likely from the actor's personal collection.

Both of these black leather Tony Lama cowboy boots are marked "A," while the black leather Red Wing Holsters gun holster features a solid lining and a black leather cord. The holster exhibits minor scuffing to its exterior and worn leather on the cord.

## 77 Draconian Marauder Model Miniature Buck Rogers In The 25th Century (1979–1981)

A Draconian Marauder model miniature based on the models from Glen A. Larson and Leslie Stevens' Buck Rogers in the 25th Century. In the classic series, the Draconian Empire deployed vicious Marauders, also known as Hatchet or Pirate fighters, to force Earth into a trade agreement, and later simply in battle against the Earth Defense Directorate throughout the series. While the filming model used in the series was constructed by Universal Hartland, the in-house effects studio at Universal Studios Hollywood from the late 1970s to the early 1980s, this less detailed spacecraft is believed to have been built by Magic Lantern for the Universal Studios Tour Special Effects Stage at Universal Studios Hollywood. In the mid-1980s, the tour included a showcase of space effects used in Buck Rogers.

This marauder originated from the collection of noted science-fiction archivist Fuller French. It is cast from resin around an internal steel rod. The ship's right wing nacelle is resin, like the main body of the model, while the left wing nacelle is carved from wood. The Marauder is handpainted brown with black twin nacelles and two Draconian insignia printed on opposite wings. The model miniature features detailed design ridges and crests, as well as multiple threaded mounting points, including a hole on the underside for inserting an additional puppeteering rod. Also included is a custom metal display stand. In addition to paint flaking and scuffing from production use, the resin exhibits fractures in several places, most notably between the body of the craft and its nacelles, where adhesive residue is also visible. Nicky Santoro's (Joe Pesci) SFX retractable ballpoint pen from Martin Scorsese's Casino. After a gambler (Joey De Pinto) told Sam "Ace" Rothstein (Robert De Niro) to stick his pen up his ass, Nicky brutally stabbed him with it.

Joe Pesci was nominated for Best Villain at the MTV Movie Awards while the film won a total of four awards including a 20/20 Award to Thelma Schoonmaker for Best Film Editing, a Golden Globe Award to Sharon Stone for Best Actress in a Motion Picture Drama, and two Nastro d'Argento or "Silver Ribbons" to Dante Ferretti for Best Production Design and Gigi Proietti for Best Male Dubbing for De Niro.

This faux gold- and silver-plated metal pen is designed and branded by production to resemble a real-world Montblanc Meisterstuck ballpoint. The writing end of the pen is designed to retract when applied with pressure for special effects inserts of Santoro stabbing it into his victim. 

A Good Guys factory doll with screen-matched Chucky (Brad Dourif) dungarees from John Lafia's Child's Play 2. To recover from the bad press around Chucky, the Play Pals Corporation rebuilt a Good Guys doll from the evil doll's remains, allowing Chucky to resume his hunt for Andy Barclay (Alex Vincent) after a fateful power surge. This doll is assembled from a number of original production components, as well as some replica elements. Its head skin, hands, and body are from the factory scenes, which featured an assembly line of Good Guy doll parts. These components have discolored with age and were recently repainted in the style of the principal character, Chucky.

The dungarees on this doll screen-match to those seen on a Chucky doll in the factory scene after Chucky was re-assembled, as well as to when Mattson (Greg Germann) placed him in the back of his car. The striped sweatshirt is believed to be a production original, though it is unknown if it was a Chucky character piece, specifically. The shoes are also production originals. The eyes are replicas added for display. This doll has been in its current state for many years and its origins trace to Universal Studios, who used dolls of this style to promote the film. However, it cannot be confirmed whether it was in its current, assembled state during filming (though assembled dolls do appear in the manufacturing scenes), or if it was assembled from components after production. Likewise, it cannot be confirmed whether the body, wig, and underskull are original to the production; if they are, they, too, would be from the assembly line scenes.

This doll features a dense urethane head, hands, and shoes with a clothcovered, soft foam body. It comes dressed in original custom-made clothing, including a colorful, striped long-sleeve knit top; matching knit pant hems; toy print pattern dungarees labeled "Good Guys" on the top front pocket; white socks; and red-and-white rubber Good Guys-branded sneakers with braided "Good Guys" laces. The shirt and dungarees have self-adhesive strip closures on the back to allow easy access to the doll's body, while the head is slit down the length of its reverse. The doll's hands and face were repainted to correct discoloration to the urethane and fitted with star-patterned blue acrylic eye replicas modeled on the production originals to complete the lot for display. Additionally, a custom stand was fabricated to support the doll in an upright position. As the non-wardrobe elements are pieces from the factory scenes and not hero Chucky components, the doll is static with no animatronic or mechanical elements. A Tiffany (Jennifer Tilly) animatronic puppet with a screen-matched costume from Don Mancini's Seed of Chucky. Six years after the original dolls were destroyed, Glen (Billy Boyd) resurrected new animatronic dolls built from the remains of Chucky (Brad Dourif) and Tiffany (Jennifer Tilly) for Jennifer Tilly's (as herself) new horror movie "Chucky Goes Psycho." Distinctive patterning on this doll's dress screen-matches to when Chucky and Tiffany planned to impregnate Tilly while in her attic.

Originating from special effects designer and puppeteer Tony Gardner, this puppet was originally created for Seed of Chucky, then later reused for Cult of Chucky. It features a predominantly silicone head, arms, and legs with a hollow soft-foam body cast around a metal armature and rubber tubing. Animatronic mechanics inside the arms have since been replaced with metal rods to hold their shape.

This puppet features a glued-on ash-blond balayage synthetic wig with pins holding it in place; hand-painted makeup and tattoo; hand-glued eyelashes; ornately hand-painted acrylic eyes; and a full set of acrylic teeth. Following production on Seed, the paintwork on the puppet's face and chest, including its upper lip mole and breast plate tattoo, were altered to the style seen in Cult.

This puppet comes dressed in custom-made clothing, including a velvet choker with faux gem; a black pleather jacket, a polyester wedding dress; nylon fishnet pantyhose, and a pair of rubber boots. The back of the jacket and wedding dress have self-adhesive strip closures to allow for easy access to the puppet's mechanics. This puppet comes mounted to a custom metal stand. Both the front pocket on the dungarees and bottom of the shoes display the doll's brand name, "Good Guys." Production intentionally distressed the clothing to appear bloodied and torn. This doll comes mounted to a metal display and posed on his knees with his arms raised beside his head. Chucky (Brad Dourif) doll skin from the production of Don Mancini's Curse of Chucky with a replica display. In the film, Nica Pierce (Fiona Dourif) and her mother, Sarah (Chantal Quesnelle), received a Good Guy doll in the mail from an unknown sender that was eventually revealed to be Chucky with silicone skin covering his scars.

After production, long-time franchise effects studio Alterian, Inc. created Chucky dolls based on the puppets seen in the film (though differing slightly, such as in the shape of their heads) for display throughout the film's promotional tour, including a stop at its European Premiere at the Film4 FrightFest in London.

This lot consists of a silicone Chucky doll's skin painted in a peachy flesh-color with details such as freckles, lashes, and brows, and hand-punched synthetic red hair. 

A head from a Goofy walkaround character costume created for a Disney theme park, it is unknown which specific park as the heads are used interchangeably between parks, and it is believed to have been used in the 1990s or 2000s.

Walkaround characters have been a staple of Disney theme parks experience since the opening of Disneyland in Anaheim, California on July 17, 1955. The walkaround characters, representing popular characters from Disney films, television series, and cartoons, interact with fans throughout the parks, sign autographs, and pose for pictures. Original key costume pieces from walkaround characters are exceedingly rare.



Judges drove their high-tech Lawmaster motorcycles while chasing perpetrators in Mega-City One throughout the film, including those Judge Dredd (Karl Urban) and Cassandra Anderson (Olivia Thirlby) passed at the Grand Hall of Justice. Other embellishments include the memorable Justice eagle in brass resin on the front and sides.

## 111 Stunt Necronomicon Ex-Mortis Evil Dead II (1987)

A stunt Necronomicon Ex-Mortis from Sam Raimi's Evil Dead II. Archaeologist Raymond Knowby (John Peaks) discovered the ancient book known as the Necronomicon Ex-Mortis or "Book of the Dead" with his family, began to study it, and made recordings of reciting the passages, which unleashed the evil force of the Kandarian Demon.

Created by horror and science-fiction writer H.P. Lovecraft for the 1924 short story The Hound, the Necronomicon was featured in all three films of the original Evil Dead trilogy. According to Brian Rae, who made this stunt book in 1986 for the second film along with Tom Sullivan and extensively detailed its use in the accompanying Letter of Authenticity, this specific book was notably featured in the flashback scene in which Knowby first came upon the book in an ancient tomb, completely covered in dust and dirt from being untouched for centuries. This book still retains some of that original dust and fuller's earth it was covered in for that scene.

This Necronomicon also had cameos in Jason Goes to Hell: The Final Friday (1993) and Pumpkinhead II: Bloodwings (1994), with details in the distressing of the cover and ripped pages screen-matching this exact prop to close-ups in Jason Goes to Hell.

Evil Dead II, the higher-budget horror-comedy sequel to Raimi's cult classic horror film The Evil Dead, launched the careers of director Raimi and star Bruce Campbell, solidifying their status as horror legends. The sequel introduced a number of the franchise's most celebrated elements, including Ash Williams' (Campbell) stumpmounted chainsaw hand and a redesign of the Necronomicon that many fans consider to be its most memorable and iconic iteration. This stunt Necronomicon Ex-Mortis is believed to be the first Evil Dead II Necronomicon to ever be offered at auction.

This stunt book is composed of a slip latex cover cast and assembled by Sullivan and Rae from a mold made of an original sculpture by Sullivan, over a cardboard inner cover with a paper, white glue, and Celluclay binding. The cover's iconic face has two eyes, a small nose, and a gaping mouth. Painted in various shades of brown and black, it is filled with 18 pages of parchment-color copy paper that were distressed by production by soaking in tea, dipping them in lemon juice, drying them out, and burning them along the edges. The pages are first-generation photocopies of illustrations Sullivan created for the first film, as well as several new ones he made for the second film. These black-and-white photocopied pages identify this as one of only three or four stunt books made for the production in addition to two hand-painted versions.

Following production, the pages of this book underwent sympathetic restoration by a professional art conservator to stabilize them and prevent further brittleness. The restoration included consolidating areas of detached pages using cooked wheat starch and Japanese paper, reattaching lost corners with paper splints, inpainting areas of the Japanese paper using Winsor & Newton watercolors, and reattaching four pages along the binding edge using cooked white starch paste. In addition to the intentional distressing from production to make it appear old and covered in grime, this Necronomicon exhibits fragility in the binding, slip latex, and paper, and should be handled with care. Inconsistencies in the stitching of this costume screen-match to when Ava, having dispatched her creator, Nathan Bateman (Oscar Isaac), and trapped his employee, Caleb Smith (Domhnall Gleeson), raided old robot pieces from Nathan's cupboards and escaped into the outside world in the climactic finale sequence.

Often considered among the greatest films of the 2010s, Ex Machina received particular acclaim for Vikander's performance as the frighteningly, if artificially, intelligent Ava. Later, Archer-as-Troy (Cage) received another identical pair from Dietrich Hassler (Nick Cassavetes).

A Hawkman puppet from the production of Mike Hodges' Flash Gordon. Prince Vultan's (Brian Blessed) Hawkmen helped Flash Gordon (Sam J. Jones) capture Ajax and take on Ming the Merciless (Max von Sydow) throughout the film. The winged warriors were created with a combination of live-action performers and puppet miniatures.

This detailed, hand-painted Hawkman puppet was originally obtained from the Elstree Studios archives. It is constructed from dense rubber molded around an internal metal armature, dressed with a leatherette harness, and affixed on the back with two large wings painted gold-color. Also included are Hawkman rifle and dagger model miniatures also painted in the Hawkmen's signature gold-color and black, as well as a black-and-white production still of the Hawkmen puppets in flight.

Following production, the puppet was professionally sealed and stabilized to prevent further degradation, including the addition of acrylic supports to the wings. The rifle is also not original to the puppet. It exhibits fragility from age and handling with cracking rubber throughout its body, exposed metal on the feet and arms, a split through its helmet, and separation along the wings. General Klytus' (Peter Wyngarde) screen-matched face mask from Mike Hodges' Flash Gordon. Klytus wore his signature gold-color mask while serving the whims of Ming the Merciless' (Max von Sydow). Cracking around the mouth and right cheek, a blemish on the lower edge of the wearer's left eyebrow, and distinct diagonal scratches on each lower corner of the jaw step-down screen-match it to multiple shots throughout the film. Constructed from thin yellow fiberglass, this mask was fabricated with a separate jaw on a pivot that was able to move slightly with the performer's mouth. It exhibits several layers of gold-color finish, likely gold leafing, which was likely touched-up during production. The inset lower lip is a leather strip painted in the gold-color of the master, which also wraps through the mouth slit and is visible on the interior. Originally made in two pieces, the mask was modified after filming with the addition of a rough layer of black-painted resin plaster coating to the interior surface that fused it to a single piece, rendering it immobile and unwearable. The plaster has since broken away in a few areas, while the thin fiberglass layer of the original mask is clearly visible. There are also multiple fine cut-lines from a blade that run vertically and horizontally on the mask, such as a vertical cut on its chin. The cuts and plaster infill may indicate that this mask was molded again at some point during or after filming. Despite these modifications, the multiple screen-matching cracks and similar blemishes demonstrate that this is an original screen-matched mask. A shiny black poly-blend hood replica with a beaded trim on its hemline and an elastic band were later added to the mask to complete it for display. The mask exhibits cracking and chipped edges from production, as well as some paint chipping and a buildup of grime.

#### 124 Light-Up Laser Rifle Forbidden Planet (1956)

A light-up laser rifle from Fred M. Wilcox's Forbidden Planet. Commander John J. Adams' (Leslie Nielsen) men carried laser rifles as they descended upon planet Altair IV to investigate the supposed troubles inflicted on Dr. Edward Morbius (Walter Pidgeon).

Forbidden Planet was nominated for an Academy Award® for Best Effects and for Special Effects to A. Arnold Gillespie, Irving G. Ries, and Wesley C. Miller. Oft considered one of the greatest science-fiction films ever produced, it was selected for permanent preservation in the Library of Congress' National Film Registry in 2013.

This futuristic rifle is constructed primarily of metal with a dark gray rectangular handgrip and toggle, carved ridges on either side of the barrel, and a blue-coated muzzle. The grip is etched "6473 mom 8085" above the trigger. This rifle lights up when the toggle is pressed, illuminating the barrel in a yellow light.

Following production, the rifle underwent sympathetic restoration to original electronic components concealed on the interior, with its wiring replaced with modern-grade wiring to illuminate the barrel, as well as its barrel tip, which had gone missing since production was recreated based on the production originals. 
#### Friday The 13th Part VIII: Jason Takes Manhattan (1989)

Jason Voorhees' (Kane Hodder) screen-matched hockey mask from Rob Hedden's Friday the 13th Part VIII: Jason Takes Manhattan. Jason wore his infamous hockey mask throughout the film as he stalked and terrorized a class of high school graduates. This mask screen-matches to the climactic scene in which Voorhees chased Rennie Wickham (Jensen Daggett) and Sean Robertson (Scott Reeves) through the sewers of Manhattan.

Since its first appearance in Friday the 13th Part III, Voorhees' Detroit Red Wings hockey mask has become among the most recognizable costume pieces in horror history. This particular style of masks shares several characteristics, including a larger and rounder overall shape, with masks produced from the vacuum-formed molds used on Friday the 13th Part VI.

Manufactured by special effects supervisor Martin Becker, this acrylic mask originated from the collection of producer Randolph "Randy" Cheveldave, who took possession of it after Becker removed it from Hodder in his work trailer in New York's Times Square on the final day of principal photography. The mask is painted yellow with three red triangular emblems on the forehead and cheeks. It features three leather straps held together by a three-sided halter square brass buckle. This mask was intentionally distressed, which includes a grimy appearance and the ax crack in the forehead from Friday the 13th Part III. This mask exhibits discoloration and chipped paint, scuffing, and frayed fiber from the straps.





A production-made "drinking" Onionhead (Slimer) puppet from Ivan Reitman's Ghostbusters. Slimer, the gluttonous green ghost that haunted the Sedgewick Hotel, was the very first ghost that the Ghostbusters caught together.

Known as "Onionhead" during production, the fan-favorite ghost was later renamed Slimer. He quickly became a staple of the franchise, appearing in sequels, cartoons, comics, video games, and merchandise. This casting is believed to be the only original 1984 Slimer casting still in existence, and the only one to ever be auctioned.

This production-made foam latex casting, cast without eye or mouth details, was intended to be worn by a performer who would put their gloved arms through the arm holes in the puppet. It features an alternate face sculpt created for a shot where Slimer drank wine or champagne out of a bottle. The sequence was filmed, and behind-the-scenes photos of the drinking Slimer exist, but it was ultimately unseen in the final cut of the film. The drinking Slimer used the same body as the standard puppet with the alternate mouth sculpted and grafted on.

This Slimer puppet previously underwent sympathetic restoration, including the addition of a semi-rigid urethane sealer to preserve its shape and a repaint in inaccurate colors. More recently, to return Onionhead to his original 1984 look, the puppet underwent a more accurate, modern, and high-end restoration by special effects studio Arjen, L.L.C., known for doing the creature work on the latest Ghostbusters films, including recreating Slimer for Ghostbusters: Frozen Empire. Stay Puft Marshmallow Man's hat from Ivan Reitman's Ghostbusters. After the Ghostbusters failed to stop Gozer (Slavitza Jovan), the ancient god took the form of a giant Stay Puft Marshmallow Man and attacked New York City in the climactic finale.

With its fusion of science-fiction and comedy, Ghostbusters rocketed to become the second-highest-grossing film of 1984 and an instant classic in American cinema. Often singled out as the film's signature sequence, the battle against the Stay Puft Marshmallow Man was heralded for its groundbreaking and seamless integration of live-action photography, puppetry, and model miniatures. In 1985, Richard Edlund, John Bruno, Mark Vargo, and Chuck Gaspar were nominated for an Academy Award® for Best Visual Effects for their work on the film.

Created for a performer inside a Marshmallow Man costume, this full-size sailor-style hat is thought to be the only one ever to come to market. It is cast in foam latex and painted white. The hat features a thin flocked "Stay Puft" band, a flocked black top button, and a flocked red forked tassel pinned on via thin metal wire.

The foam latex exhibits deterioration from time in some areas near the hat's edges, though it remains largely supple in the center. The piece underwent sympathetic stabilization and restoration by special effects studio Arjen, L.L.C., who did creature effects work for Jason Reitman's Ghostbusters: Afterlife and Frozen Empire. This included mounting the piece to a 3D-printed display, attaching the deteriorating Stay Puft band to a foam backer, and sealing the exposed foam areas to help prevent further deterioration. The work was intended to preserve the piece in as original a state as possible, since it may be the only remaining original Stay Puft hat in existence. 

It is constructed from fiberglass applied with a metal powder finish to replicate the appearance of forged steel and features brown leather lace detailing on either side. The interior is lined with leatherette-covered foam for the wearer's comfort.

This helmet is intentionally distressed by production to appear well-used in the arena, with battle scars and pitting on the front and back. It comes mounted to a heavy marble base engraved "GladiatorMM" in gold-color paint made by armorer Simon Atherton around the time of film's production. Other helmets from the film on bases of the same style are on display at Ridley Scott's winery. The interior exhibits some staining from wear. Maximus Decimus Meridius' (Russell Crowe) Screen-Matched Cuirass Gladiator (2000)

Maximus Decimus Meridius' (Russell Crowe) screenmatched cuirass from Ridley Scott's Gladiator. Antonius Proximo (Oliver Reed) gave his cuirass to Maximus after encouraging the one-time general to "win the crowd" as a gladiator at the Colosseum. Production distressing on this cuirass screen-matches to the scene where Maximus inspected the cuirass Proximo tossed to him.

Costume designer Janty Yates stated that 12 sets of armor were created for Maximus, and that it was Crowe's idea to add silver-color embellishments to the cuirass breastplate. As Maximus won more gladiatorial contests throughout the film, further icons appeared on his breastplate. This is the first-scene version, from before any other icons were added. For her work on the film, Yates won the Academy Award® for Best Costume Design.

This dark brown leather cuirass consists of a breastplate, backplate, and two shoulder straps. The breastplate is shaped with abdominal and pectoral muscle outlines and affixed at the bottom with silver-color icons depicting two sejant griffins and a laurel wreath. The backplate features dual metal buckles on each side for cinching the plates together at the waist. The straps are tied to both plates via leather cord tied with metal brackets concealed on their undersides.

The cuirass exhibits intentional aging by production to appear well-worn in battle with discoloration and some cracking applied to the leather. It exhibits some grime from exposure and creasing to the leather piping along the breastplate from wear.

Armor Components Gladiator (2000)

A set of production-made General Maximus Decimus Meridius (Russell Crowe) armor components from Ridley Scott's Gladiator. Maximus wore his armored cuirass and helmet when he surveyed his troops and met with the Emperor (Richard Harris) following the battle of Germania. This version of the cuirass was made for production but was unfinished and ultimately not seen in the film.

This lot consists of one helmet, a cuirass with front and back piece, and a brown woven waffle-pattern tunic. Made of fiberglass, both the helmet and chest armor were painted to resemble bronze and feature silver-color embellishments of a wolf's head. The chest features two gryphons and swirling feather laurels. The sides of the helmet display moveable cheek guards and a brown synthetic-hair plume fin on the top. The cuirass features cord ties on the sides and leather tabs on the shoulders. This lot exhibits scuffing on the fiberglass; chipped and flaking paint; notable adhesive residue on the fin; discoloration on the tunic; and pulled threads.

Maximus wore his costume when he trained among Proximo's (Oliver Reed) men to be a gladiator in the Colosseum, where Emperor Commodus (Joaquin Phoenix) was later forced to let the former general live by the favor of the Colosseum spectators.

Maximus' training costume was designed by Janty Yates, who won the Academy Award® for Best Costume Design for her work. In a commemorative video for the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences in 2015, Yates explained that many multiples were needed for every Maximus costume to accurately reflect the sweat, grime, and blood that gladiators experienced in training and the ring.

This lot consists of a beige wool training tunic lined with linen, a specific addition Yanty's team made to Maximus' costumes, while his fellow gladiators' tunics were unlined; a brown leather training belt marked "48" XL MAX"; tan suede lace-up boots featuring brown leather detailing and padded soles with illegible markings; and a metal sword with a carved wooden handguard, grip, and pommel. The tunic is intentionally distressed throughout by production to appear well-worn and ragged, and exhibits a yellow stain on the front and discoloration on the belt. Gladiator won a total of five Academy Awards® with Russell Crowe winning for Best Actor, and Joaquin Phoenix being nominated for Best Supporting Actor. The film received numerous reviews with some commenting that Crowe's performance was impeccable due to his old-fashioned style of intensity.

This lot originated from Crowe's personal collection, sold in his 2018 Art of Divorce auction. This wooden sword features a sculpted grip and pommel. This mesh red fabric robe, a less detailed version lacking such features as the dragon emblem seen on the reverse in some shots, originated from a Butterfield & Butterfield auction. It features decorative Asiatic gold-color and purple lame detailing along the collar, sleeves, lapel, and hem as well as cotton-padded red interior lining and gold-color button loop closures on the collar and lower chest. The robe exhibits pilling along the hem, staining to some of the lame, and small tears in the mesh from production wear and handling.

### Data's Stunt Coat The Goonies (1985)

Data's stunt trench coat from Richard Donner's The Goonies. Data wore his coat in numerous scenes throughout the film as he and the Goonies searched for One-Eyed Willy's treasure.

This olive green, cotton-and-polyester blend double-breasted trench coat (size 34S) is emblazoned with 28 distinct patches. Each patch was selected from leftover costume materials from previous productions. For example, Data's "Artanis Productions" ("Sinatra" spelled backwards) is believed to come from the 1965 film None But the Brave, while an Apollo 18 patch was likely made for the 1985 miniseries Space. The coat is marked "stunt" and "#3" on the interior. It exhibits some signs of wear from age and intentional distressing, including tears and fraying to the edges of the bottom and sleeves, and staining in shades of red, black, and brown throughout the piece. The staining may have occurred after production.

Patty wore her smock dress during Frenchie's (Didi Conn) dream sequence "Beauty School Dropout" where the Teen Angel (Frankie Avalon) and his ensemble sang to Frenchie about her failures in beauty school.

Custom-made for the production, the garment is cut from a metallic silver-color fabric and consists of a dress with a layered piece adhered to the neckline. Silver-color sequins embellish the dress, and the neckpiece features a layer of transparent plastic material with a pearlescent sequin trim. The back of the dress features an opening with a hook-and-eye fastening at the top. A cream-color waistband is adhered to the interior and the name "Susan" has been written in black ink on the band. This smock dress exhibits a broken hook-and-eye fastener and discoloration stains along the collar.

#### Happy Gilmore (1996)

Happy Gilmore's (Adam Sandler) screen-matched Boston Bruins jersey from Dennis Dugan's Happy Gilmore. This jersey screen-matches to when Happy, an aspiring ice hockey player, wore it during his first golf tournament, where he demonstrated an aptitude for the sport that frightened reigning champion Shooter McGavin (Christopher McDonald)

Gilmore's iconic jersey was selected in reference to Sandler's real-life upbringing in Manchester, New Hampshire. As the film became a modern classic, Gilmore's costume proved so popular that the Bruins today sell so-called "Happy Gilmore jerseys" of the same style with the golf savant's name and number (18) printed on them. In 2023, Bruins forward David Pastrnak scored while wearing one such jersey during the Great Clips NHL Breakaway Challenge.

This blue cotton pullover V-neck jersey features yellow and white striping on the sleeves and hem, a yellow collar, two Bruins bear logos emblazoned on opposite arms, and a Bruins "B" logo emblazoned on the chest. The collar exhibits uneven stitch lines and fraying on the left side from production, while both sleeves exhibit loosening from wear.

George Weasley's (Oliver Phelps) Quidditch Cape
Harry Potter And The Prisoner Of Azkaban (2004)

George Weasley's (Oliver Phelps) quidditch cape from Alfonso Cuaron's adventure fantasy sequel Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban. George wore his Gryffindor colors during the rainy Quidditch match against Hufflepuff, and then later in the Hogwarts infirmary when visiting Harry Potter (Daniel Radcliffe) after his fall at the hands of a Dementor.

The cape is made of a synthetic waterproof material combining nylon and polyurethane laminate. Details, such as the Weasley name, George's jersey number, and the Gryffindor crest, are imprinted on the cape. It features drawstring fasteners for tightening and loosening adjustments at the collar that feed down through the front of the torso, as well as internal straps for securing the cape to the actor's body. The hood is closed by being sewn to itself with a single piece of thread.

The cape exhibits minor stains on its shoulders from production use.

Harry Potter's (Daniel Radcliffe) light-up wand from Alfonso Cuaron's Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban. Harry carried his trusty wand throughout the film, using it to cast a lighting charm that illuminated the wand's tip.

Harry first received his signature wand - an 11-inch-long holly wand containing the tail feather of Albus Dumbledore's phoenix, Fawkes - at Ollivander's Diagon Alley wand shop in Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone. Prior to filming, Cuaron offered the core cast updated wands to reflect the changing inner lives of their characters, with Radcliffe ultimately selecting this new style of wand for Potter. An extremely limited number of illuminating wands were then made from a master wand created by supervising modeler Pierre Bohanna.

Cast from resin around metal and hand-painted and finished to resemble natural wood, this wand features a gnarled grip with a battery-powered LED light inset in the tip designed to illuminate by twisting the removable bottom end of the grip. The wand exhibits chipped resin, particularly around the edges of the removable bottom, and a fragile battery casing that should be handled with care. Severus Snape's (Alan Rickman) wand from the Harry Potter film series. Rickman was nominated for and won a number of awards for his portrayal of the resentful and enigmatic professor, including a Saturn Award for Best Supporting Actor, and an MTV Movie Award for 'Favourite Harry Potter Character Portrayal." The Harry Potter film series is the fourth highest grossing film series of all time, and six of the eight film were nominated for a total of 12 Academy Awards.



Framed "Dumbledore's Army" parchment autographed by key cast members from David Yates' Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix. In the film, Harry Potter (Daniel Radcliffe), Ron Weasley (Rupert Grint), and Hermione Granger (Emma Watson) formed "Dumbledore's Army," a secret organization at Hogwarts designed to teach students defensive spells they may need in the fight against Voldemort (Ralph Fiennes). The founding members of the group signed their names on parchment.

This ornately detailed strip of brown parchment is one of only 20 created by the production based on the parchment seen in the final cut and given to the film's global retail partners. The parchment is labeled "Dumbledore's Army" at top with the character signatures of the organization's founders: Hermione Granger, Ron Weasley, Harry Potter, George Weasley, Fred Weasley, Ginny Weasley, Luna Lovegood, Neville Longbottom, and Cho Chang printed on the left side. Cast members Watson, Grint, Radcliffe, Oliver Phelps, James Phelps, Bonnie Wright, Evanna Lynch, Matthew Lewis, and Katie Leung have all hand-signed the page on the right side across from their respective character's names.

The parchment comes housed behind glass in a custom black frame with a white backing. The frame exhibits some scuffing to its finish.

Also included its original bespoke production road case, which includes a sticker identifying the piece as a stunt mask.

Following production, this mask underwent sympathetic restoration and repainting to damaged foam latex on its nose, cheeks, forehead, and lips. 

#### Independence Day (1996)

A screen-matched 48-inch (122 cm) Capt. Steven Hiller (Will Smith) and David Levinson (Jeff Goldblum) Area 51 alien Attacker spaceship model miniature from Roland Emmerich's Independence Day. Hiller and Levinson commandeered an alien Attacker the American government was conducting experiments on in Area 51 to destroy the alien Mothership. The highest-grossing film of 1996 and, at the time, the second-highest-grossing film ever made, Independence Day redefined the Hollywood blockbuster. It was nominated for two Academy Awards®, winning one for Best Visual Effects, including its groundbreaking use of model miniatures. Attacker models were constructed in two scales by production, with larger-scale, 48-inch models used in the crash sequence as well as on the Area 51 model miniature set. However, this is believed to be the only Attacker miniature with silver-color human repair panels on its biomechanical front mandibles built for the film. Detailing on its left pincer-like mandible and dome-like gun turret screen-match to the moment before Hiller and Levinson fired a nuclear warhead into the Mothership. In addition to its mandibles, the Attacker features an intricate, high-tech, multifaceted biomechanical chassis constructed from various media, including fiberglass, resin, and plastic, around an internal aluminum armature designed to be mounted from various angles. The panels on the chassis are secured together with magnets, facilitating access to the armature. A metal suspension point is affixed near the turret for puppeting or fixing in place for VFX inserts. The ship is painted in shades of metallic gray, green, and blue with bronze-color detailing, remnants of bluescreen paint on the turret and suspension point, and texturing elements applied throughout the exterior. In addition to flaking and cracked paint throughout, the miniature exhibits several fractures and glue residue around reattached wing components and along the chassis. ## 173 Indiana Jones' (Harrison Ford) Screen-and-Photo-Matched Fedora Also Worn by Stunt Performer Dean Ferrandini Indiana Jones And The Temple Of Doom (1984)

Indiana Jones' (Harrison Ford) screen-and-photo-matched fedora from Steven Spielberg's Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom. As iconic as the character himself, the hat worn by Indiana Jones is the definitive element of his unforgettable outfit. This fedora was made specifically for the second installment of the Indiana Jones series and matches film shots, production stills, and behind-the-scenes footage of Ford in the village set on location in Sri Lanka, in the mine cart chase shot at Elstree Studios, and in the river sequence shot in the U.S. The hat was also worn by the late stunt performer Dean Ferrandini, who worked on the raft sequences in the US. It comes from Ferrandini's personal collection and is offered to the collector's market for the first time. Included with the fedora are previously unpublished photos of veteran stuntman Ferrandini in costume as Indiana Jones as well as a letter of authenticity signed by Dean Ferrandini's wife Keefe Ferrandini.

Created by Herbert Johnson Hat Company in London, who also did the hats for Raiders of the Lost Ark, the fedora was a slight update on the original film's version. Costume designer Anthony Powell and assistant costume designer Joanna Johnston worked closely with Herbert Johnson on the update that incorporated a more tapered crown than the prior film.

The fedora is made of sable-colored rabbit felt and features a dark brown ribbon and a leather sweatband imprinted with the Herbert Johnson Hat Company name and address, as well as a tag marked size 7 1/4 (size 59 European.) The sweatband is notably stamped with the initials "I J" in gold, a feature applied specifically to the hats Herbert Johnson made for the three original installments of the Indiana Jones saga. It also features some makeup residue at the front of the sweatband. The style, placement, and size of the markings are all consistent with other known authentic examples of Temple of Doom fedoras.

The hat's satin liner was removed for comfort, while pieces of foam were inserted behind the sweatband at the front and back in order to make it fit more snugly on the wearer's head. Keeping the hats in place was an ongoing challenge throughout the filming of the Indiana Jones movies, and the on-set wardrobe crew utilized several methods to resolve it. Similar foam pads are present on another known example of an original Temple of Doom fedora. A unique feature of this specific hat is the bow on its ribbon, which became loose during filming and has been hand-stitched back into place. Evidence of the loose hand-stitching can be seen in the hat's interior.

The matching shots, photographs, and behind-the-scenes footage show that this hat was worn by Harrison Ford throughout production, including location filming in Sri Lanka, filming at Elstree Studios in the UK, and additional location photography in the U.S. The hat was also worn by American stuntman Dean Ferrandini, who worked on well over 100 films and shows during his career, and doubled Ford for US-shot sequences of Temple of Doom. Ferrandini primarily worked on scenes that featured Indy, Willie (Kate Capshaw), and Short Round (Ke Huy Quan) in the yellow raft on the snow-covered mountain, as well as in the river scene.

Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom received mixed reviews upon its original release but has grown into a beloved fan-favorite over the years. It was nominated for two Academy Awards® and four BAFTA Awards®, winning the award for Visual Effects in both. Amongst its other accolades, it is remembered for further cementing Harrison Ford's status as one of the biggest stars of the 1980s. Indiana Jones, as embodied by Ford, remains one of the all-time great cinema characters.

This fedora is in good condition, showing wear and evidence of use, along with aging. It exhibits minor loss to the rabbit felt on some areas of the hat's brim, though this does not detract from its presentation. This is one of the nicest examples of an original Indiana Jones fedora to come to public auction due to its direct provenance, signs of extensive use, and screen-matching to the film and production stills. 

#### Dean Raphael Ferrandini (1945 – 2023) Hollywood Stuntman

Legendary Hollywood stuntman Dean Raphael Ferrandini was among the most acclaimed performers in the history of the silver screen. Born in 1945, the San Rafael, CA native was a champion swimmer, bicyclist, and All-American athlete who competed in flat water canoeing at the 1972 Munich Olympics. Within five years, Ferrandini's innate athleticism was being put to use on film, first as a double for Patrick Duffy in the sci-fi series Man from Atlantis before moving to higher-intensity projects like Buck Rogers in the 25th Century and Smokey and the Bandit II. By 1979, Ferrandini was leading production stunt teams as a second unit director on films like A Nightmare on Elm Street 4: The Dream Master as well as doubling such established stars as James Brolin, Harvey Korman, and Christopher Plummer.

His career in Hollywood kicked into high-gear in 1984 when he was hired as a stuntman for Steven Spielberg's Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom, where he donned the titular archaeologist's signature brown fedora and leather jacket while performing on the film's California set. After earning plaudits for his death-defying work on the production, Ferrandini would go on to appear in some of the most acclaimed action films of his lifetime, including Beverly Hills Cop II, Buffy the Vampire Slayer, Unbreakable, and Spider-Man among many others.

A lifelong lover of nature and exercise, he spent his retirement years as a regular figure in Newhall, CA's Tapia Canyon just down the road from Propstore Los Angeles. Propstore is pleased to present one of the Indy fedoras worn by Ferrandini and photomatched to the production in honor of this true California icon.



A Sankara stone from Steven Spielberg's Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom. Indiana Jones (Harrison Ford) fought to return the five sacred Sankara stones to Mayapore before they fell into Mola Ram's (Amrish Puri) clutches. The film was nominated for two Academy Awards® and won the award for Best Visual Effects.

Two styles of stones were produced for the film: non-illuminating opaque versions for when the stones were at rest and semi-translucent illuminating versions for when the stones' magic would make them glow. This static, opaque, amber-color resin stone is textured to appear ancient with three white horizontal stripes carved into the bottom. Joseph Cooper's (Matthew McConaughey) screenmatched Endurance jumpseat from Christopher Nolan's Interstellar. Scratch marks on the right side of this jumpseat screen-match to when Cooper cried while watching his daughter Murph's (Jessica Chastain) birthday message to him in the command module of the Endurance.

The Endurance's interior set was designed by production designer Nathan Crowley and decorated by set decorator Gary Fettis, both of whom received Academy Award® nominations for their work. Following filming, production delivered this jumpseat to an airplane junkyard, where it was later recovered.

Created using a mix of NASA and commercial aircraft designs, this jumpseat features foam-padded head, back, and seat cushions covered with maroon vinyl, heavy-duty gray nylon cinching straps with metal buckles, and both communication and oxygen regulation panels with moveable knobs and buttons mounted to a metal frame. A wire speaker dangles from the comms panel, and a NASA-branded plaque engraved "Endurance" with serial, OME, and patent numbers screwed on above the headrest.

The seat is designed to be adjusted via elasticated cords clipped to the back, along which the paneling is hand-marked "79" and 5" by production to indicate its intended position in the command module. Internal wiring has been cut since production, rendering the panels nonfunctional. The jumpseat exhibits torn vinyl, lifting and missing foam, rusting metal elements, grime, and fractures around the base paneling from production, storage, and exposure. This yellow polyester zip-front jumpsuit hand-labeled "BARRY" on the interior features white rubber pipe trim along the pockets, zipper sleeves, and metal snap-button closures on its cinching belt and ankles. The jumpsuit exhibits minor discoloration and cracking material to the pipe trim.

This pale beige synthetic-blend jacket features a mandarin collar, a fastening strip front closure, subtle vertical striping, and piping along the collar and cuffs. Following production, it underwent sympathetic restoration to remove staining impacting the lining, shoulders, and collar, as well as to replace disintegrated bias piping on the collar, and repair seams along the shoulders, arms, back, and interior. The lining seams of the shoulders and collar were stay-stitched to avoid further tearing on the interior. The jacket nonetheless exhibits some wear to the fabric from production and age.

Bond chased Raoul Silva (Javier Bardem) through the London Underground and Whitehall after his escape from MI6, with Bond foiling Silva's assassination attempt on M (Judi Dench) at a Parliamentary inquiry. Skyfall is widely considered to be one of the best Bond films made and was nominated for five Academy Awards, the most ever for a Bond film.

Fashion designer and film director Tom Ford designed Bond's suits in four films, starting with Quantum of Solace (2008), and all of Bond's clothing was custommade for the film. The costume consists of a pinstripe suit jacket and matching pants; a light blue button-up shirt; and a tie. The jacket, pants, and shirt all feature interior labels that read either "Daniel Craig" or "D Craig," and "Tom Ford" labels, and the jacket features an embroidered label in the interior chest pocket which reads "Bond 23." The pant label has some handwritten size notes, believed to denote that they were lengthened specifically for the scenes when Bond is running down Whitehall. The shirt is a slightly different style from the one seen in the film but is an original tailored for Craig as Bond, possibly from another film.

A screen-matched Verrazzano Bridge chase SFX insert shot Yamaha MT-09 motorcycle rig from Lionsgate's blockbuster hit John Wick: Chapter 3 - Parabellum. Zero's men chased Wick on motorcycles over the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge on his way to The Continental. The sequence was accomplished with a combination of real MT-09 motorcycles and SFX rigs custom-made by production. This rig screen-matches to behind-the-scenes footage from the making of the bridge chase sequence.

Wick and Zero's men utilized hand-painted, cast-iron green screen SFX rigs such as this one, which were affixed to non-functional motorcycles then digitally removed in post-production. This black Yamaha MT-09 motorcycle is built largely from genuine components, with rubber hand-grips and wheels, glass lights, and leather upholstery. 




A decoy Tesseract from Joe Johnston's Captain America: The First Avenger. HYDRA leader Johann Schmidt (Hugo Weaving), later known as the Red Skull, found a decoy Tesseract - also known as the Cosmic Cube - in a destroyed viking ruin before locating the real tesseract in a mural of Yggdrasil.

The Tesseract possessed limitless power, making it the envy of Schmidt and Arnim Zola (Toby Jones) as well as characters such as Thanos (Josh Brolin), Loki (Tom Hiddleston), and Howard Stark (Dominic Cooper). This opaque cube was originally sold in Marvel's official Captain America: The First Avenger auction held in April 2014, though its Marvel Certificate of Authenticity is no longer present. 

The tricorn hat was one of the key components of Captain Jack's iconic costume, designed by Oscar® winner Penny Rose. Johnny Depp worked closely alongside Rose and chose a leather tricorn to ensure Sparrow's hat remained distinct from those worn by the other characters in the film series.

This tricorn hat is made from brown artificial leather with vinyl details, brown cord stitching on the sides to help maintain its shape, and added buoyancy in order to create the floating effect. The black interior features a rectangular patch where a tag was removed after production. The hat exhibits extensive distressing by production to appear well-worn and stained from years at sea.

#### 261 Metal Ape Army Rifle Planet Of The Apes (1968)

A metal ape army rifle from Franklin J. Schaffner's Planet of the Apes. Ape soldiers wielded their standard-issue rifles to maintain their dominance over Earth in the distant future.

Based on World War II-era M1 carbines, this rifle consists of a two-piece metal shell painted brown to appear wooden around real firearm mechanisms that have had a barrel detail welded onto the base gun and deactivated; a loose slide, trigger, and an ejectable magazine, all painted black; and a brown leather strap with metal buckles. This weapon also features a retractable metal bayonet with the slide located beneath the barrel. The shell and strap are intentionally distressed by production to appear battle-used with scratches and grime applied throughout. Griffin Bowen's (Kyle Catlett) screen-matched clown doll from Gil Kenan's horror remake Poltergeist. Griffin was terrorized throughout the film by an evil clown doll he found in a box. Intentional production distressing to the face and fingers of this doll photomatches to the popular poster promoting the film and to shots of the doll lying still in Griffin's room.

Designed in homage to the evil clown from Tobe Hooper's seminal 1982 original of the same name, this ornately detailed doll originated directly from production company Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer (MGM). It features a cast resin head, hands, and feet painted off-white with a sculpted, toothy rictus smile, red and black-painted shoes, sparkly blue acrylic inset eyes, and a red clown's nose mounted to the front by a twine string on a retractable pulley. The head and appendages are affixed to wood blocks and a soft polyfill and foam body dressed with a foam-padded and mesh-lined red yarn wig, a maroon-tasseled yellow stretch knit vest, and a tricolor linen and polyester blend jumpsuit.

The doll is intentionally distressed by production to appear well-worn with black grime applied, paint smudging on the face to appear damaged, and flaking paint on the fingers and legs. It exhibits some pilling to the wig, which has come loose from the head since production, as well as fraying threads on the sleeves. Dimensions: 33" x 10" x 7" (84 cm x 25.5 cm x 18 cm)

A Berserker Predator (Brian Steele) costume from Nimrod Antal's Predators. The Yautja Predator known as Berserker led the hunt against the humans using a variety of advanced weapons and gadgets, including the wrist-mounted communications unit that Berserker used to blow up a rival Predator's ship. His communication unit was seen in the open position and featured internal electronics during his final fight against Royce (Adrien Brody).

The Predator film franchise has spanned over 35 years and has expanded to include novels, comics, video games, as well as numerous crossovers with the Alien franchise. The Berserker Predator was notably larger than most Predators seen in previous films, making him a unique threat.


This costume consists of a foam latex bodysuit painted in a speckled pattern of black, red, white, and yellow; matching hands tipped with resin claws; a foam-latex headdress featuring an array of foam locs; and a helmet constructed from hard rubber, with an internal fiberglass layer, internal padding, clear lenses, and decorations resembling metal and bone secured via fastening strips to the scalp. Also decorating the suit are hard rubber chest, thigh, and shoulder armor secured with leather straps and several leather cloths; left and right bracers, the right featuring a resin blade and the left featuring an electronic communications unit; a neoprene and rubber collar; a slip-latex loincloth hiding a zipper; and a primarily-resin electronic plasmacaster, the creature's signature weapon. 

Vivian Ward's (Julia Roberts) pair of earrings from Garry Marshall's Pretty Woman. Ward wore her distinctive pearl earrings in multiple key scenes, including her shopping spree down Beverly Hills' Rodeo Drive, at lunch with fellow sex worker Kit De Luca (Laura San Giacomo), when she accused a ritzy store of making a "Big mistake" for snubbing her before her glow-up, and in the climactic sequence when Edward Lewis (Richard Gere) climbed the fire escape to save her.

With box office grosses exceeding \$460 million and the then-largest number of tickets ever sold for a romantic comedy, Pretty Woman was an instant classic in 1990, remaining today amongst the most successful films ever made. For her iconic role as Vivian Ward, Julia Roberts was nominated for an Oscar® for Best Actress, inspiring a cottage industry of follow-up movies and cementing her as the reigning doyenne of the genre.

This pair of earrings originates from the collection of Academy Award®-nominated costume designer Marilyn Vance, who designed all of Ward's costumes. Vance made three pairs of pearl earrings for Ward, who later stated that seven of her costumes were accessorized with the earrings during filming. For her work, Vance also received a BAFTA® nomination for Best Costume Design.

Each of these earrings features a single large synthetic pearl suspended from a thin 14-karat gold-plated link chain with a translucent bead stopper beneath a fish hook back. The gold-color and synthetic pearls exhibit some tarnishing from wear and handling.

# **267**Vivian Ward's (Julia Roberts) Back-Up Dress **Pretty Woman (1990)**

Vivian Ward's (Julia Roberts) back-up dress from Garry Marshall's Pretty Woman. After being hired for the week by the rich corporate businessman Edward Lewis (Richard Gere), free-spirited prostitute Vivian Ward was sent on a shopping spree to acquire conservative clothing for when she joined Edward at social events. Vivian wore her dress during a polo match where Edward's lawyer Philip Stuckey (Jason Alexander) accused Vivian of being a spy for a company Edward was trying to buy out.

This dress originates from the collection of Academy Award®-nominated costume designer Marilyn Vance, who created it as one of two back-ups in the event of damage or loss to the original. Roberts wore this dress during production, but it was ultimately unseen in the final cut.

The brown and white polka-dot, polyester-blend dress features a zipper backing. Included with this dress is a brown leather belt with a large buckle wrapped in the same material and secured to the dress with brown thread loops. This lot exhibits minor tape residue to the belt.

A full-size Sheriff of Nottingham (Alan Rickman) statue from Kevin Reynolds' Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves. A statue of the Sheriff rested in the halls of Nottingham Castle, ultimately leading to one being defaced to mock the Sheriff's cut cheek. Two statues were created by production with one designed to have its head knocked off during the climactic battering ram scene. This plaster statue with its head still attached comes mounted through the feet to a plaster-paneled wooden display base painted to appear like gray stone. Following production, a previous owner repainted this statue in a different color scheme from its original production appearance with such details as white-and-black eyes, a silver-color collar, and matching gauntlets. It has since been sympathetically repainted to return it to its original tan stone-color scheme and finished with a glossy varnish. The plaster is splitting and cracking from production use and handling, and the statue exhibits several nicks to its finish on the collar, chest, and tunic. ### 273 VX Canister with "Pearls" △ The Rock (1996)

A VX canister with "pearls" from Michael Bay's The Rock. Rogue Marines led by Brigadier General Frank Hummel (Ed Harris) stole canisters of poisonous VX gas, which Dr. Stanley Goodspeed (Nicholas Cage) and John Mason (Sean Connery) later extracted from missiles to render them inoperable.

A critical and box office sensation for director Bay, The Rock was the fourth-highest-grossing Englishlanguage film worldwide in 1996. It was nominated for an Academy Award® for Best Sound and was released as Spine #108 by the Criterion Collection, cementing it as a classic of modern American cinema.

This burnished steel canister originated with a crew member. It is inset with 50 glass "pearls" mounted via plastic pipe in rows of 10. Each row leads to false copper and rubber-covered wiring affixed to the underside of the canister's cap. The pearls contain the remnants of green aloe vera gel (believed to be original from production) with copper-colored wire running down their sides. The rows are designed to pull out along with the cap.

This canister has undergone partial sympathetic restoration, but three of the glass VX pearls, two on one strand and one on another strand, remain damaged with exposed sharp edges that should be handled carefully. Much of the gel exhibits leaking or evaporation from age, the wiring exhibits rusting and fraying, and the glass pearls remain in fragile condition. As a result, the lot should be handled gently. 

Moonpie's (John Beck) jacket from Norman Jewison's Rollerball. Moonpie and his Houston Rollerball teammates wore their signature jackets when not wearing the protective gear worn in the Rollerball arena.

This cream-color polyester jacket was originally an offthe-shelf piece that was adapted by costume designer Julie Harris for the film. It features a zippered front with a single button at the bottom and each cuff, a pocket on each side, and two orange stripes on the left collar. # 278 Dynamo's (Erland van Lidth) Stalker Car The Running Man (1987)

Dynamo's (Erland Van Lidth) stalker car from Paul Michael Glaser's The Running Man. Stalker Dynamo used his car to hunt down and kill runners on a futuristic game show until Captain Benjamin Stuart "Ben" Richards (Arnold Schwarzenegger) forced the car to crash, trapping Dynamo.

This custom-built, futuristic four-wheeled vehicle features an open metal cockpit with metal roll bars at center, vented and riveted metal paneling on the front, back, and sides, and a metal crest on the top. Beneath the crest is a panel of electronics such as circuit boards, computer chips, and false wiring, and beneath that an all-metal undercarriage with spikes protruding from the front wrapped with a chain. Additional fearsome spikes on either side of two fans designed to rotate over the truck protrude above the back two tires.

The cockpit contains a leather-wrapped wheel with a matching vinyl-covered foam seat, a gear shift toggle, and a dashboard featuring an amp meter, odometer, and various switches hand-marked "Up," "D D," and "U2D." Also present is a control panel labeled "DISPLAY LIGHTS-DYN 2-OIL-GEN" and various wires taped to sidebars in the doors.

Following production, the front panels were disconnected from their electronics, rendering the car entirely nonfunctional. This vehicle contains no engine, no windows, no side lights, and no floor in the trunk area. Its interior sides are unfinished, its right rear tire is flat, its front headlights are smashed, and every metal component exhibits some degree of rust from exposure and age. Other metal components, such as the cockpit support bars and dashboard elements, are broken or bent, while the cockpit seat is split down the middle and exhibits sticky residue. ### Saturday Night Fever (1977)

Anthony "Tony" Manero's (John Travolta) screen-matched leather jacket from John Badham's Saturday Night Fever. Manero wore his jacket throughout the film, including the iconic opening sequence of him walking on the New York streets, outside the dance studio, when he met Stephanie (Karen Lynn Gorney), and when he brawled with his friends at the Barracudas' hangout. This jacket screen-matches to the opening walking sequence due to the unique creasing on the back of the jacket.

Regarded as one of the best films of 1977, the National Board of Review of Motion Pictures selected it as one of the Top 10 films of that year, and the film's soundtrack won a Grammy for Album of the Year in 1979. In 2010, the film was added to the United States National Film Registry by the Library of Congress for being culturally significant.

Originating from cameraman Craig DiBona, production preferred the lived-in appearance of DiBona's jacket compared to the newer jackets provided by wardrobe, and believed it fit Manero's character better as a working Italian-American youth from the Bay Ridge who looked to escape to a better life. This black leather jacket from Saxony (Size 38) is lined with black satin, has a front zip closure, zippered sleeves, two front scalloped pockets, and an elastic hem. Made of genuine leather, this jacket's distinctive black hue has faded from age and exposure to a deep brown, though the original black is still visible under the arms and collar where it has not been exposed to light. Sympathetic restoration to its deeper black may still be possible. The leather also exhibits mild scuffing along the sleeves.

Billy Loomis' (Skeet Ulrich) and Stu Macher's (Matthew Lillard) Screen-Matched Ghostface Costume

### Scream (1996)

Billy Loomis' (Skeet Ulrich) and Stu Macher's (Matthew Lillard) screen-matched Ghostface costume from Wes Craven's Scream. Billy and Stu donned their shared Ghostface costume as they hunted Loomis' girlfriend Sydney Prescott (Neve Campbell) and her friends on the anniversary of her mother's murder. Unique dimpling under one eye of the mask - the result of a factory fluke - screenmatches to the first time in the series that Sidney is attacked by Ghostface, leading to fans dubbing this mask the "Sidney Attack" mask.

Scream won various awards, including three Saturn Awards in 1997, and has since been praised for its originality, meta commentary, humor, and ensemble cast, which were instrumental to the film's success. This costume became the final design-choice for all later Scream costumes and remains one of the most recognized characters in horror films with an enduring legacy.

This iconic costume consists of one soft glow-inthe-dark PVC mask and a custom-made sparkly lurex robe with hood and built-in gloves. The mask was originally created by Fun World DIV for its Fantastic Faces/Fearsome Faces line. This mask has black mesh covered eyes, a blackened mouth and nose, and features the "Fun World Div" debossed on the backside of the long chin. Additionally the mouth features matte black tape, a temporary modification which was utilized by Peter Deming, a director of photography, for scenes in which the mouth needed to appear dull, whereas when the mouth needed to appear shiny they applied a layer of chapstick. The presence of the tape indicates the mask was last used in a scene where it needed a dull mouth. Attached to the mask is a black cotton shroud with a self-adhesive strip sewn into the top to secure the robe's hood, which has the second strip sewn onto the interior. The pull-over robe has a one-piece front and is made of a unique woven fabric which contains silver-colored threads to give the appearance of sparkles. The sparkles ultimately helped to visually distinguish the costume from dark backgrounds and was unique to the early Scream films. Furthermore, this robe features a smaller hood that contains a rigid plastic board sewn in to keep the shape of the crown, two tie strings at the neck, and a pair of gloves attached to the sleeves with a pinched back to give them a slimmer fit. The sleeves feature a more square shape with zig-zagged edges. This costume exhibits a buildup of grime and discoloration on the mask, while the robe exhibits frayed threads from unfinished edges.

### 281 Sidney Prescott's (Neve Campbell) Omega Kappa Beta Necklace Scream 2 (1997)/Scream 3 (2000)

Sidney Prescott's (Neve Campbell) Omega Kappa Beta necklace from Wes Craven's Scream 2 and Scream 3. Sidney wore the necklace her boyfriend Derek Feldman (Jerry O'Connell) gave her and which she used in a climactic scene in Scream 2 to escape from Mickey Altieri (Timothy Olyphant) throughout Scream 3 to honor Feldman's memory.

This necklace originated from Miramax, which produced both films. It consists of a metal figaro chain looped with a vertically-oriented Omega Kappa Beta, or "OKB," pendant. The metal exhibits some tarnishing from age and wear.

This sculpted resin knocker is hand-painted gray and bronze-color to resemble a small metal figure with two heavyweight enlarged testicles dangling from a metal wire beneath the genital organ and a screw for mounting to a door embedded in the back. Multiple examples of Mills' black jacket were prepared for filming, with particular consideration put towards numerous scenes set in the rain. Due to limited prep time and budget constraints, all of Mills' jackets were made similar, though not identical, in construction, with the director approving them as "close enough" for the rain sequences.

This black leather Mills jacket was intended for rain sequences, and as such exhibits some differences to other jackets seen prominently in the film, specifically with regard to its front pockets and overall length. However, the jacket originated from a high-level crew member and is an original that was acquired and intentionally distressed for filming by the production.





Jack Torrance's (Jack Nicholson) lightweight ax from Stanley Kubrick's The Shining with a restored head surface. Jack used his ax throughout the film's terrifying climax as he hunted his wife Wendy (Shelley Duvall), despatched Hallorann (Scatman Crothers) and pursued his son Danny (Danny Lloyd) through the Overlook Hotel's maze before freezing to death while still clutching the ax. Lightweight axes were created to allow Torrance to carry them for extended periods.

This ax is cast from soft foam painted in various shades of brown to resemble wood and rust-covered metal. Its head is covered in hammered, chromed mylar tape along the top, edges, and the sides with brushed aluminum sheets installed to look realistic. The original aluminum sheets were lost and the head has been sympathetically restored to match the original look, while the head itself, the handle (including its paint finish), and the tape are all original to the production. Inconsistencies in the stitching on the collar of this jacket screen-match to when Hallorann drove back to The Overlook Hotel to check on the Torrance family before he was brutally attacked by Jack (Jack Nicholson).

The Shining is often cited as one of the best horror films of all time, and Crothers won a Saturn Award for Best Supporting Actor for his portrayal of Dick Hallorann. The film was selected for preservation by the National Film Registry in 2018.

In 1980, Kubrick gifted this beige polyester Tenson jacket (Size C 56) – one of three known to have been created for the production – to Anthony Frewin, his personal assistant and later the representative of his estate. Frewin in turn gifted the jacket to his son Nick, from whose collection it originated.

The jacket features an off-white acrylic fleece lining, a brown faux-fur lined hood, a black zip closure on the front, and a five-button closure with additional button closures over the pockets. One wandering miniature, Johnny 5, caught the attention of Sandy Banatoni (Cynthia Gibb), prompting her to order 1,000 of the toys. The film was nominated for Saturn Awards for Best Science Fiction Film and Best Special Effects. This small Johnny 5 is made of cast resin with an array of twisted metal wires resembling cabling. It has a gray painted finish, with various blue panels and bronze-color embellishments. It features two rubber continuous tracks and was designed to be poseable, but has grown fragile with age. ## **DOUGLAS TRUMBULL** COLLECTION

Visual effects pioneer Douglas Trumbull was born in Los Angeles in 1942. After abandoning architecture for technical drawing and cartooning, his talent for photorealism soon earned him work at Graphic Films, an esteemed Hollywood studio for which he designed groundbreaking cosmic effects for the 1964 New York World's Fair. After seeing Trumbull's work, director Stanley Kubrick hired him to create animations and VFX shots - including the iconic Star Gate sequence for what would become his seminal masterpiece 2001: A Space Odyssev. From that film's success, Trumbull became one of the industry's most trusted photographic effects experts, designing and producing legendary screen moments in such sci-fi landmarks as Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Star Trek: The Motion Picture, and Blade Runner, all three of which earned him Academy Award® nominations. In addition to directing the cult classics Silent Running and Brainstorm, Trumbull later received a Scientific and Engineering Award for his high-speed photography process Showscan in 1993, one of two specialty awards given to him by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences before his death in 2022. 60 years since he first made his mark on global cinema, Propstore today celebrates Douglas Trumbull by presenting a selection of rare memorabilia from his personal collection to the public.



Khan Noonien Singh's stunt barge fight costume from J.J. Abrams' Star Trek Into Darkness. After he crashed into San Francisco, Khan stole a coat to blend in and continued to wear it during his final fight with Spock on top of the barge.

Spock's (Leonard Nimoy) screen-matched Season 3 tricorder from Gene Roddenberry's Star Trek: The Original Series. The tricorders, originally designed by Wah Chang, were altered for the series' third and final season with slight differences, including new black leatherette paneling. Distinctive markings in the metal and grain in the leatherette match to close-up shots of Spock's tricorder in the Season 3 episode "Day of the Dove." Screen-matched props from Star Trek: The Original Series are exceedingly rare.

Gene Roddenberry's groundbreaking original Star Trek series was hugely influential on the science fiction genre and spawned a massive multimedia franchise covering various television series, theatrical films, comics, video games, and more over the course of over 58 years and is still going strong today.


This tricorder is made primarily of metal with black leather paneling; a gold-color mesh sensor embellishment; three simulated lights in red, yellow, and blue with corresponding buttons beneath them; a small gray viewscreen; and a black leather strap for carrying. The top front panel opens to reveal a ribbed aluminum cylinder and a circular gold-color spiral embellishment meant to simulate a speaker; while the bottom panel opens up to a small storage space.

The interior details seen in the middle folding door, including the cylinder and moire-patterned disc, may not be original to the prop; it is possible that these components, which were never seen on screen when this Season 3-style tricorder was in use, were added after production by one of the tricorder's previous owners. Additionally, the other surviving Season 3-style tricorder - which was not seen on screen - does not feature these interior components. That said, this in no way compromises the authenticity of this tricoder, which has been reviewed by leading Star Trek prop researchers in addition to being definitively screen-matched.





From the collection of the Leonard Nimoy Fan club president Audrey Anderson, this second revision final draft script consists of 70 pages printed on various colored paper and is dated June 14, 1967. The cover of the script is marked "Nimoy" in graphite, followed by various pages throughout the script marked the same in ink. This script is annotated by Nimoy with dialogue changes that later appeared in the final cut, and also features the occasional doodling within the margins and back pages. Leonard "Bones" McCoy's (DeForest Kelley) Starfleet medical tunic with a pair of officer pants from Gene Roddenberry's Star Trek. Bones, the chief medical officer of the USS Enterprise and loyal friend to its Captain, James T. Kirk (William Shatner), wore his signature blue tunic while conducting medical procedures throughout the series, including in the Season 1 episodes "The Naked Time" and "Space Seed."

Designed by William Ware Theiss, McCoy's costumes distinguished him as an officer of high integrity and disposability, in contrast, for example, to the "Redshirts" who also appeared in the series. The look is today inseparable from McCoy's role in television history, which earned the actor who portrayed him a Star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 1991.

This lot originated from the collection of legendary franchise modelmaker Greg Jein. It consists of a blue polyfiber quarter-sleeve tunic with a ringed collar and a gold-color lame and black thread Starfleet Science insignia patch emblazoned on the chest. Also included is a pair of black polyester pants with both zipper and hook-and-eye closures, "P27" and "34" handwritten on the interior, and a wardrobe tag on the interior hand-marked "34W" and "I23" for an unidentified Starfleet officer by production. 

Spock's (Leonard Nimoy) on-camera ears and unused ears from the television series Star Trek: The Next Generation. In the Season 5 episodes "Unification I" and "Unification II," Captain Jean-Luc Picard (Patrick Stewart) and Lieutenant Commander Data (Brent Spiner) aided Vulcan Ambassador Spock on his mission to reunite the Romulans and Vulcans.

This lot comes from the collection of makeup artist Gerry Quist who applied the ears to Nimoy for production and, recognizing their significance, deliberately saved and preserved these ears, used on-camera by Nimoy, as well as a pair of unused ears. These two pairs of foam latex ear tip appliances each feature a sculpted helix ridge and a pronounced antihelix. One pair is painted in light brown skin tones for blending to the wearer, while the other pair remains unfinished as a backup set. Both pairs exhibit some ripping around the base, more so the painted ears, which also exhibit some paint loss.





A full-size "In A Mirror, Darkly" Original Series-style Defiant bridge set from the television series Star Trek: Enterprise. In the Season 4 two-parter, "In a Mirror, Darkly," the mirror universe Jonathan Archer (Scott Bakula) and his crew discovered the Constitution-class USS Defiant, which had been transported both from the prime universe and from a century ahead of them.

These episodes, while serving as a prequel to the classic Star Trek episode "Mirror, Mirror," actually serve as a sequel to the 1968 episode "The Tholian Web" as well. In "The Tholian Web," Captain James T. Kirk (William Shatner) and crew came upon the USS Defiant, interphasing between universes, before it eventually disappeared into an unknown parallel universe, never to be seen again in the Prime Universe. Nearly 38 years after that episode aired, "In A Mirror, Darkly" revealed that not only was the Defiant sent into the Mirror Universe of "Mirror, Mirror", but also a century into the past, giving the Terran Empire the advanced technology it would need to crush any rebellion and establish the dominant power it held by "Mirror, Mirror."


For the production of the "The Tholian Web" in 1968, the Defiant was made a Constitution-class vessel, just like the Starship Enterprise, allowing the production to simply reuse the Enterprise set for the Defiant. Therefore, for "In a Mirror, Darkly," production designer Herman Zimmerman and his art department had to essentially recreate the iconic bridge of the USS Enterprise as seen throughout the original 1966 Star Trek series, with some minor alterations both to establish it as the Defiant and subtly update some of the effects used to portray the 23rd century technology. It was constructed on Paramount's Stage 9, and was the first time a full three-quarter version of the famous bridge set stood on a Paramount soundstage since the end of the original Star Trek series in 1969.

This oversized lot is constructed primarily of wooden framing with composite wood paneling and consists of a gray wooden doorway with two orange-red



## Darth Maul's (Ray Park) Lightsaber Hilt with Pair of Replica Blades Star Wars: The Phantom Menace (1999)

Darth Maul's (Ray Park) lightsaber hilt from George Lucas' Star Wars: The Phantom Menace with two replica blades. Darth Maul used his iconic double-bladed lightsaber during the climactic fight against Qui-Gon Jinn (Liam Neeson) and Obi-Wan Kenobi (Ewan McGregor) in the Theed Palace on Naboo.


Darth Maul was skilled in the ways of the dark side, creating the saberstaff as his signature weapon. Although the double-bladed lightsaber was first seen on screen in The Phantom Menace, it originated in the comic-book series Star Wars: Tales of the Jedi.

The Phantom Menace, the first new Star Wars film in 16 years and the first to be directed by Lucas since the original 1977 film, was one of the most highly anticipated films of all time and broke box office records upon release. The film was nominated for three Academy Awards®: Best Sound, Best Sound Effects Editing, and Best Visual Effects.

This double-ended hilt, one of the most ornately detailed known to exist, originated from a crew member. It is constructed from resin with machined steel end caps cast around M10 threaded rods on each end and an internal steel core for weight and strength. The threaded rods allowed for installation of aluminum blades that were used for dueling sequences and replaced frequently as they were damaged on set.

The hilt is intricately finished in silver-color with shades of dark gray to give depth to the detailing throughout, including the two ribbed hand grips and parts of the blade-emitter plate. Metallic red activator buttons and control lock buttons span the hilt's length, and there are three incorporated black rubber O-rings as well as four domed points painted red (an extremely rare detail). Also included are two replica blades painted red and designed to mount to the rods. Though the hilt's casting is exceptionally clean, the lot exhibits minor flaking paint, exposing the resin in places, as well as grime in the end caps and minor nicking throughout from production use. Qui-Gon Jinn's (Liam Neeson) lightsaber hilt from George Lucas' Star Wars: The Phantom Menace. Jedi Master Qui-Gon Jinn wielded his lightsaber against enemies such as battle droids and in his fatal final duel against Darth Maul (Ray Park).

The film introduced audiences to the world before A New Hope, with a far younger Obi-Wan Kenobi (Ewan McGregor), then a padawan under Master Jinn. It shattered numerous box office records, and dethroned Jurassic Park's records for both largest single-day gross and fastest to gross \$100 million USD in five days. This prequel film was nominated for numerous Academy Awards®, BAFTA®, and Grammy Awards® for technical and musical achievements.

Many iterations of lightsabers were designed for The Phantom Menace under the direction of design director Doug Chiang, with each Jedi having a uniquely crafted lightsaber designed to reflect their personality. Neeson personally picked this hilt design for his character.

This lightsaber hilt is constructed primarily from resin. It has a steel blade emitter (a feature unique to the film's lightsaber props) and features ribbed detailing running from the emitter down to the base, creating a grip. It is finished in black and silver-color paint, and a red static activator switch adorns one side. Included is a removable plastic clip for hooking onto a belt. 

Anakin Skywalker's (Hayden Christensen) hero lightweight lightsaber hilt from George Lucas' Star Wars: Revenge of the Sith. Anakin wore and wielded his signature lightsaber in countless duels and battles throughout the prequel saga. Following his dramatic turn to the dark side of the Force and the purging of the Jedi Temple on Coruscant in ROTS, he ultimately lost the saber during his duel with Obi-Wan Kenobi (Ewan McGregor) on the fiery planet of Mustafar.

Anakin's legendary saber is among the most significant weapons in the Star Wars narrative. It is the same piece that an aging Obi–Wan Kenobi (Alec Guinness) handed to Luke Skywalker (Mark Hamill) in A New Hope, explaining that Luke's father "feared you might follow old Obi–Wan on some damn fool idealistic crusade." Luke later lost the saber again, along with his hand, when Anakin revealed that he was his opponent's father during their fateful Cloud City duel in The Empire Strikes Back.

In The Force Awakens, the saber miraculously reentered the franchise in the possession of Rey (Daisy Ridley), leading Kylo Ren (Adam Driver) to duel her for it in Grand Leader Snoke's (Andy Serkis) throne room in The Last Jedi. The result was its final – at least, for now – destruction.

This hero version of the saber's distinctive hilt, designed to be worn on the performer's belt, was custom-made for ROTS as a copy of the original Graflex-style saber Luke wielded in the original trilogy. It is slightly smaller than that first saber, an intentional design change allowing the weapon to be handled and fought with more easily. This cast-resin hilt features a metalized mirror chrome finish, black rubber strips on the grip, a Covertec belt clip designed to be situated at the base of the handle, and gold- and copper-color detailing along its body.

This lot exhibits some signs of production use and handling, including a chip cut out of the grip near its belt clip to facilitate easier attachment to Anakin's belt, a hairline fracture through the base, some pitting in the rubber, and various minor nicks and smudges throughout the body, but largely retains its iconic futuristic coloration and look.

Star Wars: Revenge Of The Sith (2005)

Anakin Skywalker's (Hayden Christensen) stunt dueling lightsaber from George Lucas' Star Wars: Revenge of the Sith. Anakin wore and wielded his signature lightsaber in countless duels and battles throughout the prequel saga. Following his dramatic turn to the dark side of the Force and the purging of the Jedi Temple on Coruscant in ROTS, he ultimately lost the saber during his duel with Obi–Wan Kenobi (Ewan McGregor) on the fiery planet of Mustafar.

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Several different styles of the distinctive saber were made in varying degrees of simplicity to aid Christensen during dueling sequences. This less-detailed stunt version was created as a copy of the Graflex-style saber Luke wielded in the original trilogy. This saber's hilt is constructed from resin cast around a threaded metal rod and painted silver and black to appear metallic. Mounted to the rod is a green blade made of carbon fiber – a material unique to the third prequel film – and wrapped with a clear plastic sheath intended to prevent blade chips from causing injuries. The carbon fiber blade allowed the actors to duel on set, and was then digitally altered to add the lightsaber's signature blue glow during post-production.

This stunt weapon exhibits visible signs of production use, including some nicks in the hilt, grime and scratching along the blade, and minor tears to the plastic sheath, most notably at the tip. Dimensions:  $48.5^{\circ} \times 2^{\circ} \times 2$

Mace Windu's (Samuel L. Jackson) hero lightsaber hilt from George Lucas' Star Wars: Revenge of the Sith. Master Windu carried his lightsaber throughout the film, wielding it in combat against Darth Sidious (Ian McDiarmid).

According to Star Wars canon, Windu constructed the lightsaber, with its distinctive amethyst plasma blade, after becoming a senior member of the Jedi Council. The Star Wars Databank notes that the amethyst blade is Windu's way of "warning [his] enemies that the Jedi Order's greatest champion [is] ready for battle." In reality, Jackson asked Lucas for a purple-bladed lightsaber so Windu could stand out. Despite some initial reluctance, Lucas agreed.

## **400**Ponda Baba/Walrusman's Photo-Matched Blaster **Star Wars: A New Hope (1977)**

Ponda Baba, also known as Walrusman's, photo-matched blaster from George Lucas' Star Wars: A New Hope. Surly Aqualish bar patron Ponda Baba drew his blaster on Obi-Wan Kenobi (Alec Guinness) after the Jedi Master attempted to stop him and Dr. Cornelius Evazan (Alfie Curtis) from harassing Luke Skywalker (Mark Hamill) in the Mos Eisley cantina. In the ensuing confrontation, begun with Evazan's infamous line "He doesn't like you. I don't like you either," Kenobi severed Baba's hoofed arm while it still held his blaster.

The serial number on this blaster, 68796, photo-matches to a vintage behind-the-scenes image taken by renowned armorer Bapty documenting the weapons it provided to the production. As with many of the film's now-iconic extraterrestrial weaponry, Bapty specifically fabricated this distinctive otherworldly blaster for the film, a process they later repeated for The Empire Strikes Back. Following production, a large number of production weapons were returned to Bapty, in whose armory they were later to be rediscovered with many of their parts stripped.

In a now-infamous continuity error in the theatrical release, an insert shot of Baba's severed arm showed his hand changed from an Aqualish hoof to a hairier, werewolf-like appendage and the blaster changed to Dr. Evazan's blaster. However, the original blaster appeared in rough cut footage from the cantina sequence later included on the Blu-ray release as well as multiple behind-the-scenes images from the production. Boelo, one of Jabba the Hutt's human henchmen, also carried the same style of blaster in the Special Edition release.

This blaster was originally constructed from several different real-world components, including the metal body and barrel of a self-loading .22-caliber ArmaLite AR-7 Explorer rifle with serial number "68796" engraved near the trigger and a winged steel muzzle. The body, barrel, muzzle, scope end cap, and scope ring all originated from Bapty. The blaster features custom-drilled holes from where a scope was added during production. A metal and glass scope and aluminum scope rail replicas are screwed into those existing holes. Its twisted red grip is also a replica added to complete the weapon's distinctive look.







1980s-Era Light-Up Darth Vader European Promotional Costume

**Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back (1980)** 

A light-up Darth Vader costume used for touring and promotional events in the UK circa 1980s with its original vintage electronics and showing evidence of extensive use. In addition to the 1980s promotional events, this specific costume was on display at Planet Hollywood in Las Vegas circa the late 1990s.

Lucasfilm commissioned a small number of high-quality Darth Vader costumes to be manufactured for use in marketing events circa the releases of The Empire Strikes Back and Return of the Jedi. The first in-person appearance tour featuring Darth Vader also included Boba Fett as part of the marketing campaign for The Empire Strikes Back. Following Return of the Jedi's release, a more extensive tour produced by toy-manufacturer Palitoy ran from 1983 to 1985 throughout the UK and other parts of Europe to boost sales of Star Wars toys. Newspapers informed the public of the opportunity to "Meet Darth Vader," a chance for which many children rushed; the tour was thorough and featured Vader appearances at cities and towns throughout the United Kingdom and other European countries. After the Palitoy promotional tour concluded in 1985, other UK-based promotional events such as home video release celebrations and other occasions continued to feature Darth Vader throughout the 1980s.

The costumes used for these appearances were of comparable quality to the film-used versions. They were produced in the UK by N.J. Farmer, who previously worked for Palitoy and had a longstanding relationship with Lucasfilm. Lucasfilm provided Farmer with original castings and patterns on which to base their promotional costumes. While components such as the fiberglass helmet in this costume are nearly identical to the film-used examples, the costume features unique and distinctive greeblies on the chest box, a visible on/off switch mounted on the side of the chest box to control its lights, and a visible cord which supplies power to the chest box via the belt. These elements appear extensively in photographs of Darth Vader appearances in the UK and Europe in the 1980s.

Except for a pair of boots, this costume comes complete with all other original hard and soft components included. The helmet was molded from a genuine film helmet and painted black and gray with machined aluminum "tusks," dual-layer metal grills in the vents, a single acrylic lens piece which is screwed in place, foam padding for wearer comfort, and elastane straps. The faceplate and dome, which is labeled "669" on the interior, are secured together via a two-piece ring mounting system. The fiberglass upper body armor is painted black and gray with hinged shoulder bells. The facemask is believed to have been repainted sometime after its 1980s usage, and the helmet dome was repainted recently to restore its finish. The shoulder and chest armor may have also been repainted. Replica boots have been added to complete the costume for display.

The illuminating chest box and belt are key elements to the costume and retain their original finish and vintage electronics, which are still in operable condition. These components exhibit wear and tear from appearance use, including damage to the leather at the back of the belt. The chest box features functional flashing red lights in the coin-slot greeblies, and the belt boxes featuring illuminating green buttons; the electronics are original, but the battery pack has been updated to a modern rechargeable battery. The belt also includes a metal buckle, vintage plastic battery-holder pack, and metal lightsaber clip. The final "hard component" of the costume is the vacuum-formed shin greaves featuring fastening strip fasteners.

The black cotton cape features a leather-trimmed collar with a metal chain across it and a matching interior robe layer with evidence of N.J. Farmer manufacturers labels that were removed at some point. The quilted black leather vest features a zippered and buckled back, the cotton shirt features quilted black leather sleeves and a tie-up back, and the quilted black leather pants feature boot stirrups and a fastening strip fly with a significant tear on their back which has since been repaired. The codpiece is made of black leather with a felt backing.

This Farmer-manufactured promotional costume's components exhibit wear commensurate with its extensive use and age. It remains one of the nicest examples to come to market, showing evidence of heavy usage at promotional events and retaining original period electronics.

Light-Up R3-Series Astromech Droid Head A

## **Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back (1980)**

A light-up R3-series astromech droid head from Irvin Kershner's Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back. R3-series droids were distinguished by their unique heads, which featured translucent domes with visible internal mechanics. This head was built specifically for The Empire Strikes Back and was one of two, or possibly three, R3-series droids created for the film, each having subtle variations in color scheme and detail. The droids appeared in sequence within the Rebel Alliance's Hoth base; at least one of the R3 droids built for Empire was also updated and used in Return of the Jedi, in Admiral Ackbar's (Tim Rose) briefing room.

The mechanical interior of this droid head was assembled from real-world industrial scrap components, model kit parts, and other found objects - a technique used for prop building throughout the original Star Wars trilogy. It is cosmetic only and has no functionality. The dome was vacuum-formed from clear plastic with debossed panels. A small incandescent light was installed in the interior of the head, and the exterior dome was dressed with greeblies and several of the debossed panels were painted orange.

The translucent dome of this droid head was damaged after production and a few sections of the original hemisphere were lost. The original dome has been restored by installing it over a newly-made clear dome that supports the remaining original structure; this inner-support dome is smooth and does not have the debossed panels of the original, allowing observers to identify which elements are original.

The original dome exhibits residue and tarnishing from previously applied adhesives and pinline graphics; these now-removed pinlines may have been installed for the production of Return of the Jedi or may have been applied at some point after. Replica greeblies have been installed on the dome's exterior for display, and the panels have been repainted to the original orange color, having been previously stripped. All of the interior components of the head remain original and unrestored. The droid features its original wooden base, through which wires exit underneath to connect to an external power source for the incandescent light illumination. Chrome tape has also been restored on the edge of the base.



Imperial Scout Trooper "Biker Scout" Helmet Star Wars: Return Of The Jedi (1983)

A biker scout helmet from Richard Marquand's Star Wars: Return of the Jedi. Biker scouts, or scout troopers as they were otherwise known, first appeared in Return of the Jedi and were stationed on the forest moon of Endor. Luke (Mark Hamill), Han (Harrison Ford), Leia (Carrie Fisher) and their Ewok allies fought against the troopers, who used speeder bikes as their primary mode of transportation.

One of the most beloved helmet designs in the franchise, the biker scout helmets were largely designed by Nilo Rodis-Jamero and are significantly different to the standard Imperial stormtrooper helmets. During the initial design phase, the Stormtrooper armor was found to be too stiff and inflexible for a predominately forest setting. The scout troopers needed ease of movement in their environment. Rodis-Jamero pitched the mostly-cloth outfit to George Lucas, while Pete Ronzani's team created the armored helmet, torso, arm, and knee guards which lended to the unique "biker" appearance of the costume. The visor around the eyes was inspired by blinders worn by horses, with the idea being that if they were speeding through the forest at great speeds they would need to be entirely focussed and not distracted by things in their periphery.

This is one of two known scout trooper helmets that exist in private collections out of the 24-30 that were made and used for filming. As such, this is an incredibly rare opportunity to own an iconic piece of Star Wars history.

This helmet is constructed primarily of vacuum-formed ABS plastic. The visor lens is made of gray acrylic and is attached to the inside of the helmet. The face mask is hinged and can flip up, which was a practical design implemented by Rodis-Jamero based on a conversation with Lucas to allow the actors to keep the helmets on between takes. It also gave the helmet a more streamlined appearance circumventing the "bobblehead" effect the Imperial Stormtrooper helmets had. The interior of this helmet is hand-marked "#41 Biker BH1030" on the dome interior, which stands for "Blue Harvest." The exterior side of the helmet has a sideways "PR" logo on the side, which was Ronzani's company logo at the time. The helmets were intentionally distressed by production to appear well-worn in the environment of Endor. The helmet is fully painted, and thus not susceptible to yellowing like standard stormtrooper helmets are.

An Imperial Stormtrooper E-11 blaster rifle from Richard Marquand's Star Wars: Return of the Jedi. Stormtroopers carried their standard-issue E-11 imperial blaster rifles throughout the film, including during the Death Star docking bay sequence and the battle of Endor.

While the first two Star Wars films used stormtrooper blasters made from blank-firing Sterling rifles, slightly redesigned E-11 blasters were specifically fabricated for Return of the Jedi out of non-firing Sterling L2A2 replicas made by Model Gun Corporation (MGC) of Japan. No blank-firing stormtrooper blasters were used for Return of the Jedi.

Finished in black paint, this heavyweight blaster features a metal Sterling body with movable trigger affixed with original custom aluminum, steel, and plastic dressing components, which includes the signature U-shaped cooling fins, a scope, a scope rail, and side body greeblies. The magazine was cut down and riveted in place, and the MGC logo is emblazoned on the grip.

This is one of only a few original Stormtrooper blasters from Return of the Jedi in private collections today and to have all its original dressing components with no restoration completed. A prototype of Kylo Ren's (Adam Driver) helmet from the production of J.J. Abrams' Star Wars: Episode VII - The Force Awakens. The "Jedi Killer," Kylo Ren, wore a uniquely distinctive helmet throughout the film as he fought his enemies. Prototypes were produced as part of the creative design process for speculating on various concepts for the character's final appearance.

This fiberglass prototype helmet is painted black with curved patterned lines around the eyes and forehead filled in with a bronze-color. The eye sockets are filled with transparent acrylic panels, and there is a foam inner lining to enhance comfort for the wearer. This information is stated on page 24 of the Star Wars The Force Awakens The Visual Dictionary.

First Order Stormtrooper Helmet Star Wars: The Force Awakens (2015)

A First Order Stormtrooper helmet from J. J. Abrams' Star Wars: The Force Awakens. Stormtroopers, the soldiers of the First Order, wore white helmets reminiscent of those of their Galactic Empire predecessors.

The highly anticipated seventh film in the Skywalker Saga and the first in the Sequel Trilogy, The Force Awakens still remains the most expensive film ever made at \$447 million, but grossed over \$2.07 billion worldwide, breaking box office records and earning five Academy Award® nominations.

This helmet is made primarily of cast polyurethane, a denser material selected to replace the fragile vacuum-formed ABS plastic used to make the original stormtrooper helmets. To create them, production utilized top-of-the-line manufacturing, including 3D designing and printing as well as injection molding.

The helmet features vents running down both sides, a fitted metallic aerator on the left side, clips along the top, a black acrylic lens fitted in the eye recesses, black stripes along the brow and lower rear area of the helmet, and a black mesh grill in the mouth. Inside the helmet is an adjustable plastic headband with foam padding, nylon straps, and a four-point ratchet-adjustable suspension. The helmet exhibits some scuffing from use.

A light-up remote-controlled R2-S8 droid from Ron Howard's Solo: A Star Wars Story. The astromech droid R2-S8 was seen displaying a hologram for a pair of Imperial stormtroopers at the Coronet Spaceport on Corellia, just after Han (Alden Ehrenreich) was separated from Qi'ra (Emilia Clarke). The droid was later recreated as an action figure as part of the Star Wars: Droid Factory toy set.

Constructed by Stuart Bone, this droid was originally built for use on Rogue One: A Star Wars Story, although its scene was cut from the final film. It has a plywood frame and legs, with a fiberglass dome and a hand-cut aluminum outer skin. 

A Horus guard helmet and collar from Roland Emmerich's Stargate. Horus guards wore their distinctive armor as they protected the Goa'uld Lord Ra (Jaye Davidson) from the human slaves around the great pyramid on the planet Abydos. The helmets were later repurposed for Stargate SG-1.

Detailed to represent a fusion of futuristic, otherworldly, and ancient Egyptian designs, this large, ornate helmet is constructed from foam rubber with resin "feathers" on either side and a foam rubber collar affixed over a fiberglass shell. Both the collar and helmet are lined with black cloth. The helmet features an elaborate falcon head with a tall crown, wide chin plate, and a menacing hooked beak mounted to the helmet by a metal rod.

Vinyl tassels, added for use on Stargate SG-1, are finished in metallic silver- and bronze-color paint and hang from each side of the neck. The crystals that made up the Fortress of Solitude, such as this one, were memory crystals that contained the accumulated knowledge of Krypton, Superman's destroyed homeworld. These crystals were Superman's only real connection to his ancestors and the history of his people.

As with its predecessor, this sequel took inspiration from both the original Kevin Eastman and Peter Laird comic books as well as the extremely popular 1987 television cartoon. The groundbreaking creature effects for both of the first two Ninja Turtles films were created by Jim Henson's creature shop, with this film being dedicated to the late Henson. Originally obtained from someone who worked on the film, this mask is made of a black Spandex-blend material with painted mesh guards over the eyes, metal rivet breathing holes over the mouth, and a red bandana embroidered with the kanji Oni. 
Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles III, the final film of the highly successful original trilogy, debuted at No. 1 at the U.S. box office and grossed \$54.4 million globally. The films were lauded for the groundbreaking animatronic creature effects used to bring the titular heroes to life. For the third film, Eric Allard's AllFX took over the creation of the animatronics, continuing the legacy started by Jim Henson's Creature Shop in the first two films.



Moses' (Charlton Heston) Ten Commandments tablets from Cecil B. DeMille's The Ten Commandments. In one of the most famous sequences in cinema history, Moses descended from Mount Sinai with the tablets that bore the Ten Commandments, but upon seeing the debauchery, smashed them on the idol of the Golden Calf.

The creation of the tablets required intensive research to meet DeMille's significant creative demands. The director tasked Paramount Studios scenic artist A.J. Ciraolo with creating a finish that both specifically resembled Mount Sinai's distinctive red granite and historically-accurate Midrashic commandment etchings for the mountaintop and Golden Calf scenes.

Originating from one of four sets created by the property master William Sapp and gifted to cast member Eric Alden, these two lightweight fiberglass tablets were hand-painted with slightly different red and black-speckled patinas, engraved with ancient Hebraic text, and intentionally molded with slight irregularities to further resemble chiseled stone. The backing of the tablets feature "Russ Gray" carved into the material. These tablets exhibit drill holes along the side edges on the reverse from previous mounting. 



Wolfman wore his helmet while attending Top Gun and participating in several combat missions as Rick "Hollywood" Neven's (Whip Hubley) Radar Intercept Officer. This helmet screenmatches based on the unique marks present on the back and sides, which are all original and unrestored.

The helmet is constructed of fiberglass painted red and affixed with yellow, blue, white, and silver-color star insignia stickers, two with cartoon butts on them, and decal letters on the back read "WOLFMAN." ### **Top Gun (1986)**

Pete "Maverick" Mitchell's (Tom Cruise) flight suit patch from the production of Tony Scott's Top Gun. Navy pilot Mitchell wore his ID patch on his signature flight suit while training at the Naval Air Station Miramar's elite "Top Gun" fighter program along with his partner and radio intercept officer Nick "Goose" Bradshaw (Anthony Edwards).

While both blue-and-red patches and green-and gold-color patches were created by production for the Navy pilots' flight suits, only Mitchell's blue-and-red patch appeared in the final cut. This green-and gold-color cotton patch is embroidered "Pete Mitchell 'Maverick'" beneath the Fighter Weapons School emblem on front and affixed with a fastening strip on the reverse for attaching to Maverick's flight suit. It exhibits minor fraying at its corners.

## 456 Phyllis Nefler's (Shelley Long) Wilderness Girl Uniform Costume Troop Beverly Hills (1989)

Phyllis Nefler's (Shelley Long) Wilderness Girl uniform from Jeff Kanew's Troop Beverly Hills. Nefler had her Wilderness Girl troop leader uniform tailored and wore it to her first meeting to the dismay of scout leader Velda Plendor (Betty Thomas). Nefler wore a variety of tailored uniforms throughout the film, such as a capelet and jacket, as well as a skirt and a pair of khaki pants.

Having gained new fans from repeated airings on the Disney Channel in the 1990s, this film is evocative of the 1980s and features a subtle feminist message that has endeared itself to audiences leading it to become a cult classic film.

Originating from Butterfield & Butterfield's Western Costume Star Collection Part II auction on July 17th 1994, this costume, which was custom-made for the film, consists of a khaki wool garrison cap hemmed in emerald green with a faux diamond and emerald brooch; a khaki wool jacket hemmed in emerald green and lined with satin; a khaki satin button-up shirt; an emerald green satin necktie; and a khaki wool skirt. The interior of the shirt and skirt feature Western Costume Co. makers labels and hand-marked with "101971" and "1020005." The bottom hem of the shirt was removed by production to allow for a more tailored fit. This costume exhibits snagged, frayed threads and pin holes.

## 457 Damien Cockburn's (Steve Coogan) Severed Head Tropic Thunder (2008)

Damien Cockburn's (Steve Coogan) severed head from Ben Stiller's Tropic Thunder. Cockburn was dismembered and his head severed while walking through an active minefield in the Vietnamese jungle where he brought actors Tugg Speedman (Ben Stiller), Jeff Portnoy (Jack Black), Kirk Lazarus (Robert Downey, Jr.), Kevin Sandusky (Jay Baruchel), and Alpa Chino (Brandon T. Jackson) to help prepare them to shoot his action epic "Tropic Thunder."

Among the most expensive productions ever shot in Hawaii, Tropic Thunder received an Academy Award® for Best Supporting Actor for Downey as well as numerous critics' awards for Best Comedy. It is today considered a touchstone of mid-2000s American comedy, with Entertainment Weekly naming it one of the "25 Great Comedies From the Past 25 Years" in 2009.

This is the one and only severed Cockburn head created for the film. Based on a lifecast of Coogan, it is made of a red painted fiberglass casting coated in a silicone skin covered in red synthetic hair, solidified fabric strands to resemble internal membranes, and an open mouth exposing a set of resin teeth and tongue. ## 458 Achilles' (Brad Pitt) Metal Rehearsal Helmet Troy (2004)

Achilles' (Brad Pitt) metal rehearsal helmet from the production of Wolfgang Petersen's Troy. The fabled Greek warrior wore his signature helmet while battling with his fellow Myrmidons on the beaches of Troy.

Legendary Oscar®-nominated costume designer Bob Ringwood created Achilles' look, and this helmet was specially made to fit Pitt's head. It was also unique to Achilles, clearly marking him out on the battlefield, so much so that Hector (Eric Bana) thought he had slain Achilles, only to find it was Patroclus (Garrett Hedlund) wearing Achilles' armor and helm.


Custom-sized for Pitt, this worked metal helmet features a distinctive crest across the crown with screws on the interior for securing the black synthetic horse hair plume, which has come loose since production. It is intentionally aged, blackened, and textured to appear well-used and nicked by swords and arrows. The interior is hand-marked "Rehearsals Only" in pink on leather padding screwed into the interior for the wearer's comfort. The helmet exhibits some flaking paint, loosened lining, and gold-color ink scribbles on the side from production and age.

Based on the popular video game franchise of the same name, Warcraft held the title of the highest-grossing film based on a video game until 2023. The character King Llane was introduced in the very first game in the series, Warcraft: Orcs & Humans, released in 1994.

## **467**Delos Theme Park Hovercraft Model Miniature **Westworld (1973)**

A Delos Theme Park hovercraft model miniature from Michael Crichton's Westworld. Guests were transported to Delos' isolated theme parks in hovercrafts, such as Peter Martin (Richard Benjamin) and John Blane (James Brolin), who traveled in one to Westworld.

The groundbreaking sci-fi film was the first feature to use digital image processing, which it used for the vision of the android gunslinger, and was nominated for the Hugo and Nebula awards for Best Dramatic Presentation, among others. Westworld grew into a franchise that spawned a sequel film, a sequel television series, and a reimagined HBO series that ran for four seasons.


This miniature was built by model maker Isao Hirai, who famously created detailed models of satellites, rockets, and space telescopes for NASA and the aerospace industry, and other government and private entities. Following the production of Westworld, Hirai hung the model from the ceiling of his workspace at his company Scale Model Co. in Hawthorne, California, where it remained on display ever since.

This model miniature is constructed primarily of balsa wood and painted metallic gray with a small reflective surface on the front representing a cockpit window, eight windows above each wing, four thrusters on the back, and "C-359" printed on the ends of both wings. Remnants of wiring in the front vents of the model miniature seem to indicate that it may have featured some electronic function, perhaps the tiny position lights in the wing tips. Hooks are attached to the top of the model for hanging display, and holes on the bottom are present from when it was previously mounted to a base. 

The jacket features a resin X-Men symbol on the collar, and one at the waist. The fifth X-Men film and the first of the four prequel series films, First Class was very well received amongst fans and critics alike. One of the original X-Men, debuting in X-Men #1 in September of 1963, Beast only appeared in the third and final film of the original X-Men trilogy (then portrayed by Kelsey Grammer) before being given a much larger role with Hoult in the prequels.

Designed by Academy Award®-winning special effects group Amalgamated Dynamics, Inc. (ADI), this costume consists of a static foam mask with sculpted teeth and cowl; a foam and Lycra bodysuit with a zip closure on the back and foam limb appliances tipped with resin claws; and a blue and yellow polyester short jumpsuit with black webbed nylon straps and metal hardware. The interior of the jumpsuit is marked with a label along the zipper "Beast Stunt." The cowl and limb components are hand-punched with dyed blue fox fur. The interior of the body suit features an interior label for "#6 Double." The costume comes mounted to a custom mannequin display and features acrylic eyes. It comes with a round black wooden base and is attached by metal poles in the feet. This costume exhibits cracking in the foam along the limbs, and loose and snagged fur strands.
